IMPORTANT MESSAGE



Place your targets on backers between the wood 1" x 5" X 10 ft long slats.

Every time you fire directly into the wood slats they have to be replaced at over \$10.00 each. (We are going through a lot of them)

Please attach your targets under the orange lines painted on the plywood sheets. Every time the 2" X 10's get shot out they have to be replaced.

Please do not sweep your brass off the cement pad onto the ground. Instead sweep into the dust pans (orange ones hanging on the wall) and put into the brass buckets if it's BRASS. Steel/shotgun hulls go into the garbage cans.


2014 Handgun Safety and Introductory PPC Course

SAFETY REMINDERS--PLEASE READ

FIREARMS--CASES--BENCHES

Firearms are to be <u>cased</u> and <u>uncased</u> <u>ONLY</u> during Live Periods and <u>preferably</u> only at the Firing line (forward wooden benches) Actions open, Magazines removed (empty cases can be returned to rear gear tables)

Firearms are to be Loaded and Unloaded ONLY on the Firing Line (forward wooden shooting Benches)

Muzzles are <u>always</u> to be pointed down range or upwards.

(magazine may be filled or emptied at the rear gear benches and tables).

"CEASE FIRE" ROUTINE/PROCEDURES:

Remove ammunition from the Chamber. Remove magazines from the action

Leave actions visibly open-(a chamber flag helps visibility!)

Then- Your Choice:

Leave firearm(muzzle pointed down range, magazine removed, action open) on FIRING LINE bench.

Or

Carry firearm muzzle up and place in rear wall rack- magazine removed action open.

Remember to take needed targets, tape, stapler, beverage, etc. with you when leaving the shooting bench area for the Cease Fire Period. (An RSO can retrieve forgotten items.)

During a Cease Fire <u>DO NOT</u> go within 3 metres of the firearms on the bench or handle firearms on the racks (Remember your P.A.L. Course). Do not touch anything on your shooting table. (An RSO can retrieve forgotten items).

During a Cease Fire the divided concrete slab area around the shooting benches is to be used to <u>walk through</u> <u>only</u> on the way to your target and back. Please remain off the shooting table area concrete during cease fire periods.

Your Cooperation is appreciated! Your Safety is our only concern!

VICTORIA FISH & GAME ANNUAL BIG GAME COMPETITION

Hunters are reminded that Blacktail deer taken in MU 1-1 through 1-13 by Victoria Fish & Game members are eligible for the five trophies available each year. Deer must be field dressed which means that the heart, liver and kidneys (edible portions) are the only internal organs which can be included when the animal is weighed. Deer must be weighed on Club scales by the caretaker or his designate.

The official weigher reserves the right to refuse weighing any deer which arrives in an unpresentable condition. Lungs must be removed and body cavity wiped dry with a rag or paper towels. Deer 160 pounds and over taken with a rifle and 140 pounds and over taken by bow and arrow must be witnessed by an executive member at time of weighing. Please contact the Club caretaker or Wayne Zaccarelli to make arrangements.

B.C. Wildlife Federation Notes

A bit of an update on what the BCWF is doing:

Union of B.C. Indian Chiefs (UBCIC)

Several times during past BCWF AGM's, Grand Chief Stuart Phillip has said that the First Nations should join forces with the BCWF and develop ways of working together on several fronts. These would include land usage and conservation of fish, wildlife and habitat. More specifically a First Nations cultural component of the BCWF Conservation and Outdoor Recreation Program and a BCWF representative attending the UBCIC AGM in 2015 are being discussed at this time. These are tentative steps to what could be a very beneficial liaison.

Wildlife Allocation

The BCWF is meeting with the Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations (FLNRO) regarding the ongoing issue of wildlife allocation.

Round table on the Environment and Economy

In a recent meeting of this group the BCWF raised a number of issues including the Mount Polley tailings pond failure which resulted in the release of a very significant volume of tailings and contaminated water into prime fish habitat. The BCWF has proposed the establishment of a Natural Practices Board to guide natural resource extraction in B.C.

Prawn Allocation

The BCWF is holding discussions with the Dept. of Fisheries and Oceans with regard to the allocation of the allowable prawn catch. DFO want to apply the same principle as they have applied to the halibut catch to prawns. In essence this translates to the resource being considered an asset of the commercial sector with a very minimal portion being allocated to the public for recreational fishing. However, the commercial sector will sell quota to the public sector. What am I missing here?

Freshwater Fisheries Society of B.C. (FFSBC)

The FFSBC has indicated that they are interested in consulting with the BCWF on several new licensing products they would like to examine and propose. What these are I do not know but will find out.

Strategic Planning

The financial consulting firm, Deloitte, has been hired to work with the BCWF in its strategic planning.

Elk Re-location

The BCWF has provided input to the Management Plan for Roosevelt Elk in B.C. In the recent past elk have been doing well for a variety reasons and re-location of nucleus herds has been a significant factor. The demand for elk is increasing (for both consumptive and non-consumptive reasons) and there are areas of the Island where elk were historically present but are not now found. Continuing with re-location has its problems in conflicts with forestry and agricultural operations. However these can be mitigated through hunting. The goal is to return numbers to historic levels.

There are problems with such a program. Money is required to augment government funds for inventory and monitoring and volunteers are required to participate in the re-location as well as inventory and habitat enhancement projects.

The VFGPA has funds which could be applied to this project but do we have any volunteers to do the actual work? If interested, please send me an email - bob@biologica.bc.ca

FEDERAL GOVERNMENT ANNOUNCES SEP SALMON HATCHERY FUNDING

On October 3, Fisheries & Oceans Minister Gail Shea announced on Vancouver Island an additional \$34.2 million over five years for the upgrade and renewal of salmon hatcheries and spawning channels operated by the federal government under the Salmonid Enhancement Program (SEP).

Of this total, \$13.8 million will go to refurbishing crucial water supply and delivery systems to all 16 major hatcheries and spawning channels. The balance, \$20.4 million, will be used to modernize and refurbish aging infrastructure at Bella Coola's Snootli Creek hatchery.

A \$14 million renovation of the Quinsam River hatchery was completed in 2014.


The Salmonid Enhancement Program was initiated in 1978 and is now 36 years old. SEP operates 23 salmon hatcheries and spawning channels in British Columbia.







