
SKEET AND 5- STAND NOTICE

SAFETY REMINDERS--PLEASE READ

FIREARMS--CASES--BENCHES

Firearms are to be <u>cased</u> and <u>uncased</u> <u>ONLY</u> during Live Periods and <u>preferably</u> only at the Firing line (forward wooden benches) Actions open, Magazines removed (empty cases can be returned to rear gear tables)

Firearms are to be Loaded and Unloaded ONLY on the Firing Line (forward wooden shooting Benches)

Muzzles are always to be pointed down range or upwards.

(magazine may be filled or emptied at the rear gear benches and tables).

"CEASE FIRE" ROUTINE/PROCEDURES:

Remove ammunition from the Chamber. Remove magazines from the action

Leave actions visibly open-(a chamber flag helps visibility!)

Then- Your Choice:

Leave firearm(muzzle pointed down range, magazine removed, action open) on FIRING LINE bench.

Or

Carry firearm muzzle up and place in rear wall rack- magazine removed action open.

Remember to bring needed targets, tape, stapler, beverage, etc. with you when leaving the shooting bench area for the Cease Fire Period. (An RSO can retrieve forgotten items.)

During a Cease Fire <u>DO NOT</u> go within 3 metres of the firearms on the bench (remember your P.A.L. Course), or handle firearms on the racks. Do not touch anything on your shooting table. (An RSO can retrive forgotten items).

During a Cease Fire the divided concrete slab area around the shooting benches is to be used to <u>walk through</u> <u>only</u> on the way to your target and back. Please remain off the shooting table area concrete during cease fire periods. Do not touch anything on the shooting tables!

Your Cooperation is appreciated! Your Safety is our only concern!

Place your targets on backers between the wood 1" x 5" X 10 ft long slats.

Every time you fire directly into the wood slats they have to be replaced at over \$10.00 each. (We are going through a lot of them)

Please attach your targets under the orange lines provided on the plywood sheets, every time the 2" X 10" s get shot out they have to be replaced.

Please do not sweep your brass off the cement pad onto the ground, instead sweep into the dust pans (orange one hanging on the wall) and put into the brass buckets if its BRASS, steel/shotgun Hulls go into the garbage cans.



B.C. Wildlife Federation Notes

Kid's Camp

VFGPA will be sponsoring 4 kids to the annual Kid's Camp held at the Courtenay Fish and Game club. If there is anyone within our club with some available time in the week of July 21 to 25 and who enjoys teaching kids, the Kid's Camp group needs your help.

Malcolm Case

The BCWF played an important role in the outcome of the court case in which the commercial halibut fishermen (Malcolm) challenged the right of the Federal Minister of Fisheries to increase the allowable halibut catch given to the public from 12% to 15%. The commercial sector appealed the original decision and lost. The judge pointed out that such resources belong to the public and the public must have fair and equitable access. A more widespread application of this concept would go a long way to helping solve many issues.

Wetlands

The BCWF will be offering a Wetlandkeeper's course in Duncan which will run from the evening of June 20th to the late afternoon of June 22nd. This course will cover many aspects of wetland attributes and include water quality, hydrology, plant and animal life and their inter-relationships. This course is offered free of charge and is an excellent opportunity to learn of the importance of wetlands.

Junior Shooting

The air rifle shooting program, offered in conjunction with the North Saanich Rod and Gun Club, has stopped for the summer and will resume in September. This program was reasonably successful for a first time offering and there is already significant interest in its continuation.

Discovery Day

The VFGPA "Discovery Day" occurs on Sunday, June 15th. This day coincides with the province-wide "Learn to Fish" weekend during which the public is treated to the opportunity to catch a fish at various centers throughout the province and being allowed to keep the fish without the need for a fishing licence. All other fishing regulations must be adhered to. This applies to both fresh and salt water fishing.

The VFGPA is one of the places where those of the public who wish to learn something about fishing can go. The "Learn to Fish" staff will be at Frog Hollow (VFGPA Malahat facility) for both Saturday, June 14th and Sunday June 15th. The pond has been stocked with catchable fish and more will be released on Saturday. Spin casting lessons will be offered along with displays to help in fish identification. There is no charge to participate.



This program is made available by the Freshwater Fishing Society in conjunction with the Victoria Fish and Game Protective Association.

Junior Rifle Shooting Program

This program, held every Saturday afternoon, has had a reasonable turnout since inception. Advanced precision rifle (.22) and air rifle are offered in conjunction with a drop-in .22 program for adults and children.

Air rifle was originally conceived as a program for juniors but, as the children must be brought to the range by their parents, these parents have been participating – and enjoying the experience. As a result, the air rifle program will now be open to all with priority being given to junior shooters.

Air rifle is a demanding shooting venue with the advantage that the regulation shooting distance is 10 meters (33 ft) – a distance achievable in many basements. Ammunition (.177 lead pellets) is reasonably priced, noise is low and backstop requirements are minimal. If the muzzle velocity is less than 500 ft/sec. the gun is not considered a firearm and a PAL is not required.

RCMP/CRD NO SHOOTING SIGNS

The following signs were recently installed during week of May 12-16 in vicinity of Jordan River.

They indicate no shooting in vicinity of Jordan River. While the sign on North main was still standing on June 01, the one posted at Fore Bay Road (road to Diversion Reservoir) was shot at several times and pulled out of the ground

The new 2014-2016 Hunting & Trapping Regulations Synopsis shows a "No Shooting Area" from the B.C. Hydro powerline to the Juan de Fuca shoreline between Sooke and east of Jordan River (Fore Bay Rd.). The Regulations show no further restrictions west of Jordan River above Highway 14. There appears to be a discrepancy between what the sign at North Main says and what is indicated in the Hunting Regulations.




