B.C. Wildlife Federation Notes

Kid's Camp

Next year Kid's Camp will be held in Courtenay at the Courtenay Fish and Game Club.

The dates are July 22 to 25, 2013 and the camp is open to any child of a VFGPA member between the ages of 10 and 14. The camp is free but parents must arrange transportation to and from Courtenay.

Parents who are interested in volunteering at the camp are most welcome.

The BCWF is looking to purchase wall tents for the camp as rental of such is one of the major expenses. If anyone has knowledge of a source of good tents for sale at a good price (or, even better, donated) please call me.

BCWF Annual AGM/Convention

The AGM/Convention will be held in Richmond at the Radisson Hotel on April 25 to 27, 2013. The VFGPA sponsors members who are willing to attend as delegates.

The cost of putting on the AGM is substantial and only about ½ of this cost is recovered from delegate registrations. As BCWF business uses only a small fraction of the total AGM/Convention time, it will be proposed that the Convention part be held every second year. An AGM must be held every year under the Societies Act.

B.C. Ferries

B.C. Ferries does not allow foot passengers to carry properly cased, legal long guns on their ferries on all routes other than the Port Hardy – Prince Rupert and the Prince Rupert – Skidegate runs. This practice is discriminatory and counter to what is allowed by most Canadian ferry services. The BCWF plans to meet with B.C. Ferries to discuss this issue in an effort to develop an acceptable protocol for such transport.

Legal Defence Fund

This fund was set up by the BCWF several years ago to provide monies to hire lawyers to present and defend the position of the BCWF on issues deemed by the BCWF to be pertinent to its interests. The monies could only be spent to hire lawyers and native issues were a focus. The fund was not well supported by member clubs as both the means to affect change and eligible issues were limited.

A new fund will be created (with a new but, as yet, undecided name) which will be used to support any means required to meet recognized BCWF objectives. The BCWF will be able to issue tax receipts for donations to the fund.

As there is a significant number of issues that adversely affect BCWF members and which must be addressed as soon as possible, Zone 1 of the BCWF (Vancouver Island) is going to recommend that BCWF member dues be increased by \$2.00 in the year 2014 and be in effect for the following 3 years. All these monies would go to the fund.

Hunters

The Provincial Ministry has made or is considering the following changes:

Geese – the bag limits and possession limits have been increased on Canada geese in Region 1.

Elk – it is proposed to end the elk season on an earlier date.

- consideration is being given to issue an elk permit to a guide/outfitter. Some native bands want to auction their elk permits to hunters and/or guides. The BCWF wildlife committee want the auction limited to guide/outfitters only.

Access

The BCWF is working diligently to increase the access to lands – eg. Outdoor Passport.

On Vancouver Island, access is a particularly thorny issue as 90%+ of the land is privately owned. Timber companies are the principal holders with Timber West being one of the largest. Timber West refuses to allow public use /access to any of its roads and logged areas on account of a perceived liability if a user is injured while on company lands. What if the lands were posted? This loss of recreational area is very significant and affects many more the just BCWF members. Access to the Comox Glacier is effectively denied to hikers – both local and tourist – by Timber West.

Salmon Enhancement

This has been a bumper year for Coho returns to local rivers with many systems experiencing record escapements. Shawnigan Creek has had over 5000 Coho, each of which has had to be physically lifted over the falls near the mouth and trucked to release sites along the creek. It is estimated that 25 tons of Coho have been handled this fall by volunteers. This is an introduced run of fish originally started with Goldstream stock. The waterfalls are an impassable barrier to Coho without the assistance of enhancement volunteers.

Goldstream has had over 1000 Coho and the fence/trap has been taken out because of high water. They have enough Coho for their brood stock at the Howard English Goldstream Hatchery.

Colquitz has been picking up in the latter part of November and is now well over 100 fish - still not a great return, but much better than it was looking only a few short weeks ago.

Craigflower Creek has had a record return with well over 1100 to the end of November. The new counting fence had two different days of just under and over 300 fish. The trap was checked three times a day when the fish were moving through. This should produce a good amount of fry which are now able to survive through the summer now that water flows have been secured from Thetis and Pike Lakes.

The Victoria Sport Fishing Advisory Committee met on November 14. Here are some of the important items addressed.

- In November 2009, the Committee on the Status of Endangered Wildlife in Canada (COSEWIC) assessed Quillback Rockfish as "Threatened". This species is now being considered for listing as "Threatened" under Schedule 1 of the Species at Risk Act (SARA). If listed, general prohibitions protecting the species would apply. Commercial and recreational fisheries are the principal threats. Quillbacks are one of 96 species of rockfish found in the north Pacific. They are classed as "inshore" rockfish found primarily at depths of less than 200 metres.
- The current regulations for the recreational Coho fishery, with reduced limits and targeting fin-clipped hatchery fish, are not working. There is a large percentage of unmarked 'wild' fish within the total pool of Coho available. This results in the release of large numbers of 'wild' fish before a clipped 'hatchery' Coho is caught. There is an associated mortality with these releases which is unacceptable to many anglers. Any anglers feel that less damage would be done if you were able to retain the first two Coho caught, regardless of whether it is clipped or not. DFO is awaiting the outcome of a report on the Coho fishery before proposing any restructuring.
- Options were discussed for the 2013 sport halibut fishery, with a view to returning to an 11 month opening, February to December, which traditionally was the case. The fishery closed on September 9, 2012 when our total allowable catch was reached. Our allowable catch for 2013 will not be set until after the International Pacific Halibut Commission (IPHC) meets in January. There was support for an annual limit of 5 to 10 halibut, although what impact this would have on our collective catch was unknown. There was also support for varying the possession limit in-season from two (Feb-Jun) to one (Jul-Dec), with a possible return to two after summer if our catch was still below target limit.
- Election of a chairman and vice-chairman was conducted with Chris Bos being returned as chairman and Tom Cole returned as vice-chair. Both these individuals represent the Victoria area at the Sport Fishing Advisory Board meetings.

BIG GAME COMPETITION / RECORDS BOOKS

Blacktail deer antlers from deer taken during the 2012 hunting season within Region1 (Vancouver Island) will be accepted until January 31, 2013 for entry in the largest antlers competition.

Entries for the Black bear trophy (skull only) will be accepted until January 31, 2013 as well. Again, this is for bears harvested in Region 1 during the spring and fall 2012 hunting seasons.

Trophy winners for all categories will be announced in the club newsletter prior to the annual general meeting in March, at which time trophies and buttons will be presented.

Copies of the eighth edition (2010) of the Vancouver Island Columbian Blacktail Deer Records are available at a cost of \$5 each. The issue contains a brief history of the records which were started in 1972 by Byron Mason and Charles Veasey. Byron has written another excellent article on the history of hunting on Vancouver Island from 1900 to 1920. The previous seventh edition (2000) contained Byron's piece on Blacktail deer populations and hunting on Vancouver Island from 1843 to 1899.

The current records list 1824 entries scoring 100 or more Boone & Crockett points. Several old hunting photographs have been reproduced for the first time in the records booklet.

The most recent sixth edition (2010) of the Big Game Records of British Columbia is available for \$35 each. These are hard cover books containing records of all native big game species in B.C. Hunting stories, photographs and a listing, by species category, of entries meeting the minimum score requirements, are included.

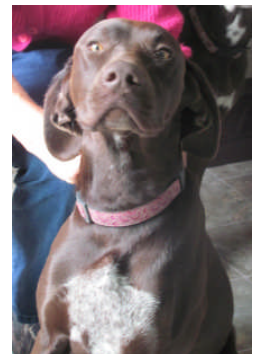

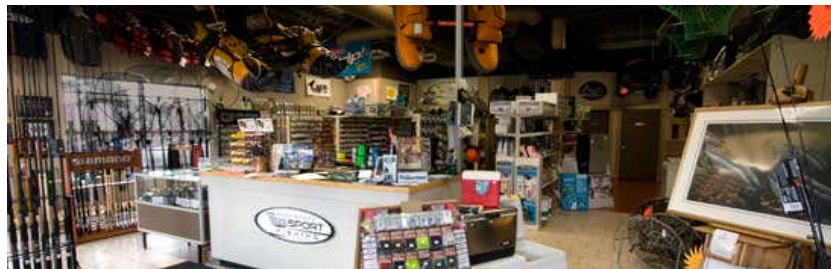

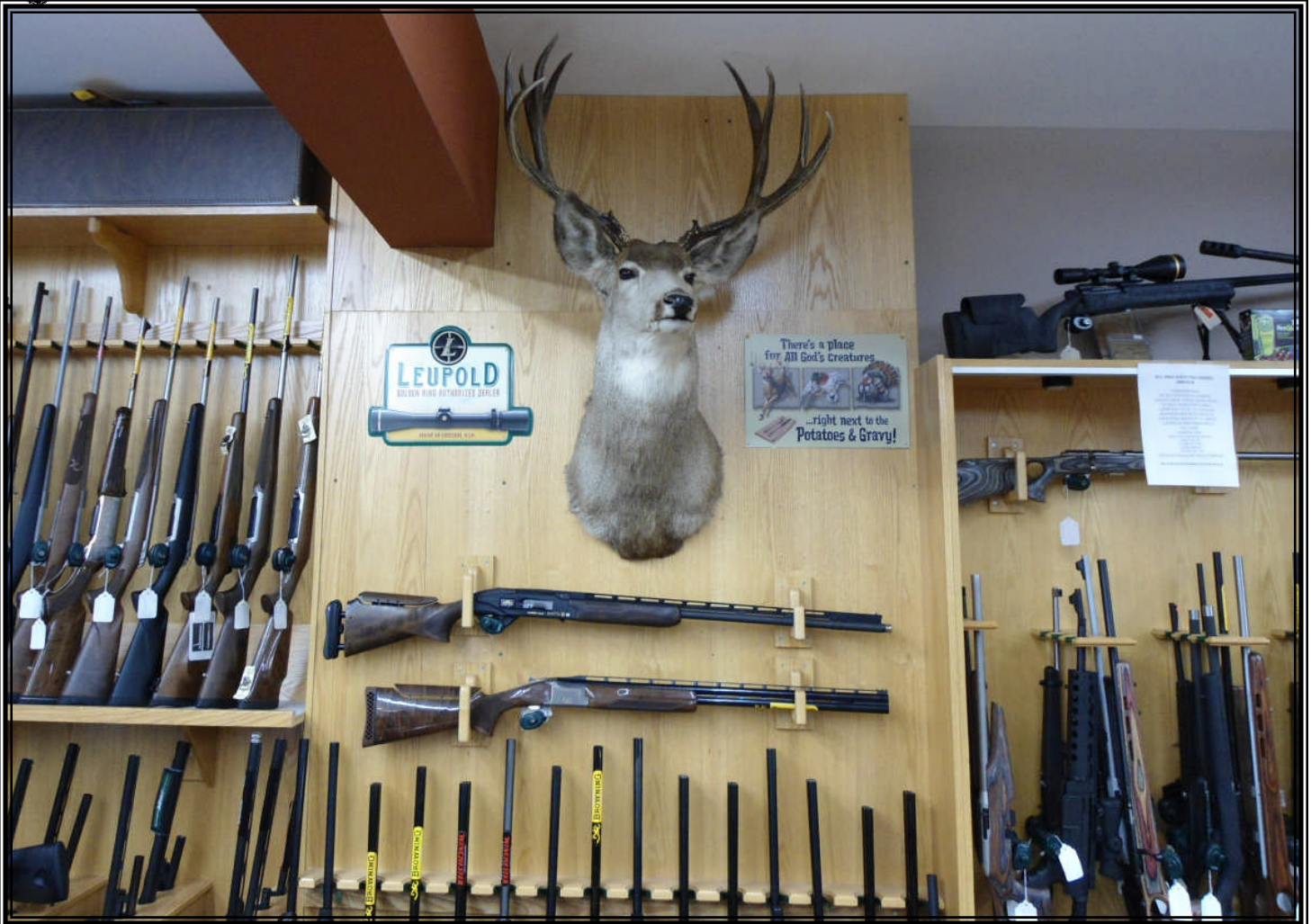
