A DONATED .22 COOEY BOLT ACTION


The Victoria Fish and Game Club is the happy recipient of a sweet little 22, a Cooey bolt action single shot, donated to the club by Ron Hatch.

LIFE MEMBERSHIP AWARDED

The Victoria Fish and Game Protective Association awards, under exceptional circumstances, a lifetime membership to a member who has voluntarily served the club in an outstanding manner. This award allows the person chosen (including his/her spouse) access to all the club has to offer without the need to pay, ever again, annual membership fees. The number holding this distinction varies with the times but historically has been around ten. Generally the passing of a Life Member opens the possibility of another outstanding club member being awarded this distinction.

In recognition of a long and continuing service to the club, ART MOORE has been awarded the honour of LIFE MEMBER.

Art began his days on a Prairie farm where, to succeed, one has to be a master of many trades. His working (for pay) career culminated as Chief Engineer aboard chemical tankers. Over the years, Art has diligently applied his many talents to the planning, operation and maintenance of all things pertaining to trap shooting – from the computer programs required to keep track of all facets of competition to persuading the battery powered bird thrower to work for a little longer. A letter from a member of VFGPA for the past 18 years.

Dear Friends and Family,

This letter is extremely difficult for me to write. However, I feel the need for you to know my health situation.

I was born with Polycystic Kidney Disease (PKD) which until now has meant regular monitoring by various doctors and controlling my diet and blood pressure. This disease will eventually result in my complete kidney failure. I am presently on dialysis which I am discovering is essentially spending most of my time hooked up to a machine, either at home or in the hospital. Although dialysis will keep me alive, it will become my life.

I have been advised by my medical team that I have 12-24 months before my kidneys will completely shut down. It has been recommended that a living donor transplant be my best option to continue living a healthy life. The second option would be a deceased donor transplant which could take up to 5+ years, which I am on a waiting list for. As my blood type is O positive and the most in demand the wait could be much longer.

As my immediate family members are unable to donate a kidney to me I must reach out and ask for your help. I need to find someone who is willing to donate a kidney to me. I realize that what I am asking is an enormous sacrifice for anyone to consider. On the up side, we all have 2 kidneys and yet we only need one to live a normal, healthy life. For this reason, it is possible for people to donate one kidney. Outside of the risks associated with any surgery, donors do not typically experience negative health effects from donating a kidney.

If this request is one you would consider or know of someone who may consider this request or would like to know more please contact the donor team at St. Paul's Hospital in Vancouver. Phone: 604-806-9027 Email: donornurse@providencehealth.bc.ca They are experts in the field and can give you all the details on what is involved and what to expect if you are found to be a suitable donor. Your inquiries, as well as the process of determining your eligibility will be kept confidential. Donors are heavily supported and given the comfort of pulling out of the process at any time.

I do not wish to put pressure on anyone. However, I trust you will understand my situation and need to reach out. I recognize that your lives have their own complexities and that becoming an organ donor will not be in the realm of possibility for some of you. Please know that your friendship and moral support are more than enough!

For more basic information please log onto http://tranplant.bc.ca/living_kiney_main.htm A 3 - 4 inch lateral incision is now made just below the waist line in front rather than what is stated on the website. There is financial support for the donors to avoid costs such as hotel, flight to Vancouver and food. If for some reason the donor ends up needing a kidney transplant they go near the top of the list?

The Amalgamated Conservation Society is an umbrella organization representing currently ten fishing oriented associations involved in angling, conservation and enhancement and management of the resource. Our roots date back to 1954 and we have been operating continuously since then. The ACS was largely responsible for the formation of the Sport Fishing Advisory Board in 1964.

I have been directed to write this letter by our members who have expressed concern regarding the declining state of the aquatic environment at Elk Lake. Anecdotal evidence suggests that over the past couple years, fishing success has decreased. Angling effort has definitely declined based on my personal experience and that of other anglers within our member associations.

Algae blooms seem to be more numerous than in the past and their severity, as evidenced by the serious blue green algae bloom earlier this year, also appear to be increasing.

As you know, the situation has become significant enough that it was a major focus of the agenda at the April 24, 2012 meeting of the Elk/Beaver Lake Recreational Use Advisory Group.

There seems to be agreement that the main cause of the degrading water quality is nutrient loading, particularly with respect to phosphorous (phosphates). For the resident natural and enhanced/stocked populations of rainbow and cutthroat trout, the struggle during the period of lake stratification is to meet their oxygen and temperature requirements. Meeting these requirements is not easy when the oxygenated surface waters exceed their preferred temperature range. And, although the deeper waters meet the temperature requirements of the trout, they are anoxic or nearly devoid of oxygen.

While, regrettably, water sampling data is irregular and inconsistent and data consolidation is lacking, enough information appears to exist to put a plan in place to address the poor water quality situation presently existing at Elk-Beaver Lake.

Epps / Elk Lake Water Quality

Several questions come to mind that require answers:

- 1. While the addition of an aerator to induce artificial lake circulation would be beneficial, it is costly. Is this being considered?
- 2. Is the increased nutrient loading from phosphorous the result of new point sources within the watershed or the continual slow accumulation which has now reached saturation levels?
- 3. Are other lake rehabilitation or remediation techniques being considered? Some of these include dredging for nutrient control, nutrient inactivation/precipitation and biotic harvesting; among others.
- 4. Which government agency is the lead authority in monitoring and putting a plan in place to counteract the declining water quality?

The excessive eutrophication of lakes, as is occurring in Elk-Beaver Lake, is a serious problem. What is needed is a structured plan to protect, manage and rehabilitate this valued water body.


CHINOOK REGULATIONS:

DFO has set up three arbitrary Zones based on Chinook escapement to the Fraser River as determined by the Albion Test Fishery which started fishing April 25. To June 11, five (5) Chinook had been caught in the 8 inch mesh Chinook net. A further eight (8) Chinook had been caught in a multi panel net. Based on their number crunching, they estimate an escapement of 30,000 to 73,000 (median 47,060) which falls into Zone 2.

Zone 1 less than 30,000 2 Chinook; no wild over 85 cm. Zone 2 30,000 - 60,000 2 Chinook; only one over 67 cm.

Zone 3 over 60,000 2 Chinook over 45 cm.

After July 15, it is expected that the Chinook Fishery in this area will return to normal - i.e. 2 Chinook per day over 45 cm.




