**From a Local Canadian Firearms Safety Course Instructor with 18 years experience,
(trained in 1993 for these courses)**

SHORTEST IS NOT ALWAYS THE BEST !!

I am always talking to people that want the quickest/shortest way to get their P.A.L. License.

The question students should be asking is. "What is the LONGEST COURSE that will prepare me to be the safest shooter using my firearm of choice?"

It is possible to pass the basic test and still not have the confidence to be shooting safely. I have told numerous students over the years that, "Yes, you have passed the BASIC REQUIREMENTS of the test but if you were shooting beside me somewhere I would be very nervous". You should strive to have more than the basic requirements.

When you are looking for a P.A.L. course you should be asking very specific questions:

1. How Long is the course? (there are minimum standards for each course that don't include testing times, the courses are supposed to be TWO days long - EACH).
2. How many hours of handling practice do you provide? (1/2 hr. or 4 hrs.?)
3. Is it taught according to the Federal National Standard?
4. How many students are in the class? (recommended class size per Instructor is 10 only, using 5 non-restricted de-activated firearms and 3 restricted de-activated firearms: break, bolt, pump, lever, semi-auto rifles, single action, double action and semi-auto handguns)

Additional nice to know:

- *Do you use an overhead projector? or PowerPoint Presentation? Visual Aids, Flip Charts, manuals, Videos, handouts?
- *Lunch and coffee breaks? (attention span for most adults is 15-20 min.) If you are too tired or the day is too long you won't remember what you have learned.
- *Do you provide the 2 manuals Non-Restricted and Restricted?
- *Are the test included in the Price? (What happens if I fail a Test?)

Instructors ARE NOT allowed to allow challenges of the course by writing the 2 or 4 tests unless you have actual experience handling the 5 main action types of firearms that are used.

The Coordinator of the Canadian Firearms Safety Course Program in British Columbia is located in Prince George. If you want her telephone number or e-mail you can call the toll free number for the Firearms Center in Canada 1-800-731-4000. They will connect you to the Chief Firearms Officer's Office of the Province in Surrey and give you the information, or answer any of your questions concerning the Firearms Safety Program in B.C.

WHY WOULD YOU WANT TO GO TO THE RANGE UNPREPARED? Proper, complete training is important. Do you want to be shooting beside someone that has not been trained properly? Those are the questions you should be asking yourself when you are contacting Instructors about training courses.

PLEASE, current Firearm Users, make sure your sons, daughters, spouses, girlfriends, boyfriends are trained PROPERLY before entry into the shooting sports. It will benefit all of us. Training is important.

BIG GAME COMPETITION / RECORDS BOOKS

Trophy winners for all categories will be announced in the club newsletter prior to the annual general meeting in March, at which time trophies and buttons will be presented.

Copies of the eighth edition (2010) of the Vancouver Island Columbian Blacktail Deer Records are available at a cost of \$5 each. The issue contains a brief history of the records which were started in 1972 by Byron Mason and Charles Veasey. Byron has written another excellent article on the history of hunting on Vancouver Island from 1900 to 1920. The previous seventh edition (2000) contained Byron's piece on Blacktail deer populations and hunting on Vancouver Island from 1843 to 1899.

The current records list 1824 entries scoring 100 or more Boone & Crockett points. Several old hunting photographs have been reproduced for the first time in the records booklet.

The most recent sixth edition (2010) of the Big Game Records of British Columbia is available for \$35 each. These are hard cover books containing records of all native big game species in B.C. Hunting stories, photographs and a listing, by species category, of entries meeting the minimum score requirements, are included.


