WHAT IS A MARKSMAN ?????

Definition:

A **marksman**, or **sharpshooter**, is a person who is skilled in precision <u>shooting</u>,[1] using projectile weapons, such as with a <u>rifle</u> but most commonly with a <u>designated marksman rifle</u>.

Marksman skills that you need to work on are:

Stance

Grip

Trigger Control

Sight Picture

Breathing

(using a rest is great for sighting in but will not help if you have to do any other position then a bench Rest)

Its understandable when you are first starting that you maybe hitting the 2ft. By 2ft. Metal backer holder or the odd shot into the 2x6 that is holding up plywood at the 100/200/250 yd. line or the 1x5s at the 25 and 50yd. Lines but the goal is to hone your Marksmanship skills so that you are grouping your shots in the center of the target.

For rifle shooters in the Club check out Shoullette Shooting or ask a "Marksman" to mentor you with some pointers. Cowboy/Black Powder may be some other Options that you should consider joining.

Shotgun Shooters-Trap/Skeet/5-Stand

Pistol/Revolver Shooters might want to try IPSC, PPC (next live fire Course in June).

Check the Clubs Calender for the next practice and come in and watch, it may be something you want to try.

The better you get the more the Club will save on replacing wood target holders, plywood backers and metal target holders.

PLEASE PLEASE PLEASE

Place your targets on backers between the wood 1" x 5" X 10 ft long slats.

Every time you fire directly into the wood slats they have to be replaced at over \$10.00 each. (We are going through a lot of them)

Please attach your targets under the orange lines provided on the plywood sheets, every time the 2" X 10's get shot out they have to be replaced.

Please do not sweep your brass off the cement pad onto the ground, instead sweep into the dust pans (orange one hanging on the wall) and put into the brass buckets if its BRASS, steel/shotgun Hulls go into the garbage cans.

SWISS ARMS AND CZ858 SEMI-AUTO RIFLES

As many of you know, the RCMP firearms lab has suddenly declared that the Swiss Arms and CZ858 Semi-Auto rifles are to be moved from the non-restricted/restricted classes to the prohibited class. Both these rifles have been legally enjoyed for over a decade.

They have banned them.

Public Safety minister Blaney has announced an amnesty from prosecution for those owning these guns. However, owners are still technically criminals, and cannot use these firearms, or transport them, legally.

No details of the amnesty have been announced as yet.

Due to the complexity of the firearms act, following through with such an amnesty may not be possible. A re-write of the firearms act may be the only solution to criminalizing 15,000 firearms owners.

It is vitally important that the federal government hears from you, whether you own one of these guns or not. They need to hear that you strongly support a rewrite of the firearms act so these types of things will not happen again.

Please write your MP, The Prime Minister, and Minister Stephen Blaney and tell them that you will not stand for these bans and that the firearms act needs to be re-written.

- Decriminalize firearms ownership (remove Section 91 and 92 of the Firearms Act)
- Stop random acts by the CFOs (remove Section 58.1 of the act)
- Combine the ATT with the firearms license
- Stop bans based on looks



B.C. Wildlife Federation Notes

Resolutions

The following resolutions are to be presented and voted on at the upcoming BCWF AGM to be held in Kelowna from April 9 to 12, 2014.

1. Access to Provincial Campgrounds

To request of the Provincial Government that all campgrounds that could be used by the general public for any legitimate outdoor activity remain open and accessible year round.

2. Restriction to Public Angling Access in BC Parks

To request of the Provincial Government that the impasse at Paul Lake and other lakes in Provincial parks regarding the restriction to recreational anglers in the launching of trailered boats at the park boat launch sites.

3. Family Membership Cards

Each adult and child (age 12 to 18) included in a BCWF family membership be issued a membership card in their own name.

4. B.C. Hunting, Trapping and Angling Regulations.

As the Provincial Government no longer prints annual regulations synopses and as there are hunters, trappers and anglers with limited or no computer access or abilities, the BCWF requests that the Provincial Government print and distribute regulation changes that arise between the two year issuance of regulation synopses. These supplemental pages would be distributed with the issuance of annual licences.

5. Clarification of Legal Hunting Hours.

As the Wildlife Act does not specify how legal hunting hours may be determined, the BCWF request the wording of the hunting synopsis be altered to include the use of a GPS-enabled device to determine these hours. The onus is still on the hunter to determine what is enough light for the safe of firearms.

6. Prescribed Burning

The BCWF pursue legislative and policy changes with the Province that will enable and empower prescribed burning for eco-system restoration.

7. Wildlife Habitat Enhancement Prescribed Burns

The BCWF engage the appropriate ministries and agencies to ensure prescribed burning for wildlife enhancement occur in locations that resident hunters can readily access.

8. Agriculture / Wildlife Conflicts.

Wildlife populations can depend on agricultural land for habitat and hunting seasons are often used to reduce wildlife populations as a remedy for such conflicts. As this use of seasons is not supported by principles of wildlife management, the BCWF is requested to pursue with the Province, legislative and policy changes that empower wildlife managers to resolve wildlife / agriculture conflicts in a manner that provides incentives to agricultural producers, prevents alienation of privately controlled wildlife habitat and maintains the management of wildlife populations based on the principles of carry capacity and allowed annual hunt.

9. Alternative to Culling Deer

Instead of culling excessive deer populations in municipalities of B.C., the Ministry consider creating hunting opportunities and/or relocating animals to a more suitable location which may be more suitable to the public.

10. Dedicated Funding for Wildlife Management

The BCWF request from the appropriate representatives of the Province of B.C. that all fees collected for hunting licenses, species tags, LEH hunting, royalties for wildlife and trapping be fully dedicated back as minimum funding for wildlife management.

11. Public Safety Improvements for the Chase Bighorn sheep Herd.

A main highway crossing route for bighorn sheep is not adequately protected in terms of safety for both sheep and the public. The BCWF is to request that the Ministry of Transport install solar powered lights and appropriate fencing at this crossing.



12. Improvements to Chase Bighorn Sheep Habitat

The BCWF request that the Ministry of Environment initiate a controlled burn and reseeding of the sheep range along Sheep Creek.

13. By-Laws – Committee Chairperson's Vote

The BCWF amend Bylaw 7.1 to entitle official chairpersons of BCWF committees the right to vote at Annual General Meetings.

14. By-Laws – Members – Direct Family Membership – By-Law 2.4

For some time Direct Members of the BCWF have requested a Direct Family Membership category be added to By-Law 2.4 as 2.4(a) 1. Thereby a family unit may apply for direct membership in the BCWF upon acceptance and payment of annual dues as set by the Board of Directors. Direct Family Members shall be entitled to receive notice of and attend the AGM of the BCWF at their own expense without voting power or the power to submit resolutions unless it is an emergency resolution.

15. By-Laws – Members – Senior Family Membership Category.

The BCWF establish a Senior Family membership category with the same discount rate offered to individual seniors.

16. By-Laws – Section 8 Officers and Directors – Term of BCWF President

As the learning curve to becoming an effective President of the BCWF is long (~1 year), the present two year maximum term leaves only one year of fully effective management. This resolution would increase the President's term from two to three consecutive one-year terms in order to improve the effectiveness of overall management.

17. By-Laws – 2016 Membership Increase

As there has not been a BCWF dues increase since 2010 and the present dues do not cover the full cost of membership services, the following increase for 2016 is proposed:

Individual or regular members \$4 Family members \$9 Senior members \$4

Junior members No increase

In addition, membership dues will be reviewed and adjusted if necessary every three years based on the Consumer Price Index.

18. Membership Dues Increases

Region 2 of the BCWF have submitted a resolution whereby any dues increase be properly put forward to the membership a minimum of six months prior to being put on the floor at an AGM. The reason given is that a dues increase is a very contentious issue and this amount of time is needed to properly inform the membership.

Kid's Camp

The annual BCWF Zone 1 Kid's Camp will be held on July 21 to 24/14 at the Courtenay Rod and Gun Club. Last year the VFGPA sent 3 children and I would hope to do the same this year. The names of two children have been submitted as of March 06/14. This camp is a 4 day live-in experience for children 10 to 14 years old. Each day is filled with outdoor living experiences and demonstrations. There is no charge to attend. The total number attending is limited to 35.

Zone 1 AGM

The BCWF Zone 1 AGM will be held at the Courtenay Fish and Game club during the weekend of March 8/9. Besides electing the Zone 1 executive for 2014/15, the status of most of the outdoor activities and associated points of interest pertinent to the BCWF will be covered through committee reports and discussions. To be held beginning April 1, 2014 and running through to May 31, 2014, the contest rules are as follows:





COLQUITZ COUNTING FENCE VOLUNTEERS

Many of you are familiar with the previous involvement of the Victoria Fish & Game in the Colquitz River fish counting fence. The old, abandoned fence which was built in 1975-76 was rebuilt in 2001 by the VFGPA and others with the help of substantial grant monies. It was operated by Fish & Game members until 2008. From then until last year it was operated by some of the same individuals who were not members of the Association.

Because the structure is located within Saanich's linear park along the waterway, Saanich Parks has jurisdiction and the fence operation has to comply with their requirements. Saanich Parks was unaware the fence was being operated from 2008 until last year by individuals who were not members of a registered society - such as the Victoria Fish & Game.



The previous fence operators formed a society - the

Colquitz Salmonid Stewardship & Education Society - to comply. Saanich Parks signed a one year agreement with the new society last October. I am led to believe that it is not Saanich's intention to re-new their agreement with this society.

Because this agreement will expire before this fall's coho salmon run, the Victoria Fish & Game has committed to the operation of the counting fence for the fall 2014 Coho salmon run. This assumes that Saanich will approve and that the VFGPA can comply with their requirements.

Should this happen, we need volunteers to assist during the October through December spawning period. This requires daily, or more frequent, checking and enumeration of the coho within the fence trap. If you are interested and can commit on a daily basis (either weekdays or weekends) please e-mail or phone contact information below. You will be contacted later this summer to meet at the fence for information/training session.

SPORT FISHING ADVISORY BOARD

The Sport Fishing Advisory Board was formed in 1964 to provide advice to the Minister of Fisheries & Oceans on matters pertaining to the west coast tidal sport fishery. The Amalgamated Conservation Society, an association of local fishing-oriented organizations, was largely responsible for its formation. Until 1997, the ACS was a representative member with its own seat on the SFAB. In 1997, the seat was eliminated as a result of the SFAB's reorganization which then only recognized province wide bodies. Because the Amalgamated Conservation Society membership was restricted to southern Vancouver Island, their seat was eliminated.

However, in recognition of the 50th anniversary of the SFAB which will be celebrated at their upcoming April 12-13 meeting, the ACS seat has been reinstated. Tom Cole, president of the ACS, will be their representative on the SFAB.

The SFAB consists of a North Coast committee and a South Coast committee each with several local sport fishing advisory committees. The local Victoria SFAC is chaired by Chris Bos. Membership on the SFAB currently consists of 35 positions as follows:

BIG GAME COMPETITION WINNERS ANNOUNCED

Trophy and deer button winners from the 2013 hunting season will be presented with their awards at the March 17 Annual General Meeting as follows:

McIlwaine Van & Storage Perpetual for largest Blacktail deer (established 1955) Trey Cleemoff 172 ½ lb.

Victoria Fish & Game Association Antler Perpetual for largest Blacktail deer antlers (established 1966) Trey Cleemoff 116 6/8 pts.

Bob Hollingworth Memorial Perpetual for largest buck Blacktail taken by junior member (established 1983) Trey Cleemoff 172 ½ lb.

Victoria Fish & Game Bear Perpetual for largest Black bear (established 1998) Riley Mace 15 11/16 pts.

There were no entries for the Robinson's Sporting Goods Perpetual for largest Blacktail deer taken by bow and arrow (established 1970) or the Malahat Marauders Perpetual for largest Blacktail deer taken by muzzleloader (established 1990).

This year all the big game awards were won by junior members. Trey Cleemoff is 14 years old and Riley Mace 11 years old. Congratulations to both of these junior hunters.

Trey's large Blacktail qualifies him for a silver button (160 - 179 ½ lb). His antlers from the same deer are entered into the Vancouver Island Columbian Blacktail Deer Records (100 points minimum score required) and the Big Game Records of British Columbia (115 points minimum score required).

The following deer were entered this past season:

Riley Mace 112 ½ lb Sept. 15 antlers 2-2 James Mace 118 ½ lb Sept 15 antlers 3-2 Trey Cleemoff 172 ½ lb Sept 16 antlers 4-3

Riley's Black bear measured 9-14/16" in length and 5-13/16" in width.

ELWHA RIVER RESTORATION PROJECT

After many years of discussion and with approximately \$350 million funding in place, the Elwha River Restoration Project began in the late summer of 2011. The project involves the deconstruction of two hydroelectric dams which have blocked the migration of salmonids since their construction in the early part of the 20th century.

Once complete, the restoration project will open up 70 miles of suitable fish habitat to all five species of Pacific salmon as well as steelhead, bull and cutthroat trout. Prior to the dams construction, the watershed supported salmon returns numbering around 400,000. Returns in recent years have numbered only 5000 or less. The Elwha had the largest Chinook salmon on the south coast with some individuals approaching 100 pounds. The biggest Chinook return since 1992 was recorded last fall with 1741 adult fish counted through a fish weir by September 17.

The restoration project includes the purchase of the two dams and related facilities, construction of two water treatment plants and flood protection facilities, construction of a fish hatchery and construction of a greenhouse for growing native plants for re-vegetation.

Work started in September 2011 on the removal of the 108 foot high Elwha Dam built in 1912 and located five miles upstream from the river estuary. Removal was complete by the summer of 2012 at which time work started on the removal of the 210 foot high Glines Canyon Dam. Construction of the Glines Canyon Dam, located 12 miles upstream from the river mouth, was completed in 1927.

Throughout the period of deconstruction, millions of cubic yards of sediment which had built up behind the two dams, has been washing downstream and accumulating in the estuary. This is part of a natural process which has been speeded up significantly with almost 100 years of sediment migration occurring during the short deconstruction period.

The Glines Canyon Dam is now essentially gone. Recent blasts removed the remaining portion of the dam wall. On January 15, 2014 explosives removed 578 cubic yards of the dam and on January 26 a further 900 cubic yards was removed with 2000 pounds of explosives. The remaining 14 feet of dam wall was removed on February 10 leaving only the concrete dam apron left. Thousands of cubic yards of dam material now has to be removed from the river prior to completion of the restoration project by September 2014.

This project is the largest dam removal effort in history. The Elwha River is located across Juan de Fuca Strait from Victoria on Washington State's Olympic Peninsula.
