A big THANKS to Chris Jones for showing up with his trusty camera. What a stroke of luck for the club to have this recorded by Chris!

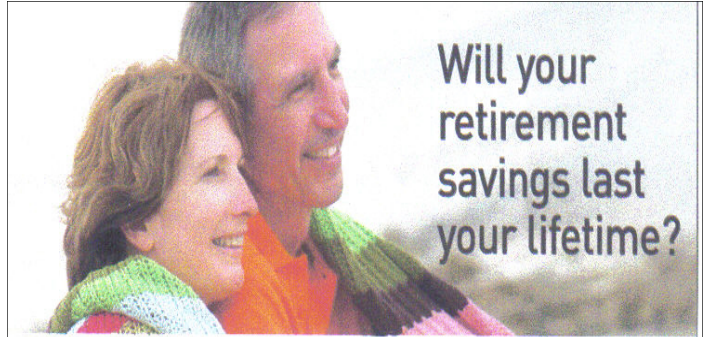

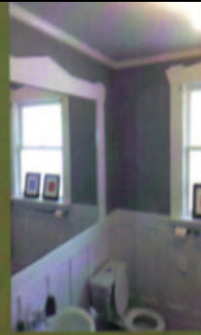

LOBBYING FOR YOUR FISHERIES

The **South Vancouver Island Anglers Coalition** (SVIAC) is a non-profit society formed by a passionate group of concerned anglers to ensure that there will be ample fish and recreational fishing opportunities for generations to come. SVIAC's mission is not to diminish in any way the valiant efforts of existing organizations, who've worked hard to achieve similar goals. Rather, we are committed to *breaking new ground* and *forming effective alliances* in our goal to *organize & tap* the awesome might of our recreational fishing community into a cohesive, well-managed advocacy and lobby group. Our purpose is to successfully pressure and influence government at all levels into protecting and rebuilding our highly-valued public fisheries, as well as ensuring abundant healthy populations of fish for our fisheries.

Why Are We Doing This Now?

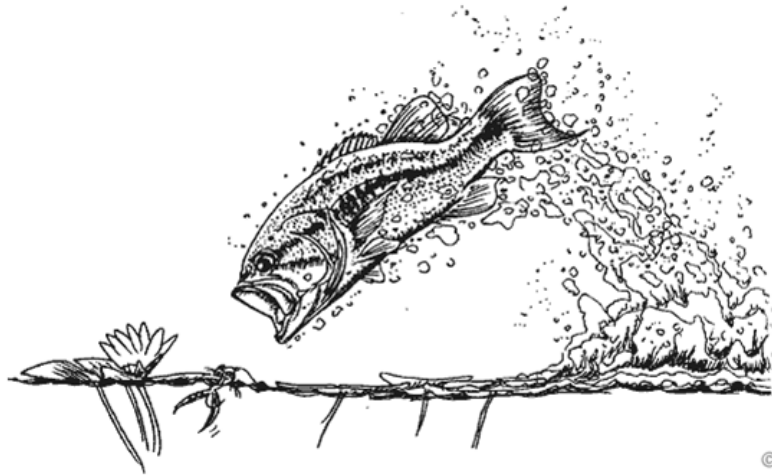
Because our once vibrant year-round regulation free public fishery has been seriously harmed by Fisheries and Oceans Canada's (FOC) detrimental management and policy. The sound principled advice offered by the local committee of the Sport Fishing Advisory Board is largely being ignored. Excessively restrictive spring and summer Chinook salmon fishing regulations have decimated access to abundant US origin hatchery Chinook. The unfair allocation of the Pacific Halibut resource has led to a loss of six months of fishing in our local waters. With their budget gutted and their capacity severely reduced, FOC makes no meaningful enhancement or recovery effort for Chinook salmon stocks of concern.

What Will We Do?

Through proactive, well-funded methodical lobbying we will hold government to account. We will press hard to protect Canadians' fishing rights and fair access to fish. We will pressure government relentlessly to ensure there are abundant healthy fish populations. We will educate the government at all levels as well as the general public about the historic, social and economic value angling brings to South Vancouver Island.

Simply put South Vancouver Island Anglers Coalition's purpose is to become an especially powerful lobby group that will work tirelessly on YOUR behalf, to protect and rebuild YOUR fisheries. In addition SVIAC will pressure government to meaningfully conserve and restore the fish populations' key to our important and valued public fisheries.

BIG GAME COMPETITION / RECORDS BOOKS

Copies of the eighth edition (2010) of the Vancouver Island Columbian Blacktail Deer Records are available at a cost of \$5 each. The issue contains a brief history of the records which were started in 1972 by Byron Mason and Charles Veasey. Byron has written another excellent article on the history of hunting on Vancouver Island from 1900 to 1920. The previous seventh edition (2000) contained Byron's piece on Blacktail deer populations and hunting on Vancouver Island from 1843 to 1899.

The current records list 1824 entries scoring 100 or more Boone & Crockett points. Several old hunting photographs have been reproduced for the first time in the records booklet.

The most recent sixth edition (2010) of the Big Game Records of British Columbia is available for \$35 each. These are hard cover books containing records of all native big game species in B.C. Hunting stories, photographs and a listing, by species category, of entries meeting the minimum score requirements, are included.
