



## **BCWF NOTES**

## BCWF AGM 2015

This year, the AGM was sponsored by the Fernie Rod and Gun Club and staged in various facilities available in the town of Fernie. As I have come to expect, this event was well organized and featured a slate of speakers whose competence is well known. The theme of this AGM was "Ours Today, Theirs Tomorrow" – in obvious deference to the, at times desperate, need to conserve habitat and wildlife for our heirs.

## The resolutions summarized in the last newsletter were voted on and here are the results:

## 1. Conservative Approach To Hunting By First Nations

- Therefore be it resolved the BCWF lobby First Nations to take a more conservative to hunting by First Nations hunters all year round.

-Withdrawn.

### 2. Roberts Bank Terminal 2 Expansion

- Therefore be it resolved that the BCWF vehemently oppose this project through any and all means possible.
- Withdrawn

## 3. Agricultural Fencing

- Therefore be it resolved that agricultural fencing projects using public monies must include a one-way gate in the fence design preferably in an area for natural escapement.
- Be it further resolved that the Government encourage privately funded fencing projects include these gates in their design.
- Passed

### 4. Wild/Domestic sheep: Legislated Separation

- Therefore be it resolved that the Government must enable overarching legislation that will provide for effective means of separation between wild and domestic sheep to ensure healthy wild sheep populations in the long term.
- Passed

## 5. Wildlife Management Program

- Therefore be it resolved that the BCWF request the Government with the appropriate ministries develop and implement a predator management program. The intent of this program will allow predator species to be managed at desired levels allowing wild ungulate populations to increase and meet the harvest requirements of all B.C. hunters.

### - Passed

Two of the many good speakers who made presentations at the AGM were Don Peterson and Chief Joe Alphonse.

Don Peterson was the very capable President and one of the founding people of the Freshwater Fishing Society. He retired recently after guiding the Society through its formative years to become a model of resource management. For years the Society had requested that all the licence fees go to the support of the resource and this year the Government acceded to the request and granted the Society 100% of these fees – resulting in an increase of ~ \$1.7 million to the operation. As licence fees are its life blood, the Society created a group to encourage freshwater fishing – the Learn to Fish Society. Every year this group sends us 2 to 3 people to help us with our Discovery Day and other fishing events in Frog Hollow.

The model of the Society has been so successful that it is being studied in terms of its applicability to salt water fishing and hunting. I think it is generally appreciated that we need something better than what we have.

Chief Joe Alphonse is the chief of a Chilcotin First Nations band. In his studied, methodical way with a sense of humour he is a delightful and compelling speaker. Hunting is very important to his people and the disastrous decline in the moose population is having serious effects. The causes are manifold. To bring out beetle killed wood, many access roads have been built making much of the territory accessible to vehicles. Cow moose are being hunted. Predators are showing no decline in numbers. Poaching is common. In answer Chief Alphonse is closing off roads, telling his people cow moose are not to be hunted, trapping predators and dealing, at times harshly, with poachers. Chief Alphonse is the first to admit that First Nations people are playing a not insignificant role in the decline of the moose population. He chuckles that people have threatened to shoot him – but I suspect he can look after himself. To achieve its goals in conservation, the BCWF can do little better than ally itself with people such as Joe Alphonse and Stewart Phillip.

## JUNIORS PROGRAM

#### Shooting

The last Saturday in May marks the end of the Junior shooting program until the first Saturday after Labour Day in September.

This program is a joint effort between the VFGPA and the NSRG (North Saanich Rod and Gun club). Drop-in instruction and shooting are available on a no-cost basis most Saturdays from Sept. to June. Membership in either of the sponsoring clubs is not required.

Canadian Tire (Langford) will be sponsoring a shooting competition on Sunday, July the 5th for junior shooters between the ages of 9 and 18. Watch the VFGPA newsletter for more details. Significant prizes will be awarded to the winning shooters.

## **OUTDOOR PASSPORT PROGRAM**

BCWF has established a program to help BCWF members acquire permission to access and hunt on private lands. The Outdoor Passport Program provides an orientation on private land access obligations and requires participants to agree to the terms and conditions of the program.

Access to private land or across private lands to crown land has been a longstanding issue with individuals and land owners. Availability to private lands varies around the province depending on the land owners risk evaluation and how they manage the determined risk. At this point there is very limited public access to private lands.

The Outdoor Passport program provides a process to assist passport holders to acquire permission to access private lands that promotes a high level of voluntary self compliance. The process also addresses landowners concerns and risk management issues.

Everyone may access the course, but only BCWF members are permitted to take the exam at the completion of the course and qualify for a BCWF Outdoor Passport.







## SAFETY REMINDERS--PLEASE READ

## FIREARMS--CASES--BENCHES

Firearms are to be <u>cased</u> and <u>uncased</u> <u>ONLY</u> during Live Periods and <u>preferably</u> only at the Firing line (forward wooden benches) Actions open, Magazines removed (empty cases can be returned to rear gear tables)

Firearms are to be Loaded and Unloaded ONLY on the Firing Line (forward wooden shooting Benches)

Muzzles are always to be pointed down range or upwards.

(magazine may be filled or emptied at the rear gear benches and tables).

## **"CEASE FIRE" ROUTINE/PROCEDURES:**

Remove ammunition from the Chamber. Remove magazines from the action

Leave actions visibly open-(a chamber flag helps visibility!)

Then- Your Choice:

Leave firearm(muzzle pointed down range, magazine removed, action open) on FIRING LINE bench.

## Or

Carry firearm muzzle up and place in rear wall rack- magazine removed action open.

Remember to take needed targets, tape, stapler, beverage, etc. with you when leaving the shooting bench area for the <u>Cease Fire Period</u>. (An RSO can retrieve forgotten items.)

During a Cease Fire <u>DO NOT</u> go within 3 metres of the firearms on the bench or handle firearms on the racks (Remember your P.A.L. Course). Do not touch anything on your shooting table. (An RSO can retrieve forgotten items).

During a Cease Fire the divided concrete slab area around the shooting benches is to be used to **walk through only** on the way to your target and back. Please remain off the shooting table area concrete during cease fire periods.

## **BIG GAME RECORDS BOOKS**

Copies of the eighth edition (2010) of the Vancouver Island Columbian Blacktail Deer Records are available at a cost of \$5 each. The issue contains a brief history of the records which were started in 1972 by Byron Mason and Charles Veasey. Byron has written another excellent article on the history of hunting on Vancouver Island from 1900 to 1920. The previous seventh edition (2000) contained Byron's piece on Blacktail deer populations and hunting on Vancouver Island from 1843 to 1899.

The current records list 1824 entries scoring 100 or more Boone & Crockett points. Several old hunting photographs have been reproduced for the first time in the records booklet.

The most recent sixth edition (2010) of the Big Game Records of British Columbia is available for \$35 each. These are hard cover books containing records of all native big game species in B.C. Hunting stories, photographs and a listing, by species category, of entries meeting the minimum score requirements, are included.
