Rare Exports Hunting / Conservation And Shooting Contest

1st winner essay

Hunting and Conservation

Hunting and conservation, two things that are commonly misunderstood or just not well know. Hunting is an effective conservation tool with many benefits that people don't seem to think about when judging it. Conservation is not just a companion to hunting but they share the same goal. If you yourself have misconceptions about hunting or conservation or don't understand it like most of the public then I implore you to read the paragraphs below and you might be enlightened on the subjects.

Conservation versus preservation, this is a battle that many people in the public are unable to comprehend because they do not differentiate between the two. To conserve wildlife is to make sure that specific animals don't get over or under populated. To the general public conservation is the protecting of animals from any harm caused by people. The general public does not think that people hunting animals in a safe and legal manner is conserving animals but believes that it is unethical. A great example of conservation is the Vancouver Island black bear. These animals are conserved so while they may be hunted, they can only be legally hunted in certain areas, at specific times, and only specific ages and or genders to make sure that the population can support the hunting and to prevent over predation of the species. To preserve wildlife is to keep it safe from any and all forms of endangerment. Like the panda for example it is being preserved, bred in captivity and is currently illegal to hunt therefore what little of the species is left of this majestic beast is being preserved. So in simple terms to preserve is to enclose from danger and prevent the death of any said animal and conservation is to limit the predation of any said animal.

Hunting versus poaching, another example of a battle in which some of the public doesn't differentiate between sides due to numerous reasons. A lack of education or knowledge on the subject or receiving a biased outlook on the subject from sources opposed to any hunting. Hunting is the killing of animals for sport and food such as killing a bear for meat and a bear rug or killing an elk for its antlers and meat from it. But contrary to popular public belief not all hunters are just killing for pelts or trophies. In fact for a majority of animals it is legally required that hunters remove the meat from their kill with certain exceptions. Also contrary to popular belief taking the meat from the kill is why a majority of hunters kill animals. On the other side of this battle is poaching, the thing that a majority of people see when the word hunting appears in conversation. Poaching is the illegal hunting and killing of an animal. Examples of poaching are killing an animal for financial gain such as killing a bear and only removing its gall bladder so as to sell it, or killing an animal not open to hunting. In simple terms calling a hunter a poacher is like calling a pharmacist a drug dealer.

Are hunters also wildlife conservationists? This is a question avid hunters know the answer to but the public does not. This question is probably the best question a hunter can ask because learning the answer will prove itself true. Confused? Bear with me. The answer is yes hunters are wildlife conservationists. For an example Theodore Roosevelt learned about being a hunter while he spent time on his ranch. It appeared that after his ranching experience he became an outdoorsman on the inside and a politician on the outside. For once he became president he created five new national parks, a perfect example of conservation. Adding to this riveting subject a more recent example of how hunters are conservationist has arisen. Ducks Unlimited is a massive group of hunters working with ranchers, farmers, and land owners to restore and improve grasslands, forests, wetlands and watersheds all for the purpose of creating a richer environment for water fowl. Ducks Unlimited is helping to conserve all waterfowl for the purpose of allowing hunters to hunt speaks for itself, they conserve to hunt. Now back to my earlier statement any hunter that doesn't know the answer to the question of whether or not they are conservationists or not will be compelled to be more of a conservationist once learning that the answer is, yes, hunters are conservationists

The benefits of hunting, there are many benefits of hunting that people don't regularly think of when the thought of hunting wanders its way into their minds. Hunting is the most basic form of conservation and an easy way for people to get good healthy food. Hunting is also extremely cost effective in that the government only has to pay for hunting to be regulated and not accomplished. Hunting, while people think it's barbaric and evil, is actually an efficient way to conserve. Hunting will decrease a large population of animals to a sizable amount able to sustain itself through natural obstacles such as a harsh winter or drought. Because of hunting the animal populations don't reach the point where there isn't enough food to feed all the animals and most of them end up dying of natural causes. Hunting is also a great way to get healthy food. The meat off of wild animals is usually the purest meat because there is no chance of added chemicals from companies or an absurd amount of fat due to selective breeding. Wild game meat will usually be pure and natural with nutrition, protein, and natural amounts of fat to create a perfect meal to sustain people. The only time that wild game meat wouldn't be a pure source of sustenance is if for example a bear stumbled across a garbage can left out by a carless person, and the bear believed that it discovered a free meal and decided to eat it. At that point the bear's meat would be inedible for anyone due to pollution by garbage.

In summary, conservation is keeping the population of animals balanced by making sure that too many aren't killed and that there isn't overpopulation of an animal. Preservation is the complete enclosure of a specific kind of animal to protect them from any and all dangers. Hunting is killing animals in a legal manner for the purpose of food and the occasional trophy such a hide rugs or antlers to hang. Poaching is the illegal killing of an animal for financial gain or the killing of an animal not in season. Hunters are also wildlife conservationists because they help the populations of animals stay in balance instead of dropping too low or rising too high. The benefits of hunting are; it helps keep the population of specific animals in check, it gives people a perfect way to obtain a purer form of meat then what you would get from a super market, and it is completely cost effective. To put it in the simplest form conservation and preservation are not the same thing, hunting is good and poaching is bad, hunters help animals and their habitats much more than the public may think, and hunting benefits us all in numerous ways.

SAFETY REMINDERS--PLEASE READ

FIREARMS--CASES--BENCHES

Firearms are to be <u>cased</u> and <u>uncased</u> <u>ONLY</u> during Live Periods and <u>preferably</u> only at the Firing line (forward wooden benches) Actions open, Magazines removed (empty cases can be returned to rear gear tables)

Firearms are to be Loaded and Unloaded ONLY on the Firing Line (forward wooden shooting Benches)

Muzzles are <u>always</u> to be pointed down range or upwards.

(magazine may be filled or emptied at the rear gear benches and tables).

"CEASE FIRE" ROUTINE/PROCEDURES:

Remove ammunition from the Chamber. Remove magazines from the action

Leave actions visibly open-(a chamber flag helps visibility!)

Then- Your Choice:

Leave firearm(muzzle pointed down range, magazine removed, action open) on FIRING LINE bench.

Or

Carry firearm muzzle up and place in rear wall rack- magazine removed action open.

Remember to take needed targets, tape, stapler, beverage, etc. with you when leaving the shooting bench area for the <u>Cease Fire Period</u>. (An RSO can retrieve forgotten items.)

During a Cease Fire <u>DO NOT</u> go within 3 metres of the firearms on the bench or handle firearms on the racks (Remember your P.A.L. Course). Do not touch anything on your shooting table. (An RSO can retrieve forgotten items).

During a Cease Fire the divided concrete slab area around the shooting benches is to be used to **walk through only** on the way to your target and back. Please remain off the shooting table area concrete during cease fire periods.

Your Cooperation is appreciated! Your Safety is our only concern!

Every time you fire directly into the wood slats they have to be replaced at over \$10.00 each. (We are going through a lot of them)

Please attach your targets under the orange lines painted on the plywood sheets. Every time the 2" X 10's get shot out they have to be replaced.

Please do not sweep your brass off the cement pad onto the ground. Instead sweep into the dust pans (orange ones hanging on the wall) and put into the brass buckets if it's BRASS. Steel/shotgun hulls go into the garbage cans.

Kid's Camp

VFGPA will be sponsoring 4 kids to the annual Kid's Camp held at the Courtenay Fish and Game club. If there is anyone within our club with some available time in the week of July 21 to 25 and who enjoys teaching kids, the Kid's Camp group needs your help.

Junior Shooting

The air rifle shooting program, offered in conjunction with the North Saanich Rod and Gun Club, has stopped for the summer and will resume in September. This program was reasonably successful for a first time offering and there is already significant interest in its continuation.

Junior Rifle Shooting Program

This program, held every Saturday afternoon, has had a reasonable turnout since inception. Advanced precision rifle (.22) and air rifle are offered in conjunction with a drop-in .22 program for adults and children.

Air rifle was originally conceived as a program for juniors but, as the children must be brought to the range by their parents, these parents have been participating – and enjoying the experience. As a result, the air rifle program will now be open to all with priority being given to junior shooters.

Air rifle is a demanding shooting venue with the advantage that the regulation shooting distance is 10 meters (33 ft) – a distance achievable in many basements. Ammunition (.177 lead pellets) is reasonably priced, noise is low and backstop requirements are minimal. If the muzzle velocity is less than 500 ft/sec. the gun is not considered a firearm and a PAL is not required.


