You cannot sign in anyone (for Free) on your Memberships. (if you don't have a Membership Card you have to have a Day-Pass displayed on you)

Sweeping your brass/steel/empty hulls off the concrete and/or leaving them on the ground is <u>not acceptable.</u> Please clean up after yourself. We have a lot of range users that do not know the rules (Day-Pass Users or New Members that haven't taken the mandatory "Orientation Course") please educate anyone not cleaning up after themselves. Extra buckets have been put at each range, these are not garbage buckets they are to be used for Brass Cartridges (recycle) on the R/P and M/P Range, shotgun shells on the S/G Range. All garbage (paper, plastic, cardboard) goes into the garbage cans.

Please print your Name/Member Number when you sign in, we **NEED** to be able to read what you **Write / Print**. **YOU MUST INITIAL THE ACKNOWLEDGEMENT THAT YOU KNOW THE RULES OF THE CLUB** If **7pm** is Closing Time the last shot is 6:30pm, you have 1/2 hr. to clean up and be past the main gate before it is locked. You need to be on the other side of the main gate by **7pm**. Range staff have already worked their 12-14 hours and would like to go home and see their families.





Breaking News - Timber West Provides Access

Reminder - Day Pass Fees for Non-Members

We offer a special day pass rate for BCWF members that they require a current BCWF card at time of purchase. We have the \$50 day pass, the \$25 guest pass, (accompanied by a member) and the \$20 special events pass (this is the one for BCWF members with valid ID). Day-Passes, to use the facilities, can be purchased at the sign-in booth or from the facility caretaker. Which will allow access to the Shotgun Range, the Rifle Range, and the Archery Range only. All range rules must be strictly followed. Non-Members must sign in with their Day-Pass number and keep and display the yellow copy of the day pass while using the range facilities. A Day pass can be used as credit towards a membership within 30 days of purchase (please check with the caretaker for details).

BC Rendezvous at Heffley Creek August 29-September7

Several VFGPA –Malahat Marauders attended the annual BC Provincial Rendezvous at the Heffley Creek Gun Club range north of Kamloops. This event is the largest black powder gathering in Western Canada, usually consisting of upwards of 130 camps (200-300 attendees), although this year attendance was down to only about 115 camps. There is plenty of space for both primitive camps and tin teepees (\$45 for the week). Drinking water is supplied, and hot showers are available for the price of a toonie. Attendees regularly come from BC, Alberta, Saskatchewan, Washington and Idaho, with occasional visitors from even farther afield.

As this rendezvous is of long duration, each day's activities are hosted by different clubs or individuals. Each day sees a morning and an afternoon BP event (entry \$5 per event)\\, plus children's activities every day. Most days have a rifle or Trade Gun (smoothbore) shoot, plus pistol, hawk and knife, shotgun or archery. One afternoon is set aside for trading (gun show). Participants can enter as many or as few as they wish. Some folks come just for the camp-out and opportunity to visit. Prizes are awarded daily at the evening council fire. Punishments for transgressions such as dry-balling or shooting your ramrod are also meted out at council, usually with much hilarity as transgressors try to talk their way out of wearing the 'Powder, Patch, Ball' bib, or the Bent Ramrod collar. The serious side of such awards is to remind folks to keep safety foremost in their minds.

Dog Spit (Sue Bender) and Merlin (Art Archer) have organized the 'Vancouver Island Pistol Trail' for the last couple of years. We usually see a pretty good turnout for this event, with 60 or so shooters on the line.

Federal Election Candidate Questions

With the Federal Election scheduled for October 19, 2015, we have a huge opportunity to find out more about the people who want to represent us in Ottawa and help inform each other about the candidates' positions on important issues related to fish, wildlife and habitat.

BCWF has compiled a list of questions that we think candidates in all ridings across BC should answer. The questions touch on issues related to hunting, fishing, trapping, firearms and habitat sustainability, among other things. But we need your help - because these questions will be most effective if they come from people in the candidates' own ridings.

You can ask these questions of the candidates by email, phone, visiting their constituency office and/or going to an all candidates' debate.

Federal Candidate Questions

- 1). How would you maintain and increase Canadians' priority access to fish, wildlife and wild spaces?
- 2). Do you support re-establishing the long gun registry or increasing the regulation of firearms or shooting sports?
- 3). How would you ensure financial compensation for fish and wildlife habitat to offset impacts from non-renewable resource extraction (i.e. pipelines)?
- 4). How would you increase science based management of natural resources and the ability of scientists to independently communicate their results?
- 5). How would you increase the capacity of Environment Canada and the Department of Fisheries and Oceans to manage fish, wildlife and their habitats in terms of legislation, organization and budget?
- 6). Do you support using all federal hunting and fishing licence fees and a national levy on hunting, fishing and outdoor equipment to be directed for firearms education, and fish, wildlife and habitat conservation?

BCWF is also forwarding these questions to the Leaders of the Federal Parties listed above. As the responses are returned from each political party, they will be posted on our website for you to view. In the meantime, please follow us on Twitter @BCWildlife and find us on Facebook and sign up for a profile to receive our member e-updates to stay up to date.

SAFETY REMINDERS--PLEASE READ

FIREARMS--CASES--BENCHES

Firearms are to be <u>cased</u> and <u>uncased</u> <u>ONLY</u> during Live Periods and <u>preferably</u> only at the Firing line (forward wooden benches) Actions open, Magazines removed (empty cases can be returned to rear gear tables)

Firearms are to be Loaded and Unloaded ONLY on the Firing Line (forward wooden shooting Benches)

Muzzles are always to be pointed down range or upwards.

(magazine may be filled or emptied at the rear gear benches and tables).

"CEASE FIRE" ROUTINE/PROCEDURES:

Remove ammunition from the Chamber. Remove magazines from the action

Leave actions visibly open-(a chamber flag helps visibility!)

Then- Your Choice:

Leave firearm(muzzle pointed down range, magazine removed, action open) on FIRING LINE bench.

Or

Carry firearm muzzle up and place in rear wall rack- magazine removed action open.

Remember to take needed targets, tape, stapler, beverage, etc. with you when leaving the shooting bench area for the Cease Fire Period. (An RSO can retrieve forgotten items.)

During a Cease Fire <u>DO NOT</u> go within 3 metres of the firearms on the bench or handle firearms on the racks (Remember your P.A.L. Course). Do not touch anything on your shooting table. (An RSO can retrieve forgotten items).

During a Cease Fire the divided concrete slab area around the shooting benches is to be used to <u>walk through</u> <u>only</u> on the way to your target and back. Please remain off the shooting table area concrete during cease fire periods.

Your Cooperation is appreciated! Your Safety is our only concern!

BIG GAME RECORDS BOOKS

Copies of the eighth edition (2010) of the Vancouver Island Columbian Blacktail Deer Records are available at a cost of \$5 each. The issue contains a brief history of the records which were started in 1972 by Byron Mason and Charles Veasey. Byron has written another excellent article on the history of hunting on Vancouver Island from 1900 to 1920. The previous seventh edition (2000) contained Byron's piece on Blacktail deer populations and hunting on Vancouver Island from 1843 to 1899.

The current records list 1824 entries scoring 100 or more Boone & Crockett points. Several old hunting photographs have been reproduced for the first time in the records booklet.

The most recent sixth edition (2010) of the Big Game Records of British Columbia is available for \$35 each. These are hard cover books containing records of all native big game species in B.C. Hunting stories, photographs and a listing, by species category, of entries meeting the minimum score requirements, are included.



Hunters are reminded that Blacktail deer taken in MU 1-1 through 1-13 by Victoria Fish & Game members are eligible for the five trophies available each year. Deer must be field dressed which means that the heart, liver and kidneys (edible portions) are the only internal organs which can be included when the animal is weighed. Deer must be weighed on Club scales by the caretaker or his designate.

The official weigher reserves the right to refuse weighing any deer which arrives in an unpresentable condition. Lungs must be removed and body cavity wiped dry with a rag or paper towels. Deer 160 pounds and over taken with a rifle and 140 pounds and over taken by bow and arrow must be witnessed by an executive member at time of weighing. Please contact the Club caretaker/manager or Wayne Zaccarelli to make arrangements. Hunters are reminded that access to club facilities is restricted to daylight hours with the gate locked progressively earlier through the hunting season. Please ensure that you confirm the time gates are locked and show up at least a half hour earlier.


