Members' General Meeting



From the CRSO,

The club trained 13 Range Safety Officers (R.S.O.) back in Feb. of this year. Part of their training was "their Responsibility when acting as a Range Safety Officer". Soon you will see them visiting the various ranges with some sort of Official Markings, Hat, Vest, Range Officer Badge/name tag.

As a Club Member without training, acting as a R.S.O. on the range for a group or groups, a friend/spouse/dependant comes a big responsibility. You may allow someone without a Firearms License (P.A.L. or P.O.L.) or any experience shoot your firearms using the "DIRECT SUPERVISION RULE" you are responsible for them following all club rules as well as all Firearm Act and Regulations Rules. Direct Supervision can be interrupted as "shoulder to shoulder" with the person you are supervising, ensuring proper safety gear, loading and un-loading, trigger finger discipline and muzzle control.

If you need to leave the Firing Point or Firing Line for whatever reason (washroom, going back to your car, conversation with someone) then the person you are supervising should not be shooting or in control of any firearm.

PROSPECT LAKE BOAT LAUNCH ACCESS

This letter came about because of the actions of an adjacent landowner to restrict or curtail access to the primary boat launch access on prospect Lake. I presume this was vented through the local Prospect Lake & District Community Association which put out a lake access survey on their website. This survey closed September 11, As the lake is within Saanich Municipality, the Amalgamated Conservation Society members directed me, as secretary-treasurer, to write the mayor and council expressing the views of organized anglers.

Dear Mr. Mayor and Council members:

The Amalgamated Conservation Society is a not for profit organization representing various angling associations within the Capital Regional District. We have operated continuously since 1954 and currently have nine member associations. These include Clover Point Anglers' Association, Esquimalt Anglers' Association, Goldstream Volunteer Salmonid Enhancement Association, Haig-Brown Flyfishing Association, Royal Canadian Navy Anglers' Association, Sidney Anglers' Association, Victoria Fish & Game Protective Association, Victoria Golden Rods & Reels and Westcoast Flyfishers Association.

Many of the anglers within our member associations enjoy the recreational fishing opportunities provided by Prospect Lake. They are concerned regarding recent talk of closing or restricting access to the main boat launch off Echo Drive because of the wishes of one nearby resident. Our members feel that it is imperative that boat launching and angler access be maintained at this site from dawn to dusk year round. Improvements to the access and parking would be most welcome.

It is rare to find such quality fishing waters within a large population centre such as Greater Victoria. It is important that such a public treasure and access to it be maintained for future generations to enjoy.

Anglers fish for Smallmouth bass, Cutthroat trout and Rainbow trout on this lake. The Freshwater Fisheries Society of B.C. produces trout at their Duncan trout hatchery for stocking into Prospect and many other local lakes. A significant portion of an anglers fishing licence fee is designated to the Freshwater Fisheries Society to produce fish for stocking into urban lakes such as Prospect. This provides the necessary numbers of fish to maintain a quality fishing experience and a tasty, nutritious source of protein for the table.

In conclusion, the Amalgamated Conservation Society is adamant that the Echo Drive and other public launch access points on Prospect Lake be maintained in perpetuity.

VICTORIA FISH & GAME ANNUAL BIG GAME COMPETITION

Hunters are reminded that Blacktail deer taken in MU 1-1 through 1-13 by Victoria Fish & Game members are eligible for the five trophies available each year. Deer must be field dressed which means that the heart, liver and kidneys (edible portions) are the only internal organs which can be included when the animal is weighed. Deer must be weighed on Club scales by the caretaker or his designate.

The official weigher reserves the right to refuse weighing any deer which arrives in an unpresentable condition. Lungs must be removed and body cavity wiped dry with a rag or paper towels. Deer 160 pounds and over taken with a rifle and 140 pounds and over taken by bow and arrow must be witnessed by an executive member at time of weighing. Please contact the Club caretaker or Wayne Zaccarelli to make arrangements.

CRAIGFLOWER CREEK COUNTING FENCE

A group of Esquimalt Anglers' volunteers has replaced the fish counting fence located on lower Craigflower Creek. The old structure was built almost twenty years ago and was decaying to the point of being unsafe. Starting the second week of September the superstructure and fence panels were completely removed down to the concrete sill in the streambed. A new fence was reconstructed using wood dimension lumber and galvanized steel pipe for the fence panel rails. The fence panels are approximately five feet in length and span 30 feet between the sidewalls within the stream channel. The fence is topped with a three foot wide walkway decked with 2x6 lumber and capped with raised expanded aluminum non-slip metal throughout its 40 foot length. For safety, a steel pipe railing is attached along the downstream side of the walkway.

The following pictures show the deconstruction and rebuilding of the fence which was completed in late September.

BIG GAME RECORDS BOOKS

Copies of the newly published eighth edition (2010) of the Vancouver Island Columbian Blacktail Deer Records are available at a cost of \$5 each. The issue contains a brief history of the records which were started in 1972 by Byron Mason and Charles Veasey. Byron Mason has written another excellent article on the history of hunting on Vancouver Island from 1900 to 1920. The previous seventh edition (2000) contained Byron's piece on blacktail deer populations and hunting on Vancouver Island from 1843 to 1899.

The current records list 1824 entries scoring 100 or more Boone & Crockett points. Several old hunting photographs have been reproduced for the first time in the Vancouver Island deer records booklet.

NEW 6TH EDITION BIG GAME RECORDS BOOK

A new 6th edition **BIG GAME RECORDS OF BRITISH COLUMBIA** has been published by the Wildlife Records Club of B.C. The 480 page hardcover book features a fall Grizzly painted by Prince George wildlife artist, Ken Ferris, on the front cover.

The book contains more than 9000 entries in 19 big game categories and lists over 1900 new entries received since the 2003 edition. Included are feature articles of general interest along with a wide variety of pictures and hunting stories related to the more recent entries.

The Wildlife Records Club of British Columbia was formed in Kamloops in 1969 with the objective of maintaining a perpetual record of trophy class big game taken in British Columbia. Using the Boone & Crockett scoring system, the Club has scorers throughout the province for the convenience of hunters. Since 1982, directorship of the Club has been based on Vancouver Island.

The Club is dedicated to wildlife conservation, selective hunting and fair chase. Copies of the 6th edition Records Book are available from Wayne Zaccarelli (250-382-8502) or from Island Outfitters in Victoria.


