FROM THE RANGE SAFETY OFFICERS

Reference cross firing on the range is not safe under the range design and that direct supervision of anyone without a P.A.L. means direct supervision and control. (for all our young shooters under 18 years for Non-Restricted and 19 for Restricted.



SAFETY FIRST

- ALWAYS keep the gun pointed in a safe direction.
- ALWAYS keep your finger off the trigger until ready to shoot.
- ALWAYS keep the gun unloaded until ready to use.

MEMBERS PLEASE NOTE:

* ***The range is only approved to 250 yards distance limit for the R/P range ****



THIS MONTHS RANGE RULE REFRESHER!!

We have updated our Range Rules!!!!!!

Your Board of Directors has been working to keep the Range Rules current and relevant. This month we have the "Rules Specific to the Archery Range" and our policy regarding any violation of our safety rules. The full range rules can be found and downloaded from our website; vfgpa.org under the 'About Us' tab.

RULES SPECIFIC TO THE ARCHERY RANGE

Please Note: These rules are in addition to the General Range Rules. Sanctioned events may have variations.

- 1. Crossbows shall be carried uncocked. Load only when you have reached the shooting point.
- 2. Field Points ONLY may be used to shoot the bags or the large blue field butts. (arrows must be able to be removed without damaging the bag or butt.)
- 3. Broadheads are to be used in the sand pit ONLY.
- 4. NO Cross-firing. Always aim at the proper target.
- 5. Do NOT shoot arrows high into the air, the landing point is unpredictable.
- 6. Do NOT walk in the reverse direction on the 3D Trail; this may result in unsafe directions of fire.
- 7. Always KNOW that your arrow will land in a safe area if you miss the target.
- 8. When looking for lost arrows behind a target, ALWAYS leave a No-Shoot marker or ask someone to act as a sentry in front of the target, so other archers know not to shoot.
- 9. Leave the range clean.
- In order to fully enjoy the archery Range and adjoining trail, please familiarize yourself with the basic layout, shooting positions and the target position attached to it.
- The trail is marked by 2" solid yellow ribbon. If the trail is blocked by a ribbon tied across the path, then the TRAIL IS CLOSED!! DO NOT CROSS PAST THE RIBBON!! It could be in the line of fire of a target from a forward position.
- Found arrows are to be put in the box at the back door of the Archery Clubhouse; check there if you have lost one.
- ALWAYS be aware that the Rifle/Pistol range is to the east of the trail, and that to the west of the trail is the lower access road; All archery activity must be arranged so that NO ARROWS can pose a danger to these areas.
- When finished shooting, please clean-up both your shooting station, AND the targets and debris from your targets at the target distance at which you were shooting. Please leave the range cleaner than you found it.

VIOLATION OF THE VFGPA PROPERTY USE POLICY OR RANGE RULES

The Victoria Fish and Game Protective Association wishes to maintain a safe environment for all its members and non-members at the Malahat Outdoor Sports Facility. Having the obligation to operate the organization under strict insurance criteria, it is deemed unacceptable to break the rules. If you see someone not following our safety rules, please introduce yourself and give them a gentle reminder of the correct safety procedures to be followed. You will find a laminated copy of our Range Rules hanging on the bulletin board of each range. Most people will be happy to be informed of the correct procedure to follow. If you encounter resistance, do not press the matter; report the incident to the Caretaker or Range Officer immediately.

Please Take Note:

The Caretaker and the Range Officer may demand violators leave the property immediately. The Executive has the right to remove membership privileges or suspend membership and The Executive also has the right to ban violators from future access to the property. Serious violations will be dealt with severely. Ignorance of the rules is not an excuse. If accused of violating any the VFGPA rules, members and non-members have the right to a hearing at the next official Board of Directors Meeting.

VICTORIA FISH & GAME ANNUAL BIG GAME COMPETITION

Hunters are reminded that Blacktail deer taken in MU 1-1 through 1-13 by Victoria Fish & Game members are eligible for the five trophies available each year. Deer must be field dressed which means that the heart, liver and kidneys (edible portions) are the only internal organs which can be included when the animal is weighed. Deer must be weighed on Club scales by the caretaker or his designate.

The official weigher reserves the right to refuse weighing any deer which arrives in an unpresentable condition. Lungs must be removed and body cavity wiped dry with a rag or paper towels. Deer 160 pounds and over taken with a rifle and 140 pounds and over taken by bow and arrow must be witnessed by an executive member at time of weighing. Please contact the Club caretaker or Wayne Zaccarelli to make arrangements.

BIG GAME RECORDS BOOKS

Copies of the newly published eighth edition (2010) of the Vancouver Island Columbian Blacktail Deer Records are available at a cost of \$5 each. The issue contains a brief history of the records which were started in 1972 by Byron Mason and Charles Veasey. Byron Mason has written another excellent article on the history of hunting on Vancouver Island from 1900 to 1920. The previous seventh edition (2000) contained Byron's piece on blacktail deer populations and hunting on Vancouver Island from 1843 to 1899.

The current records list 1824 entries scoring 100 or more Boone & Crockett points. Several old hunting photographs have been reproduced for the first time in the Vancouver Island deer records booklet.

NEW 6TH EDITION BIG GAME RECORDS BOOK

A new 6th edition **BIG GAME RECORDS OF BRITISH COLUMBIA** has been published by the Wildlife Records Club of B.C. The 480 page hardcover book features a fall Grizzly painted by Prince George wildlife artist, Ken Ferris, on the front cover.

The book contains more than 9000 entries in 19 big game categories and lists over 1900 new entries received since the 2003 edition. Included are feature articles of general interest along with a wide variety of pictures and hunting stories related to the more recent entries.

The Wildlife Records Club of British Columbia was formed in Kamloops in 1969 with the objective of maintaining a perpetual record of trophy class big game taken in British Columbia. Using the Boone & Crockett scoring system, the Club has scorers throughout the province for the convenience of hunters. Since 1982, directorship of the Club has been based on Vancouver Island.

The Club is dedicated to wildlife conservation, selective hunting and fair chase. Copies of the 6th edition Records Book are available from Wayne Zaccarelli (250-382-8502) or from Island Outfitters in Victoria.




