Talks

Boxing Day Trap Shoot

Enough people volunteered to allow this shoot to go ahead. Steve Minckler coordinated the event and turnout was good. Many pounds of prime cuts of meat left the property in the hands of the winning shooters. Perry Chow, aided by Al Page and Val Macdonald provided lunch, which must have been appreciated as everything disappeared.

Archery 3D Turkey Shoot

The 3D archery group put on a Turkey Shoot and the turnout was about twice as was expected. The shoot was designed to be fun and turkeys (or equivalent) were awarded by raffle. With the stresses of Christmas and New Years looming this low key approach gained a lot of favourable comments.

Memberships

The sale of memberships is difficult for the membership chair to keep up with and is probably exceeding last year's numbers (1650 total membership). Over the past several years the club has enjoyed an ever I increasing number of members. Some of this is due to the laws requiring a club membership for the ownership of restricted firearms but by far the greater influence seems to be a general increase in interest among the public for shooting sports.

Last year Island Outfitters sold 71% of memberships and all indications are that they are equalling or bettering this number for 2011. For the same period, Roby, the caretaker, sold 18% of memberships. The remaining 11% was divided among the other retail outlets which have agreed to sell our memberships – Robinson's Outdoor, West Shore Sport Fishing, Eagle Eye Outfitters and Pullen's Gunsmithing. The club owes these shops a hearty thank you – probably best expressed by purchasing from their stores.

Life Memberships

Club bylaws state that at any one time the club can honour 10 people by appointing them to the position of Life Member. To be awarded this status comes from a long term history of working for the betterment of the club or for representing to the public the outdoor interests of hunting, fishing and resource conservation. To be a Life Member allows one perpetual access to all the facilities and services offered by the club without the need to pay annual membership fees.

Within the past year we have lost two Life Members – Harry Gladwell and Ernie Fedoruk. Both were long term supporters of the club in their own ways.

At the moment there are several club members that I see as meeting the criteria for life membership. However, my experience with the club is somewhat limited and I would like to receive suggestions from a wide circle of club members as to who they see as being worthy of the title.

Range Officer Group

Saturday, January 22, 2011 will be the day for the first meeting of the group of people who have expressed an interest in receiving general training as range officers. This training will provide a basic understanding as to the rules and procedures that each club shooting venue uses in their events in addition to the rules and procedures within the bylaws of the club. Members will be expected to take turns in representing the club at shooting events but not to run the event.

The latest update from James Craig of the B.C. Conservation Foundation concerning the release of water from Thetis Lake to Craigflower Creek is positive. He notes that project stakeholders have engaged the public and Regional Parks Committee members in order to inform them of the issues. These efforts have been successful as the CRD continues to move towards the release of water from Thetis Lake despite the corporate review of dam/reservoir management currently underway.

CRD Parks management will be advising the CRD Parks Committee early in the new year on their plan to address the remaining liability issue around swimming/diving at Thetis Lake.

CRD Parks has cancelled the planned underwater assessment of hazards at Thetis Lake as the study is inappropriate at this time. CRD has received a letter from DFO Habitat Management stating they support the project and confirming that, during the proposed multi-year trial release period, there would be no obligation to release water.

The BCCF notes we look forward to finalizing details around a release of water from Thetis Lake with CRD Parks' field staff in the spring of 2011.

It is unfortunate that cooperation from the CRD was not forthcoming earlier in 2010 as this could have prevented the mortality of thousands of Coho fry rearing in Craigflower Creek.

NEW 6TH EDITION BIG GAME RECORDS BOOK

A new 6th edition **BIG GAME RECORDS OF BRITISH COLUMBIA** has been published by the Wildlife Records Club of B.C. The 480 page hardcover book features a fall Grizzly painted by Prince George wildlife artist, Ken Ferris, on the front cover.

The book contains more than 9000 entries in 19 big game categories and lists over 1900 new entries received since the 2003 edition. Included are feature articles of general interest along with a wide variety of pictures and hunting stories related to the more recent entries.

The Wildlife Records Club of British Columbia was formed in Kamloops in 1969 with the objective of maintaining a perpetual record of trophy class big game taken in British Columbia. Using the Boone & Crockett scoring system, the Club has scorers throughout the province for the convenience of hunters. Since 1982, directorship of the Club has been based on Vancouver Island.

LETTERS REQUESTED TO SAVE TRADITIONAL COASTWIDE RECREATIONAL HALIBUT FISHERY

Letters to the Minister of Fisheries & Oceans are requested in efforts to change the management parameters of our halibut fishery so that early season closures do not happen again. Here are some points to consider and use in your letter.

- the Sport Fishing Advisory Board position is for an 11 month (February 01 to December 31) season with a daily limit of 2 and a possession limit of 2.
- former Fisheries Minister Robert Thibault in 2003 implemented a halibut allocation policy which split the Canadian Pacific coast halibut catch between commercial and recreational fisheries 88/12, respectively.
- the total allowable catch (TAC) is set each year in January by the International Pacific Halibut Commission (IPHC). This catch allows the fisheries to be managed on a sustainable basis.
- according to DFO catch estimates, the sport fishery exceeded its 12% quota in 2010 and was closed on October 18. In 2008, the fishery was closed November 01 for similar reason.
- DFO says we exceeded our quota by 71,000 lb to October 18, 2010. This amount will have to be paid back by subtracting from our 2011 quota. This could result in an even earlier closure in 2011 if an alternative management regime cannot be agreed upon for 2011 and the future.
- the early season closure in 2010 was in spite of the fact the commercial fishery left 750,000 lb of their quota still in the ocean to be caught at a later date.
- the approximately 100,000 recreational halibut anglers generate a large economic return to both the province and the country. The early closure of our halibut fishery is not justified based on either allocation, conservation or economic considerations.
- we oppose the gifting of halibut quota to 435 commercial halibut licence holders. This common property public resource is only fished by about 1/3 of the licence holders while the remaining 2/3 choose not to fish but to lease their quota to the others and make huge profits in doing so.
- a halibut allocation process has been set up to address various halibut allocation options aimed at resolving the 88/12 split which does not work for the recreational fishery. A favoured option is for a set number of pounds per year for the sport fishery which would allow it to continue for the full 11 month season.

BIG GAME RECORDS BOOKS

Copies of the newly published eighth edition (2010) of the Vancouver Island Columbian Blacktail Deer Records are available at a cost of \$5 each. The issue contains a brief history of the records which were started in 1972 by Byron Mason and Charles Veasey. Byron Mason has written another excellent article on the history of hunting on Vancouver Island from 1900 to 1920. The previous seventh edition (2000) contained Byron's piece on blacktail deer populations and hunting on Vancouver Island from 1843 to 1899.

The current records list 1824 entries scoring 100 or more Boone & Crockett points. Several old hunting photographs have been reproduced for the first time in the Vancouver Island deer records booklet.

Ernie will be greatly missed by his wife of 55 years Eileen who cared for him through his final years suffering from Alzheimer's disease. He is also survived by his daughter Darynn who will always remember growing up at sporting events wherever her Dad would take her and his two grand-children, Brittney and Troy who will miss so many happy times spent at Grandpa's' side. Ernie is also survived by his sister Lola Blumer (Erwin) of Edmonton, Alberta, brother in-law Jack Knill (Dee) of Victoria, and his many cousins, nieces and nephews. Ernie is pre-deceased by his brothers Michael and William Fedoruk. A special thanks from the family to all who cared for Ernie at Watson Ward, Royal Jubilee Hospital and Beckley Farm Lodge in his final years. 
