#### Victoria Fish & Game 2013 Game Dinner

Well, I have some good and bad news for all about our club's 2013 Game Dinner which will be held on March 2<sup>nd</sup> at the Olympic View Golf Club on Latoria Road again. After announcing that I was drafting a "pre-sales" list for our Game Dinner tickets at the club's December "Christmas Social Meeting" at Strawberry Vale Hall, and then making a few phone calls and sending some emails to the ticket holders from last year's event we are now totally sold out (all 200 tickets) and we have a "cancellation" list started. (Last year's event was a huge success and it also sold out early, so many people had contacted me early this year to ensure that they booked tickets for this year's event.) I am truly sorry that we cannot accommodate more than 200 diners for this year's event, but the venue is limited to that maximum number and we are very hesitant to move the dinner to a new location. Olympic View have been terrific hosts to us, and Mel O'Brian (their head chef) and his capable kitchen crew have served us amazing dinners every year.

If you didn't already talk to me about Game Dinner tickets at the December Meeting, or by phone or email, and you haven't already arranged for your "pre-sale tickets" for this year's dinner you could still contact me and have your name added to our "cancellation" list just in case any of the pre-sold tickets are cancelled and become available before the event in March. Having said that and whether you will be attending the dinner or not, we could still use your very generous contributions of game meat or seafood to be used on this year's dinner menu. We would appreciate game meat of any type, with roasts in the 10 pound range being ideal for the chefs to cook for a large group such as we will have. Stew meat or ground meat would also be gratefully accepted for use in "Shepherd's Pie" and other similar dishes. Last year's menu included various preparations of Moose, Elk, Caribou, Cougar, Fallow, Mule and Whitetail Deer, Salmon, Halibut, Prawns, and Oysters, and we are hoping to repeat most of those offerings and possibly add a few more.

If you would like to make a donation of goods or services to add to our prize pool for this event we would love to hear from you too. This year's prize pool is shaping up to be even better than last years event, with 3 Thompson Center rifles in our "Top Gun" raffle draw, a variety of general, outdoors, fishing and hunting related goods (valued at thousands of dollars so far), plus an archery package. This year we will have another 50/50 cash draw (which totaled about \$600.00 to last year's winner), plus our "Top Gun" rifle draw (with 3 separate draws for 3 separate TC rifles), plus some dinner ticket number draw prizes, and our regular raffle ticket "Bucket" prize draws. This is the VF&GPA's largest fundraising event for the year and thanks to the generosity of last year's prize donors and to the enthusiasm of last year's dinner attendees we ended that dinner with a net profit to our club of over \$5,000.00!






#### **NEW YEAR'S DAY TRAP FUN SHOOT & POTLUCK LUNCH**



#### **Elk Lake Navigational Buoys**

Hello Tim:

I have just read the draft minutes of the September 13 meeting of the Elk/Beaver Lake Recreational Use Advisory Group. I, and the members of the Amalgamated Conservation Society, are concerned about the following statement under New Business. "R. Olsen stated that the navigational buoys had been moved significantly and that he attempted to inform the Office of Boating Safety. He finally was in touch with Tim McCann who stated that he would be contacting Regional Parks."

I visited Elk Lake on November 08 to follow up on complaints I received regarding rowing courses on the lake. A sign at the lake noted Rowing Canada National Championships November 09-11. However, I did note that many of the navigational buoys appeared to have been both moved and removed.

As you probably know, this has happened many times over the years and has been raised at the EBLRUAG and by myself in letters to the various authorities. The Victoria Rowing Society and Rowing Canada have specifically been warned about this and informed that this will no longer be tolerated. And yet, it continues unabated. There seems to be no deterrents to prevent these people from deliberately defying instructions, permits, regulations and the law.

Our members are concerned that the area enclosed within these buoys appears to be shrinking over the years. I can remember this area being noticeably larger twenty years ago. We are therefore concerned that these buoys are not being replaced in the correct positions, not by error, but by design.

Have you contacted Regional Parks yet and what were you able to determine regarding this situation? The ACS would like to know what is going on here.

#### **BIG GAME COMPETITION / RECORDS BOOKS**

Blacktail deer antlers from deer taken during the 2012 hunting season within Region1 (Vancouver Island) will be accepted until January 31, 2013 for entry in the largest antlers competition.

Entries for the Black bear trophy (skull only) will be accepted until January 31, 2013 as well. Again, this is for bears harvested in Region 1 during the spring and fall 2012 hunting seasons.

Trophy winners for all categories will be announced in the club newsletter prior to the annual general meeting in March, at which time trophies and buttons will be presented.

Copies of the eighth edition (2010) of the Vancouver Island Columbian Blacktail Deer Records are available at a cost of \$5 each. The issue contains a brief history of the records which were started in 1972 by Byron Mason and Charles Veasey. Byron has written another excellent article on the history of hunting on Vancouver Island from 1900 to 1920. The previous seventh edition (2000) contained Byron's piece on Blacktail deer populations and hunting on Vancouver Island from 1843 to 1899.

The current records list 1824 entries scoring 100 or more Boone & Crockett points. Several old hunting photographs have been reproduced for the first time in the records booklet.

The most recent sixth edition (2010) of the Big Game Records of British Columbia is available for \$35 each. These are hard cover books containing records of all native big game species in B.C. Hunting stories, photographs and a listing, by species category, of entries meeting the minimum score requirements, are included.




