ATTENTION U.S. COMPETITORS

Download non-resident declaration form 909 from www.rcmp-grc.gc.ca/cfp. Then, call the Canadian Firearms Centre at 1-800-731-4000 to acquire your authorization to transport permits. You will need to fax them a letter confirming your match registration. Handguns must be transported fitted with trigger locks in a locked hard case. Long guns must not be visible in your car and the car must be locked when you are not in your car.

LOCATION

The shoot will be held at the Victoria Fish and Game Protective Association Range, located at 700 Holker Place, just off the Malahat Highway (opposite the Spectacle Lake turnoff). **Since the highway is now divided, if you are coming from the north, you must do a turn around at the South Shawnigan Lake turnoff and head north again in order to turn right on to Holker Road.**

For the comfort, safety and enjoyment of all participants' dogs must be under control of owner at all times

Camping Policy

General

1. Camping rules and privileges are for all members. The caretaker has the authority to evict campers from the campsite and the Association reserves the right to have a member come before the Incident Review Committee for discipline or revocation of membership for flagrant disregard for other members and/or the regulations.
2. Check in time is 12:30PM and check out time is 11:30AM.
3. All campers are to stop at office upon arrival for registration and to sign in, and to stop at office when checking out/signing out as well.
4. Campers are to sign the ledger acknowledging they have read and will abide by the rules (handed out at sign in).
5. The caretaker has authority for site assignment and occupancy. Camping is only permitted in designated camping areas.
6. There is no RV hook up available and the Association does not provide electricity.
7. Members are entitled to camp for free (included in membership fee) subject to maximum stay limitations.
8. Maximum stay is seven (7) consecutive days and fourteen (14) days total in any three month period. This encompasses one weekend only. The campsite must be vacated for 5 days to allow other campers the use of the campground. Your stay could be extended if multiple vacancies exist but only on a nightly basis.
9. Campsite maximum is one camping party per site unless otherwise authorized.
10. Party size for one vehicle accessible campsite:
 - a. One to four persons 18 years of age or older;
 - b. At least one member of the camping party must be 18 years or older;
 - c. A maximum of eight persons including children (17 years of age and younger).
11. If a site is booked for 7 days and another member joins their site part way through, that site is to be vacated at the end of the original 7 day booking. The new member cannot continue to occupy that site.
12. If a member leaves the evening before checkout, the site will remain vacant until 12:30 check-in the next day.
13. First come, first served. However, you can PAY for and temporarily hold a specific site as long as you return with your unit within that same day/evening. Also, a member can pay for a site for one other extra member (must provide name and membership #). Out of town members may call ahead to find out if there are any vacant sites available, but the site cannot be reserved.

Guests

14. Members may bring one guest unit (\$15 more per night) to SHARE a site with the occupying member for the length of their stay. Guests will not be given their own site.
15. Guests must be accompanied at all times by a member. A spouse/partner that does not hold a Spousal membership is considered a guest as well and must also be accompanied by a member (member must be on

the property, e.g., could be shooting while other family members are at camp site). Children and minors are also considered as guests and must have adult supervision at all times.

Camp Fires

16. Camp fires are permitted in the fire rings except when a fire ban is in place, ask the caretaker. All fires must be in the assigned campsite rings and must be extinguished before retiring for the evening or leaving the campsite. Keep a suitable container of water or fire extinguisher available when a fire is burning.
17. Campsite fire rings are not to be moved. No cutting of live trees or burning of wet or dirty garbage.
18. If available, one wheel barrow of fire wood will be provided free per stay. Additional fire wood may be available for purchase from the caretaker at \$25 per wheel barrow load. If you use wood, please help restock the supply by donating some time to cut, split & stack wood.
19. No cutting of wood from the surrounding bush for your campfire. No use of chainsaws on the property.
20. Picnic tables are limited, only one per group/site – if you move it, put it back when you leave. Picnic tables may not be taken from the ranges or the area around Frog Hollow.

Consideration of Others

21. Courtesy and consideration of other campers is expected.
22. Water is at a premium, so please use it sparingly.
23. Leave your area as clean as or cleaner than you found it. Please dispose of cigarette butts properly and pick up and dispose of any garbage, bottle caps, glass, nails, etc. Garbage and recycle containers are provided.
24. It is critical that no plastic bags or disposable diapers be put in the outhouses as they will plug up the sewage disposal trucks.
25. “Quiet time” is 10PM. No loud music, partying or other noise after 10PM. All music should be turned down to a low level at all times for courtesy to your neighbors.
26. No consumption of alcohol outside of the designated camping area.
27. Generators, if required, are to run only between 12:30PM until 9:30PM and not for longer than a one hour period.
28. Vehicles are only to be parked within the site or designated parking areas, not on the road.

Health and Safety

29. No Swimming or boating in the pond – it is for fishing.
30. Children must be supervised by an adult.
31. For safety reasons, there will be no riding of bikes after dark or mountain biking on black powder, archery or hawk and knife trails.
32. Health regulations will be enforced – release of gray or black water is not permitted on Association property. Emptying of holding tanks should be at proper discharge locations in town. No bathing or washing of hair, dishes or laundry in the pond.

Special Event Camping

33. The entire campground or certain camp sites may be closed to members on occasion for special events authorized by the Board. Notice will be given through website calendar and announced at General Meetings
34. Camping is only available for non-members for the evening prior to a special event and the days and nights during the special event unless arrangements have been made with the event organizer due to special circumstances (the event organizer is responsible for informing the Caretakers). Regular camping fees apply before and after an event.
35. Complimentary special event camping for non-members is for the specific event only, and does not include use of any additional facilities. A Day Pass must be purchased to use additional facilities (e.g., ranges).
