**THIS MONTHS RANGE RULE REFRESHER!!****We have updated our Range Rules!!!!!!**

*Your Board of Directors has been working to keep the Range Rules current and relevant. This month we have the "Rules Specific to the Shotgun Range" and "Rules specific to the Multi-Purpose" refreshers. Next month, we will have the updated rules specific to the Archery Range. The full range rules can be found and downloaded from our website; [vfgpa.org](http://vfgpa.org) under the 'About Us' tab.*

**RULES SPECIFIC TO THE SHOTGUN RANGE**

**Please Note:** These rules are in addition to the General Range Rules. Sanctioned events may have variations.

1. No discharge of firearms other than shotguns on the Shotgun Range (Except as part of a special VFGPA sanctioned event). This means NO rifles, pistols or cannons of any caliber or style.
2. Firearms are NOT permitted in the clubhouse. (Unloaded Handguns may be holstered at a sanctioned event).
3. No spectators forward of the designated firing line.
4. No shot larger than No. 7 1/2 shall be used.
5. The action of a firearm shall be open at all times unless actively shooting on a squad.
6. No gun shall be loaded until the shooter is on a shooting station.
7. Always keep your muzzle pointed in a safe direction, and any loaded gun MUST BE kept pointed in the direction of fire.
8. The loading of more than two shells in a gun is not allowed at any time.
9. No "backing-up" shall be allowed while shooting Skeet.
10. Following the use of trap or skeet facilities other than at a VFGPA sanctioned event each shooter is required to clean up any spent shotgun hulls and all litter.
11. Please ensure that broken clay target debris does not litter the shooting stands or the trap machine bunkers, it must be cleaned up.

The Caretaker has a supply of clays (\$20/box) which may be used on this range.

When finished shooting, please clean-up your shooting station. Please leave the range cleaner than you found it.

**RULES SPECIFIC TO THE MULTI-PURPOSE RANGE**

**Please Note:** These rules are in addition to the General Range Rules. Sanctioned events may have variations. This range is for use by Members and their guests (members must be present with guest). This range has key-access only, and should be locked upon entering and leaving the range. Keys are available (for a deposit of \$25) from a member of the Board, or the Caretaker. Upon reaching the shooting area, it is required to sign-in again at this range.

1. The firing line is just inside the front edge of the berms. All shooting must be from this line, towards the rear (backstop). All bullets must be directed to the sand backstop.
2. No shooting into the side berms; the berms are designed for Safety, NOT as a bullet backstop.
3. This is a pistol, shotgun, Black Powder, and small caliber rifle range. I.E. pistol caliber, 22 rimfire, & small caliber/low velocity rifles ONLY. NO large caliber or high velocity rifles. (ie. Standard 7.62 SKS rounds, or 223 Remington template. Templates are posted on the range bulletin board.
4. All targets are to be paper or cardboard.
5. All personal metal targets must be pre-approved by the Caretaker or Range Safety Officer (if present) prior to use on this range.
6. When moving forward to check targets, handguns may be safely holstered if you have been 'Holster Trained', otherwise all handguns and long-guns must be placed on your shooting table, pointed downrange, unloaded with actions open.
7. Leave the range clean.
8. The Caretaker has a supply of paper targets (small cost involved) which may be used on this range.

When finished shooting, please clean-up both your shooting station, AND the targets and debris from your targets at the target distance at which you were shooting. Please leave the range cleaner than you found it.

The course teaches basic range operation and what is expected of each individual on the posse. Consists of 4 hours of classroom instruction, and is followed by a short test. Current RO I 's may audit course at no cost. RO I course is a pre-requisite for SASS RO II .

**WTS: WW2 German Wehrmacht G-43 Rifle. Gewehr 43** (Karabiner 43 G43, K43, Gew 43, Kar 43) is a 8x57mm caliber semi-automatic rifle developed by Third Reich Germany during World War II.

Surviving examples in working order are rare.

Mine is a Walther AC 44 I believe-was possible RC issued to VOPO post war. No obvious RC markings though. (Other than electro-penciled numbers) All Waffenamt (WaA) Stamps and proof marks retain the Third Reich markings and WaA numbers. Mine has Apfelter Waffenfabrik springs and shooters kit installed, (See: <http://www.apfelter.com/>) but I will include the original parts as well. Comes w/original leather sling and 2 WaA stamped magazines, cleaning rod and front sight hood. Dura foil front stock in excellent condition. Head spacing and timing gauges included. Excellent Range shooter, I have fired under 40 rounds through her. Buyer gets 175 rounds (+/-) of Ammo as well. (If you can pick up)

**VICTORIA FISH & GAME ANNUAL BIG GAME COMPETITION**

Hunters are reminded that Blacktail deer taken in MU 1-1 through 1-13 by Victoria Fish & Game members are eligible for the five trophies available each year. Deer must be field dressed which means that the heart, liver and kidneys (edible portions) are the only internal organs which can be included when the animal is weighed. Deer must be weighed on Club scales by the caretaker or his designate.

The official weigher reserves the right to refuse weighing any deer which arrives in an unpreventable condition. Lungs must be removed and body cavity wiped dry with a rag or paper towels. Deer 160 pounds and over taken with a rifle and 140 pounds and over taken by bow and arrow must be witnessed by an executive member at time of weighing. Please contact the Club caretaker or Wayne Zaccarelli to make arrangements.

On July 19 a group of Esquimalt Anglers' members transported and released approximately 80,000 Nitinat Chinook Smolts from the Howard English Goldstream Hatchery to the waters of Esquimalt Harbour. The EAA has been doing this for close to 20 years in an attempt to improve Sportfishing in the local area. In some years close to 200,000 Chinook have been released but because of lower numbers of surplus Chinook at the Nitinat hatchery in recent years, fewer eggs have been available for hatching and rearing at Goldstream. The fish were transported in oxygenated tanks on trailers and released at the boat launch ramp on the Esquimalt Indian Reserve next to the Canadian Forces Sailing Association. In three or four years from now, these Chinooks should return to the area for anglers to catch. The following pictures show the volunteers netting the Chinook Smolts from the large round rearing tanks located at the Goldstream Hatchery and the release via a long hose from the transport tanks into Esquimalt Harbour.

**BIG GAME RECORDS BOOKS**

Copies of the newly published eighth edition (2010) of the Vancouver Island Columbian Blacktail Deer Records are available at a cost of \$5 each. The issue contains a brief history of the records which were started in 1972 by Byron Mason and Charles Veasey. Byron Mason has written another excellent article on the history of hunting on Vancouver Island from 1900 to 1920. The previous seventh edition (2000) contained Byron's piece on blacktail deer populations and hunting on Vancouver Island from 1843 to 1899.

The current records list 1824 entries scoring 100 or more Boone & Crockett points. Several old hunting photographs have been reproduced for the first time in the Vancouver Island deer records booklet.

**NEW 6<sup>TH</sup> EDITION BIG GAME RECORDS BOOK**

A new 6<sup>th</sup> edition **BIG GAME RECORDS OF BRITISH COLUMBIA** has been published by the Wildlife Records Club of B.C. The 480 page hardcover book features a fall Grizzly painted by Prince George wildlife artist, Ken Ferris, on the front cover.

The book contains more than 9000 entries in 19 big game categories and lists over 1900 new entries received since the 2003 edition. Included are feature articles of general interest along with a wide variety of pictures and hunting stories related to the more recent entries.

The Wildlife Records Club of British Columbia was formed in Kamloops in 1969 with the objective of maintaining a perpetual record of trophy class big game taken in British Columbia. Using the Boone & Crockett scoring system, the Club has scorers throughout the province for the convenience of hunters. Since 1982, directorship of the Club has been based on Vancouver Island.

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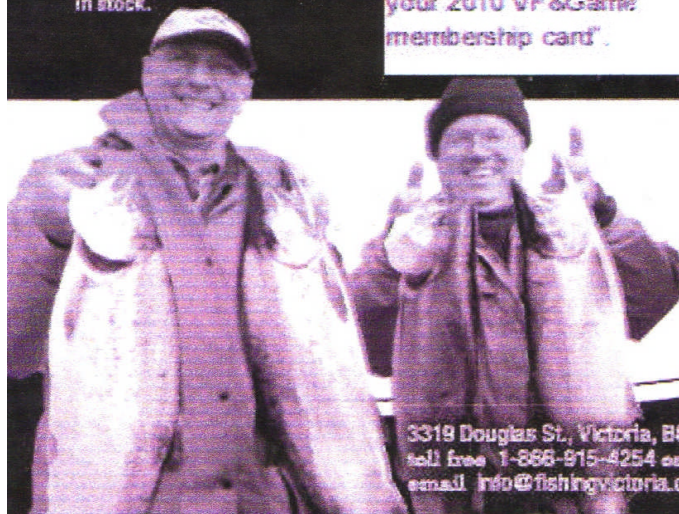
