Junior Target Rifle

The jointly administered (NSRG & VFGPA) drop-in shooting program held on Saturday afternoons at the NSRG range is fully underway. All equipment, ammunition and targets as well as instruction are offered free of charge. There are two venues - .22 rimfire and .177 air rifle. Al Hargreaves (NSRG) looks after rimfire and Bob Macdonald air rifle. As the NSRG has a stand-alone air rifle range as well as a regular rifle range, the venues are offered concurrently – from 1400 to 1600 hrs.

The rifles used in both venues are all high quality and target grade. Rear sights are micrometer adjustable peep sights and front sights are globe sights with interchangeable apertures. Shooting jackets and gloves are available.

In .22 rifle, most shooting is done from the prone position while in air rifle most shooting is done from the standing or offhand position. However, as most competitions require shooting from prone, kneeling and standing positions, a student who shows a real interest in target shooting will, if time and numbers allow, be introduced to all three.

This program is offered primarily to children 8 years and older. There is no hard and fast minimum age but children younger than 8 tend not to be big enough to handle even the air rifles. However one does not know until one tries. Parents are welcome to shoot alongside their children in either venue if space allows – but, priority is given to the children.

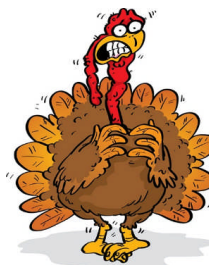
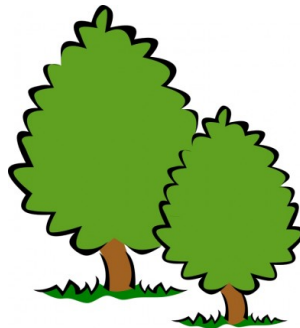
On the first Saturday of each month a range and firearm safety program is given to all those who wish to shoot in either venue – both children and parents. One is not allowed to shoot until this program has been taken.

For those older children and young adults who show continued interest and some skill in target shooting there is a program that runs from 1200 to 1400 hrs. every Saturday at NSRG. This program is coached by Chantel Spicer – a former Canadian National Team member – with the goal to create a team of shooters to compete at the Provincial level.

NEW HUNTING COURSE NOVEMBER 1ST & 2ND

Everyone had a wonderful time, had fun and learned a lot. There were 16 people who attended.



About 16 of us attended a very informative, hands on course presented by Bernard Stewart. For \$25 for two days, it was a fantastic deal. I have received no negative feedback and will forward feedback I have received from participants.

The course involved:

- * skinning and cutting up a 2- point buck that Bernard had harvested a couple of days prior to the course
- * followed by a detailed demonstration of butchering and packaging said buck. Markus from Carnivore Meats in Brentwood, spent Saturday with us in the clubhouse, giving us the expert demo.
- * Saturday afternoon, Bernard went over specific gear and gave a powerpoint type presentation of his latest hunts in Africa and Austria
- * Sunday was at the range, sighting in tips, and target practice. Bernard brought all his own gear, including rifles and ammo, and allowed participants to try the various calibres (.22, 270, 416). He gave a ton of advice on purchasing gear, and was extremely open to questions.

Basically, he packed about a weeks worth of info into one weekend, so it was pretty intensive.

With the exceptionally positive feedback, I would recommend this become a yearly offering, perhaps have it span over two weekends.

Bernard has also offered to do a stalking/tracking course, and most, if not all, participants expressed interest. Thinking maybe in December?

On top of everything, Bernard shared a package of stewing meat with all participants, gave the hide away (plus many other little prizes - meat hooks and sparring antlers), and has graciously donated the buck for the Game Dinner.

PLEASE, PLEASE, PLEASE

Place your targets on backers between the wood 1" x 5" X 10 ft long slats.

Every time you fire directly into the wood slats they have to be replaced at over \$10.00 each. (We are going through a lot of them)

Please attach your targets under the orange lines painted on the plywood sheets. Every time the 2" X 10' s get shot out they have to be replaced.

Please do not sweep your brass off the cement pad onto the ground. Instead sweep into the dust pans (orange ones hanging on the wall) and put into the brass buckets if it's BRASS. Steel/shotgun hulls go into the garbage cans.

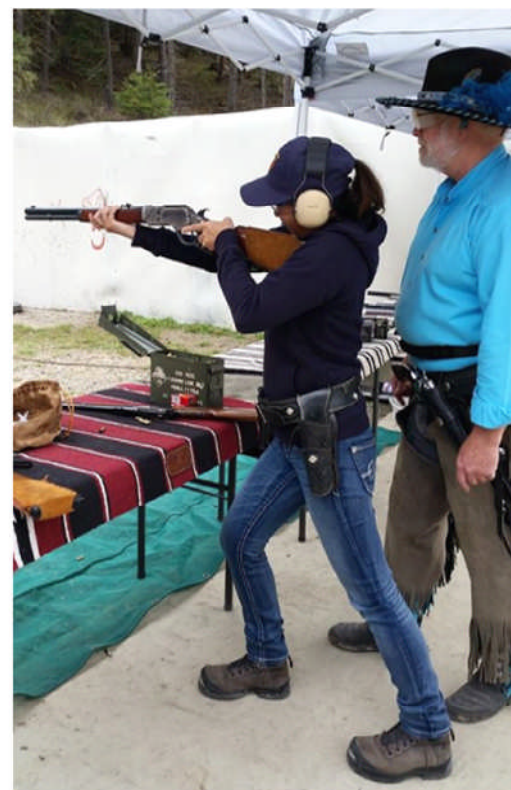

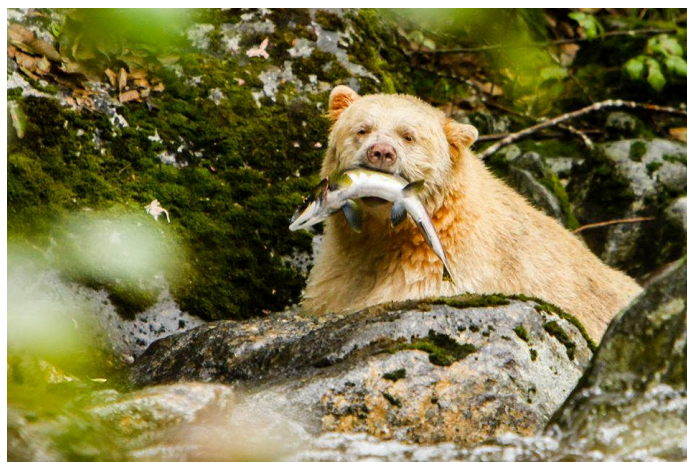

SAFETY REMINDERS--PLEASE READ

FIREARMS--CASES--BENCHES

Firearms are to be cased and uncased ONLY during Live Periods and preferably only at the Firing line (forward wooden benches) Actions open, Magazines removed (empty cases can be returned to rear gear tables)

Firearms are to be Loaded and Unloaded ONLY on the Firing Line (forward wooden shooting Benches)

Muzzles are always to be pointed down range or upwards.

(magazine may be filled or emptied at the rear gear benches and tables).

“CEASE FIRE” ROUTINE/PROCEDURES:

Remove ammunition from the Chamber. Remove magazines from the action

Leave actions visibly open-(a chamber flag helps visibility!)

Then- **Your Choice:**

Leave firearm(muzzle pointed down range, magazine removed, action open) on FIRING LINE bench.

Or

Carry firearm muzzle up and place in rear wall rack- magazine removed action open.

Remember to take needed targets, tape, stapler, beverage, etc. with you when leaving the shooting bench area for the Cease Fire Period. (An RSO can retrieve forgotten items.)

During a Cease Fire DO NOT go within 3 metres of the firearms on the bench or handle firearms on the racks (Remember your P.A.L. Course). Do not touch anything on your shooting table. (An RSO can retrieve forgotten items).

During a Cease Fire the divided concrete slab area around the shooting benches is to be used to walk through only on the way to your target and back. Please remain off the shooting table area concrete during cease fire periods.

Your Cooperation is appreciated! Your Safety is our only concern!

Deer must be field dressed which means that the heart, liver and kidneys (edible portions) are the only internal organs which can be included when the animal is weighed. Deer must be weighed on Club scales by the caretaker or his designate.

The official weigher reserves the right to refuse weighing any deer which arrives in an unpresentable condition. Lungs must be removed and body cavity wiped dry with a rag or paper towels. Deer 160 pounds and over taken with a rifle and 140 pounds and over taken by bow and arrow must be witnessed by an executive member at time of weighing. Please contact the Club caretaker or Wayne Zaccarelli to make arrangements.

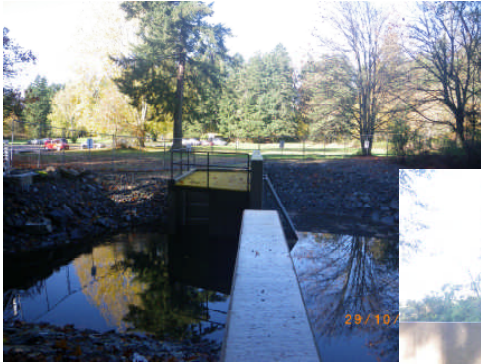

**FEDERAL GOVERNMENT ANNOUNCES SEP SALMON HATCHERY FUNDING**

On October 3, Fisheries & Oceans Minister Gail Shea announced on Vancouver Island an additional \$34.2 million over five years for the upgrade and renewal of salmon hatcheries and spawning channels operated by the federal government under the Salmonid Enhancement Program (SEP).

Of this total, \$13.8 million will go to refurbishing crucial water supply and delivery systems to all 16 major hatcheries and spawning channels. The balance, \$20.4 million, will be used to modernize and refurbish aging infrastructure at Bella Coola's Snootli Creek hatchery.

A \$14 million renovation of the Quinsam River hatchery was completed in 2014.

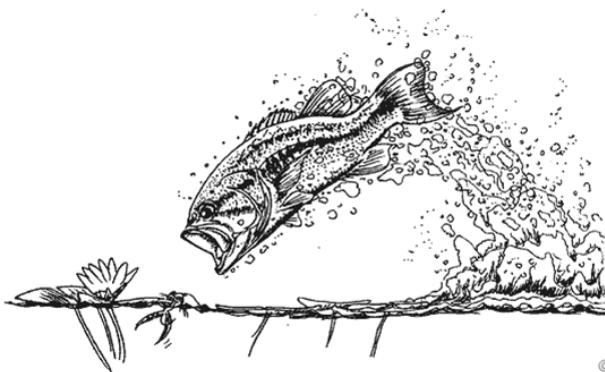
The Salmonid Enhancement Program was initiated in 1978 and is now 36 years old. SEP operates 23 salmon hatcheries and spawning channels in British Columbia.

COLQUITZ/CRAIGFLOWER COHO

With the recent frequent rains since mid October, Coho salmon have been moving into local creeks in good numbers. Craigflower received Coho starting October 22 with nine females and 19 jacks. The next day, October 23, saw a record number for one day. Three volunteers worked all day counting 574 Coho (268 females, 201 males and 105 jacks). November 04 was another good day with over 100 fish counted. The total for Craigflower Creek, as of November 04, was 1044 Coho (510 females, 360 males and 174 jacks). The total for Colquitz River, to the same date, was just over 500 fish.

Numerous Coho have been seen jumping in the Gorge Waterway over this time period. This has prompted many anglers to fish from both shore and boats with some success. The Amalgamated Conservation Society will be considering a motion to restrict angling to non-retention of Coho north of the Johnson Street bridge from September 15 to December 31, yearly. This has become necessary because of the increased angling effort seen this year and the potential for effort to further increase in following years. Unchecked, this could negatively impact stock rebuilding efforts of the many individuals and groups working on these two local watersheds.
