HISTORICAL / OPERATIONAL BACKGROUNDER - 2011

The Amalgamated Conservation Society has operated continuously since 1954 and was largely responsible for the formation of the Sport Fishing Advisory Board in 1964. The ACS served as a member until 1997 when restructuring eliminated this seat. We continue with our member clubs participating as the main component of the Victoria Sport Fishing Advisory Committee formed on September 18, 1996. Chris Bos (250-652-4141) currently chairs the Committee. Both Chris and Tom Cole represent the local committee at Sport Fishing Advisory Board meetings.

The Amalgamated Conservation Society has been involved with the Department of Fisheries & Oceans for close to 60 years in analyzing their management and regulation of the Pacific Coast fisheries.

Members became so concerned regarding problems affecting the fisheries resources and the sport fishery, that in February 1963 they drafted and sent a brief to the then Minister of Fisheries, J. Angus MacLean.

The ACS not only talked about the problems plaguing the fish resources and various fisheries, but did, and continues to do, something about it. Members pioneered small stream public involvement projects in aid of salmonid enhancement in the early 1970's - years before the advent of the Salmonid Enhancement Program (SEP) in 1976. Direction from the early years until 1990 came from enhancement pioneer Howard English who served as the ACS Projects Coordinator.

A newly constructed mini-hatchery and fry rearing facility became operational in the late fall of 1982. The ACS and its member clubs have reared Chinook salmon fry in net pens since 1989. Stream enhancement work, spawner and smolt enumeration and fry satelliting to other south Vancouver Island streams continues.

To replace the dedicated effort of long time projects coordinator Howard English, who passed away in June of 1991, the Goldstream Volunteer Salmonid Enhancement Association was formed. The GVSEA operates under the umbrella of the ACS and is one of our member clubs.

The ACS currently operates with its nine member organizations within the Capital Regional District of southern Vancouver Island, as follows:

THIS MONTHS RANGE RULE REFRESHER!! We have updated our Range Rules!!!!!!!

Your Board of Directors has been working to keep the Range Rules current and relevant. This month we have the "Rules Specific to the Rifle/Pistol Range" refresher. Next month, we will have the updated rules specific to the Shotgun Range. The full range rules can be found and downloaded from our website; vfgpa.org under the 'About Us' tab.

RULES SPECIFIC TO THE RIFLE/PISTOL RANGE

Please note: These rules are in addition to the General Range Rules. Sanctioned events may have variations.

- 1. This range is approved for calibers up to BUT NOT INCLUDING 50 BMG. (IE. 338 Lapua template). The maximum allowable shooting distance is 250 yards.
- 2. The firing line is defined as the front of the concrete slab. USE THE WOODEN SHOOTING TABLES. DO NOT USE THE CONCRETE GEAR TABLES FOR SHOOTING. If a VFGPA Range officer is present, alternate procedures may be used under their direction and control.
- 3. The 'Range Safety Flag System' procedure MUST be followed during all range use:
- 4. Rapid fire and uncontrolled fire is NOT permitted on this range. This means no more than three controlled shots per second; all shots must be directed at a target, and all fire must be sighted (ie. No 'hip shooting' or similar)
- 5. All personal metal targets must be pre-approved by the Caretaker or Range Safety Officer (if present) prior to use on this range.
- 6. Approved metal targets MUST be a minimum of 25 yards (21 meters) for rifle shooting and 11 yards (10 meters) for pistol shooting from the designated firing line. Lead ammo only for metal targets which are closer than 100 yards.
- 7. The Caretaker has a supply of paper targets (small cost involved) which may be used on this range.

Cease Fire Procedure

Ceasefires are called to allow shooters to venture safely downrange to set up and change their targets. The timing of each ceasefire should be mutually decided between the shooters present. If the range is busy the 20/10-ceasefire system is preferred (20 minutes of shooting followed by 10 minutes of ceasefire, etc.)

When a cease-fire is called ALL shooters will carry out the following actions:

- 1. All firearms will be completely unloaded, all ammo and magazines removed, actions open. Long guns may be placed in the racks and handguns may be holstered,
- 2. The handling of firearms is prohibited during a cease-fire,
- **3**. The Range Safety Flag System:

RED FLAG:

Range is in use (HOT);	Red Flag is VISIBLE mounted in holder
	It is safe to fire at targets down range
GREEN FLAG:	
Range is CLOSED;	Guns are unloaded, actions open and/or placed in the racks
	It is safe to move forward of the firing line to change Targets on the range.

- 4. ONLY when a cease-fire is called, all firearms are safe and the Range Safety Flag System has been changed to GREEN, can shooters move forward of the designated firing line,
- 5. When moving forward, shooters MUST turn on the light switch that corresponds to their shooting station. Each station has two positions; an 'A' table and a 'B' table. If both tables at a station are being used, a 'Buddy System' of ensuring that your table partner has safely returned from the field MUST BE USED. On returning from being forward of the firing line shooters MUST ensure they turn off ONLY their light; and
- 6. The acting Range Officer will be the last person to turn off the cease-fire warning light, exchange the range safety flags and will ONLY do so having ensured that all required procedures have been followed.

When finished shooting, please clean-up both your shooting station, AND the targets and debris from your targets at the target distance at which you were shooting. Please leave the range cleaner than you found it.

Since our last report, the SIAS activities can best be described as "*INTERESTING*," and that doesn't even take the weather into account! On April 17, many of our shooters were bound for Nanaimo to take part in ISL Qualifier #2 when they encountered an insurmountable barrier (Yes! Apparently even shooting enthusiasts have insurmountable barriers!). As you may recall, that was the day of the infamous fuel truck rollover that contaminated the Goldstream River and closed the Malahat for 24 hours. Still, one or two of our more addicted did reach the Nanaimo match – after a *four hour* trip via port Renfrew!

The May 01 SIAS Club Match was also extra challenging. BIG GAME RECORDS BOOKS

Copies of the newly published eighth edition (2010) of the Vancouver Island Columbian Blacktail Deer Records are available at a cost of \$5 each. The issue contains a brief history of the records which were started in 1972 by Byron Mason and Charles Veasey. Byron Mason has written another excellent article on the history of hunting on Vancouver Island from 1900 to 1920. The previous seventh edition (2000) contained Byron's piece on blacktail deer populations and hunting on Vancouver Island from 1843 to 1899.

The current records list 1824 entries scoring 100 or more Boone & Crockett points. Several old hunting photographs have been reproduced for the first time in the Vancouver Island deer records booklet.

NEW 6TH EDITION BIG GAME RECORDS BOOK

A new 6th edition **BIG GAME RECORDS OF BRITISH COLUMBIA** has been published by the Wildlife Records Club of B.C. The 480 page hardcover book features a fall Grizzly painted by Prince George wildlife artist, Ken Ferris, on the front cover.

The book contains more than 9000 entries in 19 big game categories and lists over 1900 new entries received since the 2003 edition. Included are feature articles of general interest along with a wide variety of pictures and hunting stories related to the more recent entries.

The Wildlife Records Club of British Columbia was formed in Kamloops in 1969 with the objective of maintaining a perpetual record of trophy class big game taken in British Columbia. Using the Boone & Crockett scoring system, the Club has scorers throughout the province for the convenience of hunters. Since 1982, directorship of the Club has been based on Vancouver Island.

The Club is dedicated to wildlife conservation, selective hunting and fair chase. Copies of the 6th edition Records Book are available from Wayne Zaccarelli (250-382-8502) or from Island Outfitters in Victoria.
