

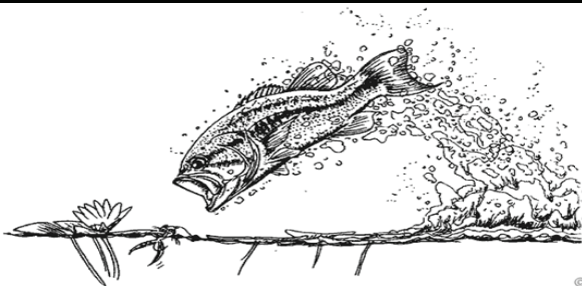

The following letter was sent to the CRD Parks Committee, 625 Fisgard Street, P.O. Box 1000, Victoria, V8W 2S6 and is dated November 21, 2008:

The Committee's attention is requested concerning the illegal placement of buoys by the Victoria Rowing Society on Elk and Beaver Lakes. I previously raised this issue in a letter dated May 01, 2006 to the Manager Park Services. At that time I noted a large white boat fender anchored permanently in the NW corner of Elk Lake out from the Brookleigh boat launch. In the June 15, 2006 reply from the chairman of the CRD Parks Committee, it was stated " Two buoy markers in this area identify safety hazards: submerged stumps that cannot be removed from the lake bottom." I believe that the Parks Committee chairman and CRD Parks personnel knew full well that the buoy I was referring to was placed there by the VRS and chose to ignore my complaint. This in spite of the fact that these buoys are illegal under the Canada Shipping Act 2001 which forbids the non-authorized placement of permanent buoys.

Since that time, there has been a proliferation of permanent illegal buoys placed within the Elk/Beaver Lakes system. So much so, that they are becoming a navigation hazard themselves. Fishermen, waterskiers, windsurfers and other water-based recreationists now have to dodge these hazards.

The only authorized buoys on Elk Lake are the Transport Canada large, cone-shaped buoys which delineate the over 10 HP area. To my knowledge there are no other authorized permanent fixtures which can be anchored within Elk or Beaver Lakes. There is no reference to other buoys, etc. within CRD Parks, VRS or Transport Canada literature and signage at the lakes does not mention these illegal 'buoys' either.

I believe that these buoys are being placed with the full knowledge of the Victoria Rowing Society, CRD Parks Committee, CRD Parks Department, Transport Canada and Saanich Police. I also believe that these bodies are choosing to ignore the fact that the permanent placement of these buoys is illegal and are doing nothing about it.

I request that all of these illegal buoys be removed from Elk and Beaver Lakes forthwith. Not only are they a navigation hazard but they also destroy the aesthetics of the recreational experience. I also believe they are grounds to cancel the Licence Agreement between the Capital Regional District and the Victoria Rowing Society.

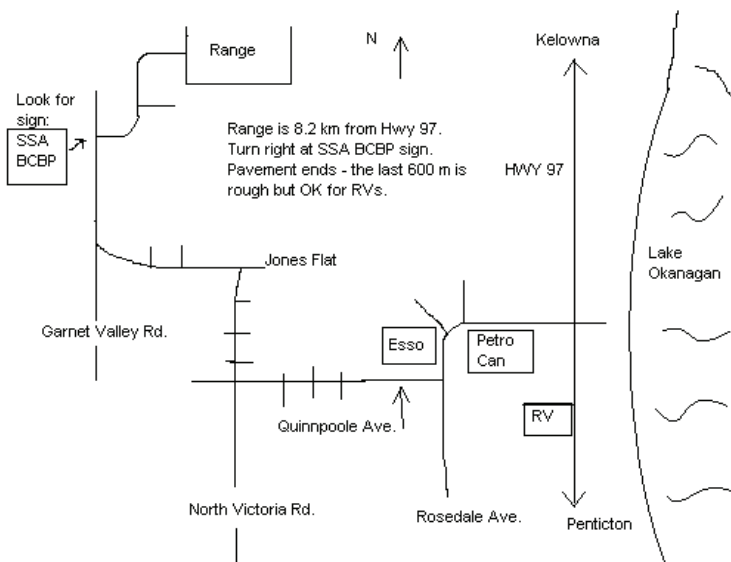

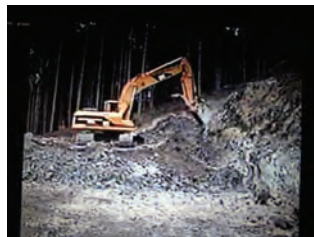


ED COURT DRIVES THE FIRST STAKE FOR THE NEW ROAD

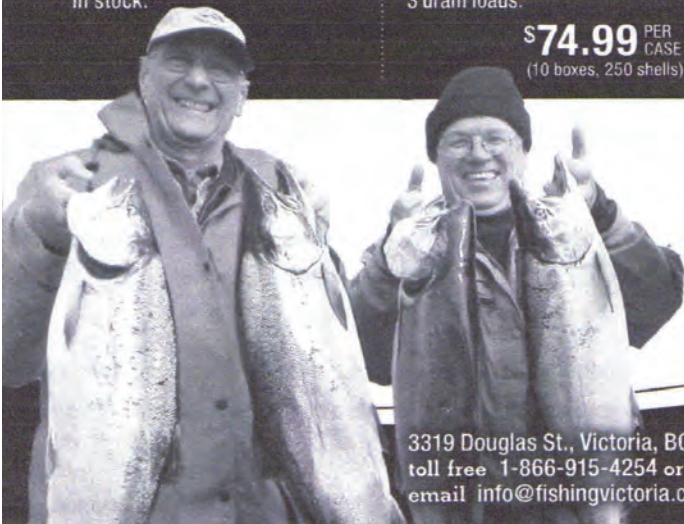
