From the President:

Merry Christmas/ Seasons Greeting and Happy Holidays to one and all.

My insight has grown tremendously over the last month having worked a couple of days each week as Relief Caretaker. Few things we need to look at.

Multi-Purpose Range:

With our Club Officially at 2800 members (reported at last Executive/Directors Meeting) it is not possible for you to shoot in a bay by yourself for hours on end. If you were to go to the Rifle/Pistol Range we have 31 possible positions with all types of shooting taking place at the same time.

Think of each bay at the Multi-Purpose as a separate little Rifle/Pistol/Shotgun Range. There should be a Range Officer for each Bay and more than one person shooting at a time. Yes, if it can be the same style, or you could match up Rifle with Rifle, Shotgun with Shotgun and Pistol with Pistol.

That way we will increase our capacity 10 fold on this range. It is not realistic to expect your own separate bay for your personal use while people are waiting to shoot. Other advantages are you will get to know other Club Members and be able to pass on your expertise in shooting, knowledge and safety.

Remember; lock the gate behind you when you go to the Multi-Purpose Range. The reason it might be open are, gravel trucks going in or out usually 7am-5pm Mon. to Fri. or if there is an event going on it is usually left open for Non-Club members (weekends) other than that" LOCK THE GATE" please.

Unapproved Targets:

Balloons, Glass, Metal objects, Ceramics, Clay pigeons (off the S/G Range) empty Shot Gun Hulls, Etc. ARE NOT APPROVED TARGETS.

During regular range use paper and cardboard targets are acceptable. Some reactive targets may also be acceptable but need to be approved by the Manager/Caretaker when you bring it to the range.

Any target that when set up causes you to shoot directly into the Range Floor Surface is not allowed or into the berms protecting the concrete surfaces are not allowed. Do not post targets on the backstop in the Silhouette Target Holders Area, rim fire only in that area.

Remember your Safety Course when they talked about templating Ranges. It is all about angles, where the bullet goes and how to keep it in the range.

CLEANING Up:

It is a Range Rule to clean up after yourself, which includes brass casings, shotgun hulls, old cardboard, and shot up wood or steel in a lot of cases this is not being done. if you are shooting at the range beside someone and they are packing up to go home and it looks like they are not going to clean up please feel free to say, "The President wanted me to remind you that you are supposed to clean up before you leave"

With your \$ 110.00 Membership you are allowed to use a Multi-Million Dollar Shooting Facility, by following a few simple Rules your experience will be better and you will assist in making the people around have an experience that is better as well.

MEMBERSHIP Cards and Day Passes:

As previously mentioned Membership Cards and Day Passes are to be displayed. We have handed out over 1500 Lanyards or Plastic Card Holders. Everyone must sign in and out. Please take the time, it makes running the ranges much easier, especially planning based on range use, clearing the ranges upon closing, for insurance purposes, in case there is an accident on the range. Ensuring you don't get locked behind the gate and cannot get out-hope you have a sleeping bag in your vehicle.

Shooting for Juniors

The shooting program for juniors is underway at the North Saanich Rod and Gun club (NSRG). The program is free of charge with all guns, ammunition and targets being supplied. Initiation to shooting will be with CZ target air rifles. As proficiency improves, the participant will have a choice of further advancing with either Feinwerkbau air rifles or Anschutz .22 rimfire target rifles. First and foremost the training will cover the safe handling and use of firearms (air guns are considered firearms).

The program will be taught from the perspective of ultimately becoming a competitive shooter. However, the basics that all participants will be taught will serve them well in most other shooting venues.

The NSRG range is located on McTavish Crossroad and the street address is 1353. The range is on the south side of the road and the entrance is marked by a yellow address sign. A gravel road leads up the hill to the range facility.

Shooting is broken up into 2 hour blocks. Advanced shooters will meet from 12 to 2 and beginners from 2 to 4. Please note that the original notice for this program had beginners shooting from 10 to 12, but to be convenient to more people, was changed to 2 to 4.

Parents are welcome to participate with their children as space and time permit.

This program is a co-operative venture between the NSRG and the VFGPA and is supported by local businesses – in particular, Island Outfitters. Winchester supplies most of the ammunition.

In terms of shooting times, every effort will be made accommodate as many people as possible. Shooting will be broken up into 2 hour blocks ie. 10 to 12, 12 to 2 and 2 to 4.

By LtCol. A.J. D'Amario USAF Ret. From the pages of the American Rifleman, November 2013.

On my first solo flight at K-13, Suwan, Korea, in June 1952, I took off in an F-80 Shooting Star. It was not a combat mission. All I had to do was go up and have fun boring holes in the sky for about an hour and a half.

Immediately after takeoff, I felt the left wing was heavy and determined that the left tip fuel tank was not feeding properly or not at all. Afraid it might fall off and rupture during landing, potentially melting asphalt on the runway, the tower would not let me land with the full tank. I was instructed to make a bomb run and drop the whole tank.

Arriving at the bomb range, I set up my bomb-release switches to release the tank. Flying over the impact area, I pushed the button but nothing happened. I tried a second time and again there was no response. On my next pass, I tried the manual release handle but to no avail. Making one final run, I used the button we called the "panic button" because it allegedly released everything hanging on the airplane. It worked as advertised and dumped everything, save my errant left tip tank.

The tower control officer advised me that if I couldn't get rid of the tank or its contents, I should give them my location, eject and await pickup. Well. pilots really hate to punch out of a perfectly flyable airplane and I figured I still had one option worth trying.

The canopy of an F-80 can be opened in flight up to about 220 MPH. So I opened the canopy and unholstered my G.I. issue Colt M1911 .45 automatic. Now, liquid fuel will not burn, at least not like vapors, so I aimed for the part of the tank I was sure would be full of liquid. Firing my first shot, I had no idea where the bullet went--perhaps airborne, high-speed physics were at work, or maybe just my nerves. But my next three shots punctured the tank, passing through the fuel and exiting cleanly out the far side of the 24" wide tank.

For the next thirty minutes, I flew with the left wing down in a series of circles to drain the fuel and slowly return to base. By the time I got to the airstrip the tank was empty. I made a routine landing. As far as I know, I am the only pilot in the Air Force who ever shot his own plane to correct a malfunction.

- August 31 Previous records of the *Master Man 60+ Bow hunter Open* yielded to his expertise with his 3D Archery Equipment. Greg laid waste to all FIVE different distance records for a record total score of 1107/1200 for the competition.
- On September 21 at the *Master Man 60+ Bow hunter Release* All FOUR Canadian records succumbed to Greg and his Hunting Bow and arrows (844/900 total score)

Rumour has it that during the season, numerous other successes also resulted from Greg's assault, but we couldn't get him to confess further. Apparently being Canada's "Numero Uno" Master Man is enough for him to divulge - except that he did say he has been accepted by the BC Archery Performance Team. He would only admit, "I get a T-shirt." We bet there's more to it!

Stay tuned; he's already planning a trip to next year's Provincials in Oliver, BC, then on to the Canadian Archery Championships in Edmonton where he'll compete in 3D, Field, and Target events. This time, he'll face tougher records: his own. Good luck, Greg!



VICTORIA FISH & GAME ANNUAL BIG GAME COMPETITION

Hunters are reminded that Blacktail deer taken in MU 1-1 through 1-13 by Victoria Fish & Game members are eligible for the five trophies available each year. Deer must be field dressed which means that the heart, liver and kidneys (edible portions) are the only internal organs which can be included when the animal is weighed. Deer must be weighed on Club scales by the caretaker or his designate.

The official weigher reserves the right to refuse weighing any deer which arrives in an unpreventable condition. Lungs must be removed and body cavity wiped dry with a rag or paper towels. Deer 160 pounds and over taken with a rifle and 140 pounds and over taken by bow and arrow must be witnessed by an executive member at time of weighing.

BIG GAME COMPETITION / RECORDS BOOKS

Copies of the eighth edition (2010) of the Vancouver Island Columbian Blacktail Deer Records are available at a cost of \$5 each. The issue contains a brief history of the records which were started in 1972 by Byron Mason and Charles Veasey. Byron has written another excellent article on the history of hunting on Vancouver Island from 1900 to 1920. The previous seventh edition (2000) contained Byron's piece on Blacktail deer populations and hunting on Vancouver Island from 1843 to 1899.

The current records list 1824 entries scoring 100 or more Boone & Crockett points. Several old hunting photographs have been reproduced for the first time in the records booklet.

The most recent sixth edition (2010) of the Big Game Records of British Columbia is available for \$35 each. These are hard cover books containing records of all native big game species in B.C. Hunting stories, photographs and a listing, by species category, of entries meeting the minimum score requirements, are included.


