October Greetings, fellow VFGPA members. Beginning of fall is a good time to tidy up some reminders / memory refreshers. Any that I miss now will be sent out as needed.



Range Safety Officer (RSO) Program

Latest news is that we now have a vest available at the Rifle/Pistol for you if you have to serve as a <u>non-trained RSO</u>. This is a definite possibility, as our Range Rules state:

"The first VFGPA member to arrive at the range will assume the responsibility of Acting Range Officer or if mutually agreed, the most experienced shooter who is a member may assume that task. The position of Acting Range Officer is to monitor safety procedures and ceasefires."

Of course, you knew this, didn't you ...because you've downloaded and familiarized yourself with the Range Rules at: http://vfgpa.org/uploads/Rules,%20Policies,%20Insurance,%20etc/VFGPA%20Range%20Rules.pdf?

The vest has been hung on a nail inside the R/P range to be used by the acting Range officer when a trained RSO is not present. If you don't see it, please check with the Caretaker/Manager. When you are done your shift and hand over range control, give the vest to the person who takes over, unless your successor is a trained RSO, sporting a new red & black vest & cap.

Range Safety Orientation

A second Orientation course, was presented Wednesday, Sept. 05 at the clubhouse. Six people attended, which brings our **total** of newly **Range-qualified** people to **20**. Since we presently have over 670 **new** memberships, most of which include extra family members, it's realistic to estimate that **over 800 people** still need to attend an Orientation in order qualify for Range access after January 01.



The South Vancouver Island Anglers' Coalition has recently been registered as a society. Following is an update from Chris Bos, one of the principals in the organization.

Being part of the angling community on south Vancouver Island, you well know we have witnessed our salt-water fishing opportunities decline considerably in the past decade. For a long time I have held strong feelings that we have to do something different and be more effective to avert any further decline. Back in mid-June Christopher Miller, Terry Anderson and I hosted an angling focus-group meeting about the challenges facing our year-round saltwater public fishery. At the meeting the three of us also made a presentation to the 20+ respected anglers who attended, outlining several lobbying-focused solutions. It is important to us that you know we are very grateful to all of you who attended our meeting.

The response we received at that meeting was unanimous; there is clearly an urgent need to organize a strong and effective *proactive* lobbying initiative to protect our local fisheries. Besides securing approval in principle at the meeting to move forward with the formalization of the South Vancouver Island Anglers Coalition, we also heard many valuable suggestions from the attendees. Since the meeting this advice has guided the three of us as we moved to establish our new lobbying-specific society.

So today, on behalf of Christopher and Terry, I want to provide this brief update on how things have progressed since the June meeting. I am pleased to report to you the following:

- A vision and a mission statement for guiding our lobbying efforts have been created;
- A comprehensive constitution and bylaws document has also been completed;
- Five willing and respected local anglers have been selected for the inaugural Board of Directors of the society (FYI: those five individuals are: Christoph Moch, Kelly Wagner, Gary Cooper, Tom Cole and Chris Bos);
- The South Vancouver Island Anglers Coalition *Society* has been officially registered and incorporated with the BC Registry Services branch;
- A bank account for the new society is in the process of being established;
- An angling issue questionnaire, to inform and ground-truth the development of a draft business plan for the society, is almost complete:
- A first rough draft of a three-year business plan has been prepared; and,
- A society fund-raiser and membership drive function is in the planning process (potentially to take place in mid to late September).

As noted above, Christopher, Terry and I are currently preparing an all-inclusive business plan to direct the society through its early stages. Once ready it will be presented to the new Board of Directors for discussion and approval. We really do respect the viewpoints and broad understanding of our fishery of all who were invited to and/or attended our June meeting. For that reason, the three of us invite you to continue to act as advice-givers, especially as we develop the business plan. Originally our thoughts were to hold a 20 to 30 person face-to-face visioning session but we realized that amassing a group of that size during the busy summer months would most likely be unachievable. However, we must start our proactive lobbying campaign as soon as possible, in order to positively influence the upcoming 2013 Area 19 and 20 fishing season. That's why we are asking you to read through and answer our angling questionnaire, which will be emailed to you in the near future, once it is ready. We do hope you will share your wisdom with us as a strong and widely supported lobbying action plan is developed, thus providing the new society with trusted and informed advice.

Christopher, Terry and I are confident you are pleased with our progress so far and anticipate you will continue to support our efforts as we build a formidable lobbying organization. By uniting our knowledge, expertise and resources, we are confident the new society can pressure government to re-establish and maintain our important local fisheries and be a strong voice for abundant wild fish populations.

VICTORIA FISH & GAME ANNUAL BIG GAME COMPETITION

Hunters are reminded that Blacktail deer taken in MU 1-1 through 1-13 by Victoria Fish & Game members are eligible for the five trophies available each year. Deer must be field dressed which means that the heart, liver and kidneys (edible portions) are the only internal organs which can be included when the animal is weighed. Deer must be weighed on Club scales by the caretaker or his designate.

The official weigher reserves the right to refuse weighing any deer which arrives in an unpresentable condition. Lungs must be removed and body cavity wiped dry with a rag or paper towels. Deer 160 pounds and over taken with a rifle and 140 pounds and over taken by bow and arrow must be witnessed by an executive member at time of weighing. Please contact the Club caretaker or Wayne Zaccarelli to make arrangements.


Gold, silver and bronze buttons are awarded in both rifle and bow & arrow classes for deer in the following weight categories:

PROPOSED ROWING FACILTY ON LANGFORD LAKE

The following letter from the Amalgamated Conservation Society, in response to a proposal to build a rowing facility on Langford Lake, was sent to Langford Parks Department via e-mail on August 20.

In response to widespread opposition from anglers, in particular, and lakeside residents, the City of Langford issued a letter dated August 21 as follows:

"Council instructed the applicant (St. Michael's University) to consult with residents on Langford Lake regarding the proposed rowing facility. This consultation process revealed that 2 out of every 3 residents were not in favor of the proposal. Therefore, the City will not proceed with the proposed rowing facility on Langford Lake. Thank you for participating in this democratic process."

The Amalgamated Conservation Society is an umbrella organization representing currently ten fishing oriented associations involved in angling, conservation, enhancement and management of the resource. Our roots date back to 1954 and we have been operating continuously since then. The ACS was largely responsible for the formation of the Sport Fishing Advisory Board in 1964.

We have recently been made aware of a joint proposal by the City of Langford and St. Michael's University School to build a rowing centre on Langford Lake. Budget documents of the City of Langford show \$350,000 in donations (presumably from SMUS) and \$300,000 reserve funds from Langford. Brochures describing the proposal note that the facility will be built by St. Michael's University School.

Our members oppose the construction of this private facility in a public park. The ACS believes that Langford Lake is too small to accommodate organized, competitive rowing. If this facility is built it will result in an increased number of schools, and increased number of hours per day with rowing use and probably year round as well. As has been the case on Elk Lake, other lake user groups will be negatively impacted.

We are concerned that coach/spotter boats which are being proposed to operate with electric motors will not be fast enough nor powerful enough to effectively carry out a rescue. Because the lake is currently restricted to electric motors only, the ACS would be opposed to any exemption for rower coach boats. We are also concerned regarding the excessive noise emanating from loud hailers used by the coach boats and/or coxswains. The Amalgamated Conservation Society is sure that the wildlife, lake residents and other lake users would also be upset with any such disturbance to the tranquility they currently experience.



Rowing is inherently unsafe as rowers proceed at a high rate of speed, blindly. They are rowing in a direction in which they are unable to safely travel. The situation at Elk Lake is such that numerous collisions, and countless near misses, have occurred over the years. This is a direct result of the Victoria Rowing Society facility at Eagle Beach which has resulted in significant growth in rowing activity and a subsequent increase in the number of rowing caused incidents.


The ACS is vehemently opposed to the installation of permanent rowing course lanes as this would be disruptive to many other lake users. It also would create safety issues with the public recreational use of the lake. We would also be against the restriction of the public's right to use the lake in order to conduct a rowing regatta or other such event.

The Amalgamated Conservation Society is concerned that, should this rowing facility be built, the resultant rowing activity could lead to a decline in other lake recreational use - particularly fishing. In recent years this has begun to happen on Elk Lake. It would be a shame were this to happen on Langford Lake, especially in light of the installation of a new lake water aerator on August 19. This approximately \$260,000 project is for the principal benefit of trout and the angling community. The Freshwater Fisheries Society of B.C. stocks Langford Lake several times per year with Rainbow trout from their Duncan trout hatchery. Freshwater anglers contribute in excess of 50% of their license fees annually to this worthwhile program.

The ACS finds it regrettable that the City of Langford did not consult lake users, the local residents or the public prior to including this proposal within its budget documents. This apparent lack of transparency is not conducive to getting either user group or local resident support for the project. We also note that no public meeting is being contemn-plated. A public meeting should be required.

LANGFORD LAKE AERATOR

The City of Langford recently installed a new, larger lake aerator in Langford Lake. The new unit, weighing 12000 pounds, was placed with the aid of a helicopter on August 19. The cost of the unit and its installation was valued at \$260,000. This aerator replaces an older unit which was not large enough and which had operating problems.

The new aerator will improve water quality through the summer by inducing artificial lake circulation during times of the year when the lake waters are normally stratified. This will increase oxygen levels in the hypolimnion (deeper waters below the thermo cline) which will be a significant benefit to the resident trout.
