THIS MONTHS RANGE RULE REFRESHER!!

We have updated our Range Rules!!!!!!

Your Board of Directors has been working to keep the Range Rules current and relevant. This month we have the "Rules Specific to the Shotgun Range" refresher, as well as the "Rules specific to the Multi-Purpose Range. Next month, we will have the updated rules specific to the Archery Range. The full range rules can be found and downloaded from our website; yfgpa.org under the 'About Us' tab.

RULES SPECIFIC TO THE SHOTGUN RANGE

Please Note: These rules are in addition to the General Range Rules. Sanctioned events may have variations.

- 1. No discharge of firearms other than shotguns on the Shotgun Range (Except as part of a special VFGPA sanctioned event). This means NO rifles, pistols or cannons of any caliber or style.
- 2. Firearms are NOT permitted in the clubhouse. (Unloaded Handguns may be holstered at a sanctioned event).
- 3. No spectators forward of the designated firing line.
- 4. No shot larger than No. 7 1/2 shall be used.
- 5. No gun shall be loaded until the shooter is on a shooting station.
- 6. Any loaded gun MUST BE pointed in a safe direction.
- 7. The loading of more than two shells in a gun is not allowed at any time.
- 8. No "backing-up" shall be allowed while shooting Skeet.
- 9. Following the use of trap or skeet facilities other than at a VFGPA sanctioned event each shooter is required to clean up any spent shotgun hulls and all litter.
- 10. Please ensure that broken clay target debris does not litter the shooting stands or the trap machine bunkers, it must be cleaned up.

RULES SPECIFIC TO THE MULTI-PURPOSE RANGE

Please Note: These rules are in addition to the General Range Rules. Sanctioned events may have variations. This range is only for use by Members and their guests (members must be present with guest). This range has key-access only, and should be locked upon entering and leaving the range. Keys are available (for a deposit of \$25) from a member of the Board, or the Caretaker. Upon reaching the shooting area, it is required to sign-in again at this range.

- 1. The firing line is just inside the front edge of the berms. All shooting must be from this line, towards the rear (backstop). All bullets must be directed to the sand backstop.
- 2. No shooting into the side berms; the berms are designed for Safety, NOT as a bullet backstop.
- 3. This is a pistol, shotgun, Black Powder, and small caliber rifle range. I.E. pistol caliber, 22 rimfire, & small caliber/low velocity rifles ONLY. NO large caliber or high velocity rifles. (ie. Standard 7.62 SKS rounds, or 223 are the top end of accepted rounds for this range This range allows use of calibers up to and including the 223 Remington template. Templates are posted on the range bulletin board.
- 4. All targets are to be paper or cardboard.
- 5. All personal metal targets must be pre-approved by the Caretaker or Range Safety Officer (if present) prior to use on this range.
- 6. When moving forward to check targets, handguns may be safely holstered if you have been 'Holster Trained', otherwise all handguns and long-guns must be placed on your shooting table, pointed downrange, unloaded with actions open.
- 7. Leave the range clean.
- 8. The Caretaker has a supply of paper targets (small cost involved) which may be used on this range.

When finished shooting, please clean-up both your shooting station, AND the targets and debris from your targets at the target distance at which you were shooting. Please leave the range cleaner than you found it.

PPC (Police Pistol Competition) Section Report

The PPC section of the club hosted another 'Introduction to Handgun' course on the first weekend of June. We had a total of 19 'Students', who ranged in experience from a rank beginner (How do I hold this again???) to club members who shoot other disciplines. For those of you who are unfamiliar with this course, the PPC section hosts two of these courses each year. Their purpose is threefold; to recruit new Fish & Game Club members, to recruit new PPC shooters, and to encourage non-shooters to be comfortable around firearms. It is a total of approximately 8 hours of both classroom and practical instruction that covers everything from safe gun handling to holster training, sight picture and trigger control. The final objective being accuracy; after all, if you don't hit what you aim at, all you are doing is making noise.......... We were successful on all three of our objectives. Everybody had fun and took home a few souvenir targets; we have a number of people who are interested in finding out more about PPC shooting; and some of the students joined the VFGPA.

I notice under the list of members present the names of two individuals representing the Victoria Rowing Society - Adam Parfitt and Dave Toppin. I also note under those giving their regrets another two individuals representing the Victoria Rowing Society - Rick Crawley and James Keogh. I take this to mean the VRS has four voting representatives on the EBLRUAG; two of which were in attendance and another two who were unable to attend.



BIG GAME RECORDS BOOKS

Copies of the newly published eighth edition (2010) of the Vancouver Island Columbian Blacktail Deer Records are available at a cost of \$5 each. The issue contains a brief history of the records which were started in 1972 by Byron Mason and Charles Veasey. Byron Mason has written another excellent article on the history of hunting on Vancouver Island from 1900 to 1920. The previous seventh edition (2000) contained Byron's piece on blacktail deer populations and hunting on Vancouver Island from 1843 to 1899.

The current records list 1824 entries scoring 100 or more Boone & Crockett points. Several old hunting photographs have been reproduced for the first time in the Vancouver Island deer records booklet.

NEW 6TH EDITION BIG GAME RECORDS BOOK

A new 6th edition **BIG GAME RECORDS OF BRITISH COLUMBIA** has been published by the Wildlife Records Club of B.C. The 480 page hardcover book features a fall Grizzly painted by Prince George wildlife artist, Ken Ferris, on the front cover.

The book contains more than 9000 entries in 19 big game categories and lists over 1900 new entries received since the 2003 edition. Included are feature articles of general interest along with a wide variety of pictures and hunting stories related to the more recent entries.

The Wildlife Records Club of British Columbia was formed in Kamloops in 1969 with the objective of maintaining a perpetual record of trophy class big game taken in British Columbia. Using the Boone & Crockett scoring system, the Club has scorers throughout the province for the convenience of hunters. Since 1982, directorship of the Club has been based on Vancouver Island.

The Club is dedicated to wildlife conservation, selective hunting and fair chase. Copies of the 6th edition Records Book are available from Wayne Zaccarelli (250-382-8502) or from Island Outfitters in Victoria.




