Think about it and let the Volunteer Telephone Committee Chair know when you are available and how your special talent/skill can support the Club.


Just a thought:



Canadian Girl Guides "Introduction to Shooting" Event

On Saturday March 24th the Victoria Fish & Game hosted 13 girls from the Canadian Girl Guides "Trek" program plus several of their CGG leaders for an "Introduction to Shooting" down on our MP range. This event was actually quite some time in the making as Myrna Francis had been trying to arrange a suitable date with them to do this for a very long time! Finally a workable date was found when their group could make it up and we had available space on the MP range to accommodate them. Unfortunately Myrna came down with an absolutely vicious cold a day or so before the planned event and had to turn it over to Dave Gerow, Tristan Baty, Catherine Fryer, and Al & Laurie Page to plan and oversee on her behalf.

The girls ranged from about 10 to middle teens and from "small to tall"! After a meet and greet and a basic safety instructional meeting we took them out onto two bays of the MP range and had them shooting some of our club's S&W K-22 target revolvers, a few .22 semi-auto pistols, plus some .22 bolt action and semi-auto rifles. (They especially liked shooting the little "James Bond" gun ... a Walther PPK in .22 LR) As their skills improved we let them try shooting some suspended clay targets with .22's and for the more adventurous girls a 12 gauge pump shotgun!

Everyone had a great time learning how to shoot safely and at the end of the day when asked if they'd like to come back to do it again another time the answer was a unanimous "YES"!

Our thanks to Dave, Tristan, Al and Laurie for hosting this event for the Canadian Girl Guides and for supplying many of their personal guns for the girls to try out. Many thanks to Myrna Francis for arranging for the Canadian Girl Guides to come and be our guests for this event (even if she couldn't make it out to the event for herself!) 

REPRESENTING ORGANIZED ANGLERS ON SOUTHERN VANCOUVER ISLAND

HISTORICAL / OPERATIONAL BACKGROUNDER - 2013

The Amalgamated Conservation Society has operated continuously since 1954 and was largely responsible for the formation of the Sport Fishing Advisory Board in 1964. The ACS served as a member until 1997 when restructuring eliminated this seat. We continue with our member clubs participating as the main component of the Victoria Sport Fishing Advisory Committee formed on September 18, 1996. Chris Bos (778-426-4141) currently chairs the Committee. Both Chris and Tom Cole represent the local committee at Sport Fishing Advisory Board meetings.

The Amalgamated Conservation Society has been involved with the Department of Fisheries & Oceans for close to 60 years in analyzing their management and regulation of the Pacific Coast fisheries.

Members became so concerned regarding problems affecting the fisheries resources and the sport fishery, that in February 1963 they drafted and sent a brief to the then Minister of Fisheries, J. Angus MacLean.

The ACS not only talked about the problems plaguing the fish resources and various fisheries, but did, and continues to do, something about it. Members pioneered small stream public involvement projects in aid of salmonid enhancement in the early 1970's - years before the advent of the Salmonid Enhancement Program (SEP) in 1976. Direction from the early years until 1990 came from enhancement pioneer Howard English who served as the ACS Projects Coordinator.

A newly constructed mini-hatchery and fry rearing facility became operational in the late fall of 1982. The ACS and its member clubs have reared Chinook salmon fry in net pens since 1989. Stream enhancement work, spawner and smolt enumeration and fry satelliting to other south Vancouver Island streams continues.

To replace the dedicated effort of long time projects coordinator Howard English, who passed away in June of 1991, the Goldstream Volunteer Salmonid Enhancement Association was formed. The GVSEA operates under the umbrella of the ACS and is one of our member clubs.

The ACS currently operates with its ten member organizations within the Capital Regional District of southern Vancouver Island, as follows:

BIG GAME COMPETITION / RECORDS BOOKS

Copies of the eighth edition (2010) of the Vancouver Island Columbian Blacktail Deer Records are available at a cost of \$5 each. The issue contains a brief history of the records which were started in 1972 by Byron Mason and Charles Veasey. Byron has written another excellent article on the history of hunting on Vancouver Island from 1900 to 1920. The previous seventh edition (2000) contained Byron's piece on Blacktail deer populations and hunting on Vancouver Island from 1843 to 1899.

The current records list 1824 entries scoring 100 or more Boone & Crockett points. Several old hunting photographs have been reproduced for the first time in the records booklet.

The most recent sixth edition (2010) of the Big Game Records of British Columbia is available for \$35 each. These are hard cover books containing records of all native big game species in B.C. Hunting stories, photographs and a listing, by species category, of entries meeting the minimum score requirements, are included.


