From the President.

Hello Everyone, I hope your enjoying the great weather we are having, lets hope it last till Christmas.

At the Executive/Directors Meeting on August 6th the issue of people not signing in or purchasing a day pass was discussed.

A reminder that anyone on the range property for whatever reason must sign in and out. (includes members, family members on a family pass, Police, Sheriffs, Armored Car, Peace Officers, visitors attending matches, people just fishing, etc).

Our Membership is approaching close to 2700 members and we are seeing around 2000 people use the range each month.

A decision was voted on and approved by the board to the effect: Any non-member on the property that has not signed in properly or purchased a day pass will be told to leave the property for the rest of the day (they will not have the choice of signing in or purchasing a day pass after the fact).

This we hope will solve the problem, members will remind there guest/family members that they have to sign in and out when on the property and purchase the appropriate "Day Use Pass".

The reasons for this policy include:

- 1) use of the range facilities by non-members who have not purchased a range pass is effectively theft from the members;
- 2) it is not fair to the members that they not be able to use a range because it is being used by someone who has not paid;
- 3) the purchase of the day pass provides liability coverage for users of the range;
- 4) signing in enhances safety for all users of the property."

VICTORIA WOMEN'S POTLUCK TRAP SHOOT



11th Birthday Party at Victoria Fish & Game

Each year, we aim to give our daughters a special memorable birthday experience. For Hannah's 11th, we started with a simple question, "Would you like to go camping with a few of your classmates and do some shooting and archery?" The excited response was not unexpected.

I anticipated that some of the parents would not be open to this idea (and I was right!), but I figured enough would be to make it worthwhile. The invitational email included a number of safety details (ie. that I would provide the necessary eye and ear protection) as well as a number of club and federal safety requirements.

What was initially thought of being 6 or so friends turned into 12 along with 6 additional adults. I didn't expect the overwhelming interest and support for this kind of activity.

We set up our camp, completed a safety rules orientation, and a description of the planned competition in each category. Then we headed to the archery range. We had two sets of archers going with a designated "safety" who stood back observing the one-on-one instruction being given.



The standard campfire with hotdogs and marshmallows dinner was enjoyed. The evening ended with some pyrotechnics from an old and forgotten collection of fireworks from when they could be legally purchased just before Halloween.

The next morning, after a bacon and french toast breakfast, we reviewed the rules including "the Vital 4." They remembered these from the night before, because they were told it is no longer taught after it was brought to some bureaucrat's attention that combining the first letter of each spelled "ANAL." I'm not sure this is the true reason but the kids sure liked and remembered it. They also knew I was quite anal about adhering to those four rules!





We then headed to the rifle and pistol range which had a small section conveniently taped off for our use. Each experienced a .22 lever action, a .22 bolt action, a .30-30 Winchester, and a SKS. For most of these kids – this was their first experience ever shooting a real gun. We ran out of time and never got to the restricted firearms nor any black powder as the Freshwater Fisheries Society of BC was offering a free fishing orientation at Frog's Hallow. This was a welcome couple hour reprieve for the adults before our final event of hawk and knife at the practice block.

Scores in each event were tallied and awards were handed out. We then packed up and headed home.

Of course our intention was to provide our daughters and friends a great experience, but one thing that really made it special for me came from the "thank you" feedback and comments afterwards, like Sam's, "I really learnt how to respect rifles and guns..."

This is coming from our future shooters. Let's encourage them all the way.







VICTORIA FISH & GAME ANNUAL BIG GAME COMPETITION

Hunters are reminded that Blacktail deer taken in MU 1-1 through 1-13 by Victoria Fish & Game members are eligible for the five trophies available each year. Deer must be field dressed which means that the heart, liver and kidneys (edible portions) are the only internal organs which can be included when the animal is weighed. Deer must be weighed on Club scales by the caretaker or his designate.

The official weigher reserves the right to refuse weighing any deer which arrives in an unpresentable condition. Lungs must be removed and body cavity wiped dry with a rag or paper towels. Deer 160 pounds and over taken with a rifle and 140 pounds and over taken by bow and arrow must be witnessed by an executive member at time of weighing.

Gold, silver and bronze buttons are awarded in both rifle and bow & arrow classes for deer in the following weight categories:

Bronze	140 - 159 ½ lb	120 - 139 ½ lb

In addition, the Victoria Fish & Game Bear trophy is awarded annually for the largest Black bear taken by a Club member. Boone & Crockett Club scoring is used to determine the largest entry. Boundaries are again MU 1-1 through 1-13.

BIG GAME COMPETITION / RECORDS BOOKS

Copies of the eighth edition (2010) of the Vancouver Island Columbian Blacktail Deer Records are available at a cost of \$5 each. The issue contains a brief history of the records which were started in 1972 by Byron Mason and Charles Veasey. Byron has written another excellent article on the history of hunting on Vancouver Island from 1900 to 1920. The previous seventh edition (2000) contained Byron's piece on Blacktail deer populations and hunting on Vancouver Island from 1843 to 1899.

The current records list 1824 entries scoring 100 or more Boone & Crockett points. Several old hunting photographs have been reproduced for the first time in the records booklet.

The most recent sixth edition (2010) of the Big Game Records of British Columbia is available for \$35 each. These are hard cover books containing records of all native big game species in B.C. Hunting stories, photographs and a listing, by species category, of entries meeting the minimum score requirements, are included.

CWF/BCWF 'LEGACY FOOTPRINT PROJECT' TO RELOCATE AND RECONSTRUCT COLQUITZ FISH COUNTING FENCE

As part of the Canadian Wildlife Federation AGM held in Victoria June 5-9, a local environmental project is approved and funded. Because the Victoria Fish & Game is the local BCWF club, we were asked to submit project proposals. One of our options presented was to rebuild and relocate the existing Colquitz River fish counting fence.

This proposal was accepted and \$10,000 funding was awarded to the project. This is made up of \$5000 from the CWF and \$5000 from the Habitat Conservation Trust Foundation.

The existing fence beside Tillicum Mall was rebuilt in 2001 by the Victoria Fish & Game to monitor Coho salmon adults ascending Colquitz in the fall to spawn. The site is not best suited to accomplish this monitoring. It suffers from periodic flooding in November and December which results in water going around and over the fence structure. This is compounded by the fence being within the tidal influence which further backs up the water. As a result, less than one hundred percent of the fish can be enumerated and this percentage varies from year to year. Therefore, the data cannot effectively be utilized to evaluate the success of any stream enhancement efforts.

The new site further upstream will alleviate this problem as it will be designed to capture one hundred percent of the target species. The project has the support of the municipality of Saanich as landowner. The new site is within the Colquitz linear park. The Department of Fisheries & Oceans (community advisor) is supportive. The newly formed Friends of Swan Creek Watershed are included in the process as a stakeholder.

The Victoria Fish & Game executive approved \$10,000 club funding for the project at their June 03 meeting. Actual construction will take place during the fisheries window next summer with operation commencing in the fall with the first returning salmon. The new fence will be designed to monitor both salmon and cutthroat trout adults and smolts. It will also include an educational component with information and signage prominently displayed. School groups will be accommodated as they have been at the existing site.

An initial stakeholders planning meeting was held July 10 at Saanich Public Works yard. Representatives from Victoria Fish & Game, Saanich, DFO, Peninsula Streams and Friends of Swan Creek Watershed attended. It is anticipated that a second meeting of all stakeholders will be held in late September. The next steps involve selecting an exact site, fence design, budget and funding sources.
