ACCESS ANNOUNCEMENT

We are excited to announce that Timber West has granted us access to their properties on Southern Vancouver Island through the Butler Main (Sooke) and Kapoor Main (west of Shawnigan Lake). Note, the two gates connect - you can travel through.

We plan to have the gates open for the hunting season as follows: Oct 17 & 18, Oct 31 and Nov 1; Nov 14 &15; Nov 28 & 29; and Dec 5 & 6.

We plan to have the gates open at the following times on the planned dates:

- ** Start of Day: from two hours before sunrise to one hour after sunrise;
- ** Mid Day: from 1100 to 1300 hours;
- ** End of Day: from one hour before sunset to two hours after sunset.

We will have a different schedule in the New Year.

We have arranged with Shadow Security to man the Butler Main Gate and we will open for additional weekends if we can get volunteers. Terrance Martin is our volunteer coordinator for this gate. He can be contacted at a5a14040@telus.net - please contact him to volunteer.

The Kapoor Main Gate will be primarily staffed with volunteers. Steve Hornick is our volunteer coordinator for the Kapoor Main Gate. Please contact him at shornick@shaw.ca to volunteer. We will open for additional weekends if we can get sufficient volunteers.

Access will only be granted if at least one member of the party can show they have a valid BCWF or Victoria Fish and Game Protective Association membership card. We will also be recording the vehicle license plate number, time in and out, purpose of access and harvest result (if applicable) (information to be recorded is subject to change).

No ATVs or unlicensed motor vehicles will be allowed access.

Your help is needed to make this program a success. Please be responsible users of the resource, and please volunteer so we maximize our opportunity to use this marvelous resource and keep it open for future generations.



Hello Members, a few house keeping items:

ALL NEW MEMBERS MUST TAKE THE ORIENTATION COURSE BEFORE THEY ARE ALLOWED TO USE THE CLUBS RANGES.

EVERYONE NEEDS TO SIGN IN WHEN AT THE RANGE, IF NOT YOU WILL BE KICKED OFF THE RANGE!!

You cannot sign in anyone (for Free) on your Memberships. (if you don't have a Membership Card you have to have a Day-Pass displayed on you)

Sweeping your brass/steel/empty hulls off the concrete and/or leaving them on the ground is <u>not acceptable</u>. Please clean up after yourself. We have a lot of range users that do not know the rules (Day-Pass Users or New Members that haven't taken the mandatory "Orientation Course") please educate anyone not cleaning up after themselves. Extra buckets have been put at each range, these are not garbage buckets they are to be used for Brass Cartridges (recycle) on the R/P and M/P Range, shotgun shells on the S/G Range. All garbage (paper, plastic, cardboard) goes into the garbage cans.

Please print your Name/Member Number when you sign in, we **NEED** to be able to read what you **Write / Print. YOU MUST INITIAL THE ACKNOWLEDGEMENT THAT YOU KNOW THE RULES OF THE CLUB**

If **7pm** is Closing Time the last shot is 6:30pm, you have 1/2 hr. to clean up and be past the main gate before it is locked. You need to be on the other side of the main gate by **7pm**. Range staff have already worked their 12-14 hours and would like to go home and see their families.



Reminder - Day Pass Fees for Non-Members






SKEET AND 5- STAND NOTICE

VFGPA FIRED RANGE BRASS PROGRAM

Since Art Archer has been chairing the club's fired range brass program for about 10 years now I've offered to give him a well-deserved break and I will now take those duties over from him. (Maybe now he'll actually get a bit more time to go up to the club and SHOOT a bit more?)

Art has put a TON of work into this program over the years and spent countless hours sorting out buckets and buckets of brass from the dirt and scrap paper mixed in with them and then sorted them again by calibre and brand to offer them to our club members that reload at rock bottom prices. (Try and find rifle calibre commercial brass cases for reloading at 10 cents a round anywhere else ...) The .22 rimfire brass, "mangled" brass, military brass, and berdan primed brass cases were also separated from the reloadable brass and taken down to a local scrapyard to be sold as scrap brass.

Under Art's ongoing chairmanship of our very successful fired range brass program the club has received many thousands of dollars in additional revenue and we definitely owe Art a HUGE vote of thanks for all of his efforts over the years. Many thanks again Art and we sure hope that you enjoy getting a bit of a break from the range brass chores.


I'm planning to keep an ongoing computer inventory of the range brass as an MS Excel database and I can email that list to any of the members who are interested in what we might have available for sale. I'll edit the list as we sell the brass and as I get more in from the range to add to the file and then I'll send the edited list out to everyone on a regular basis. If you'd like me to add you to that email list please send me an email with "range brass" in the header and I'll add you to our brass subscription list. (I'll be sending these emails out as "BCC's" so your email addresses will not be shared with others which should help prevent any SPAM emails.)

We get fairly large quantities of 9mm, .40 S&W, and .223 Remington brass and it often "stacks up" to the point where it quite often ends up going to the scrapyard. With that in mind, we're going to drop the price on those particular calibres down to 5 cents per round (\$25 per 500 / \$50 per 1,000) to help keep them moving faster rather than scrapping the excess quantities we often have on hand. All other regular and magnum rifle calibres will remain at only 10 cents per round which I feel is still very reasonable these days considering the cost of buying new brass ... if and when you can find it! Entrance fees will be \$25.00 for first shooter, \$15.00 for second family shooter.


Camping will be available for those wishing to camp out.

GUN CONTROL AND THIS ELECTION!!

The upcoming Federal election will be the most important one ever held in respect to the future of firearms ownership in Canada.

The NDP, Liberal and Green Party are all in agreement: Canada needs more gun control! All three parties will overturn the Conservatives Bill C42, the "Common Sense Firearms" Act. The NDP, Liberals and Greens will begin an aggressive campaign of reclassifications and confiscation of firearms they do not like, such as the Swiss Green, CZ and many other semi automatic rifles, and possibly <u>all</u> semi-automatics. These positions are included in their published Party Platforms.

All three parties will sign the UN Arms Trade Treaty which will limit the legal ownership of firearms, and restrict the ability of hunters, collectors and competitors to legally own and use firearms. The UN calls them "end point users". If the UN International Arms Trade Treaty is signed, it becomes International Law and can never be revoked.

The legal legitimate ownership of firearms for recreation and defence has been a part of the cultural fabric of Canada since the early 1600's.

The Party you vote for on October 19, 2015 will affect the Victoria Fish & Game Protective Association and our firearms owning future forever.

Conservative Party Stance on Firearms

96. Firearms

A Conservative Government is committed to cost-effective gun control programs designed to keep guns out of the hands of criminals while respecting the rights of law-abiding Canadians to own and use firearms responsibly.

Measures will include: mandatory minimum sentences for the criminal use of firearms; strict monitoring of high-risk individuals; increased enforcement and prosecution of smuggling; safe storage provisions; firearms safety training; a certification screening system for all those wishing to acquire firearms legally; and putting more law enforcement officers on our streets.

We recognize the legitimacy of private ownership of firearms and will resist any domestic or international pressure to the contrary.

Green Party Stance on Firearms

4.11.8 Gun control and ownership rights

Police associations across Canada have asserted that the gun registry helped keep law and order and save lives. Many rural Canadians and First Nations people found the gun registry restrictions onerous and discriminatory. We always believed compromise was possible in reforming the registry to accommodate the concerns of legal gun users while ensuring that law enforcement agencies had the tools they needed. We need to better balance these interests without allowing guns to be prevalent in society.

It is time to crack down on gun smuggling across the U.S. border. Thousands of handguns are coming across the border and into our urban centres. We need to work with each of the U.S. border states to press for action against gun smugglers and invest in tougher border measures to halt the movement of illegal firearms. The risks created by having dangerous weapons in our urban centres are significant. We will introduce balanced and fair measures to ban handguns and semi-automatic firearms. However, the use of guns in our urban centres is typically not the same as the use of guns in our rural communities. We will ensure that law-abiding citizens pursuing legal activities in hunting with long guns are free from unreasonable fees and the threat of criminalization.

Green Party MPs will:

- Provide increased support for Integrated Border Enforcement Teams made up of officers from the RCMP, Canada Border Services, U.S. Customs, and the U.S. Coast Guard in their gathering of intelligence and arresting of gun smugglers;
- Put strict measures in place for those who attempt to cross the Canada/U.S. border with illegal firearms. Ensure that gun smuggling is prosecuted as a gun crime of the highest order rather than as a customs violation;
- Fulfill Canada's obligation under international agreements (United Nations Firearms Protocol and the Organization of American States Firearms Convention) to mark all imported firearms, as recommended by the Canadian Association of Police Boards and the Canadian Association of Chiefs of Police;
- Ensure that gun crime charges are not dropped to facilitate convictions on lesser charges;
- Work hard to create a registration system that is fair, free, and easy to use. Streamline the gun registry in consultation with First Nations, and with gun sports and hunter organizations. We support the elimination of registration fees for hunting rifles and will ensure law-abiding citizens do not have their firearms confiscated;
- Ban handguns and combat weapons, including semi-automatic rifles and assault rifles. Eliminate their use through consultation and a full buy-back program. Consult especially with holders of collections to ensure guns are rendered non-functional to eliminate usefulness to thieves, and with target shooters to establish safe and protected locations where target shooting can be practiced.

CHAPTER 4: A STRONG CANADA

We will take action to get handguns and assault weapons off our streets. Over the last decade, Stephen Harper has steadily weakened our gun laws in ways that make Canadians more vulnerable and communities more dangerous. We will take pragmatic action to make it harder for criminals to get, and use, handguns and assault weapons.

We will:

- repeal changes made by Bill C-42 that allow restricted and prohibited weapons to be freely transported without a permit, and we will put decision-making about weapons restrictions back in the hands of police, not politicians;
- provide \$100 million each year to the provinces and territories to support guns and gangs police task forces to take illegal guns off our streets and reduce gang violence;
- modify the membership of the Canadian Firearms Advisory Committee to include knowledgeable law enforcement officers, public health advocates, representatives from women's groups, and members of the legal community;
- require enhanced background checks for anyone seeking to purchase a handgun or other restricted firearm;
- require purchasers of firearms to show a license when they buy a gun, and require all sellers of firearms to confirm that the license is valid before completing the sale;
- require firearms vendors to keep records of all firearms inventory and sales to assist police in investigating firearms trafficking and other gun crimes;
- immediately implement the imported gun marking regulations that have been repeatedly delayed by Stephen Harper; and
- as part of our investment in border infrastructure, invest in technologies to enhance our border guards' ability to detect and halt illegal guns from the United States entering into Canada. We will not create a new national long-gun registry to replace the one that has been dismantled. We will ensure that Canada becomes a party to the international Arms Trade Treaty.

New Democratic Party

While no official stance or platform has been made public for the current election as of October 7, 2015, in the past the NDP have been proponent of stringent gun control and prohibition of firearms.

A picture of a "duck-goose", "Guck", or "Doose"...what's in a name, eh?

We live in a floathome at Fisherman's Wharf, Victoria and have done so for eight years. During this time I've observed hundreds of Canada Geese come to the small cove next to us to feed at low tide. Never before have I seen a "duck-goose" either here in Victoria, nor in my years growing up on an Alberta farm, nor as a hunter...maybe bred with another breed of goose somewhere back in it's lineage....who knows.



These are provisions in the C-68 firearms regulations for dealing with firearms from an estate.

You can be queath firearms from an estate in the same way as any other items of value in the estate and they can be listed individually if they are going to multiple recipients (such as my .45 Colt handgun goes to Joe, my 12 gauge Remington shotgun goes to Ralph, my .223 Remington target rifle goes to Jane, etc.) or they could be left as a complete group of guns to one individual (my wish is that all of my currently owned firearms at the time of my passing are to go to Jane). A provision can be written into your Will for firearms (the same as any other estate items) that "if Joe, Ralph or Jane pre-decease me then my wish is that any of my currently owned firearms that were to be passed on to them should instead be bequeathed to the VG&GPA". If firearms are given to the club as a donation or bequeathed from an estate the club can then decide if they want to sell them to raise funds or keep them for club use (Youth and Family Discovery Day or other events), or keep them for historical value if they are firearms that have more historical value than shooting value. By the way, the VF&GPA does hold a Firearms Business License and all of the firearms that the club owns (many of which were from donations by members or from estates) form part of the club's business inventory and are club assets, so it is a simple process for the club to accept donated or estate firearms. As a side note, estate donations to the club wouldn't need to be limited to just firearms and we have had past members donate funds to the club as well. In the same manner if a person felt strongly enough that they wanted to support the club after they have passed away then virtually any estate items could be donated to the club (vehicles, property, etc.) and the club could then liquidate those bequeathed items to generate revenue for the club.

In addition, the executor (or executors if it is shared with others) named in the will are given a "grace period" of about 1 year to deal with any firearms in an estate. The executor(s) do NOT require a PAL or any sort of special licensing to have possession of estate firearms while they are dealing with them for the estate. This means that the executor does NOT have to turn firearms over to the police or Firearms Officer if they do not hold a PAL or RPAL license. (In some cases the police have called to tell family members that they need to come to the home and seize estate firearms, which is completely false!) The executor can possess estate firearms in ANY categories such as non-restricted, restricted, and even Prohibited categories while disposing of them for the estate. It is the responsibility of the executor to ensure that the guns are securely stored in accordance with the current storage regulations. (The guns must be stored unloaded and secured in such a manner that they are not accessible to any other family members who are not currently licensed for those categories of guns.)

SAFETY REMINDERS--PLEASE READ

FIREARMS--CASES--BENCHES

Firearms are to be <u>cased</u> and <u>uncased</u> <u>ONLY</u> during Live Periods and <u>preferably</u> only at the Firing line (forward wooden benches) Actions open, Magazines removed (empty cases can be returned to rear gear tables)

Firearms are to be Loaded and Unloaded ONLY on the Firing Line (forward wooden shooting Benches)

Muzzles are always to be pointed down range or upwards.

(magazine may be filled or emptied at the rear gear benches and tables).

"CEASE FIRE" ROUTINE/PROCEDURES:

Remove ammunition from the Chamber. Remove magazines from the action

Leave actions visibly open-(a chamber flag helps visibility!)

Then- Your Choice:

Leave firearm(muzzle pointed down range, magazine removed, action open) on FIRING LINE bench.

Or

Carry firearm muzzle up and place in rear wall rack- magazine removed action open.

Remember to take needed targets, tape, stapler, beverage, etc. with you when leaving the shooting bench area for the Cease Fire Period. (An RSO can retrieve forgotten items.)

During a Cease Fire <u>DO NOT</u> go within 3 metres of the firearms on the bench or handle firearms on the racks (Remember your P.A.L. Course). Do not touch anything on your shooting table. (An RSO can retrieve forgotten items).

During a Cease Fire the divided concrete slab area around the shooting benches is to be used to <u>walk through</u> <u>only</u> on the way to your target and back. Please remain off the shooting table area concrete during cease fire periods.

BIG GAME RECORDS BOOKS

Copies of the eighth edition (2010) of the Vancouver Island Columbian Blacktail Deer Records are available at a cost of \$5 each. The issue contains a brief history of the records which were started in 1972 by Byron Mason and Charles Veasey. Byron has written another excellent article on the history of hunting on Vancouver Island from 1900 to 1920. The previous seventh edition (2000) contained Byron's piece on Blacktail deer populations and hunting on Vancouver Island from 1843 to 1899.

The current records list 1824 entries scoring 100 or more Boone & Crockett points. Several old hunting photographs have been reproduced for the first time in the records booklet.

The most recent sixth edition (2010) of the Big Game Records of British Columbia is available for \$35 each. These are hard cover books containing records of all native big game species in B.C. Hunting stories, photographs and a listing, by species category, of entries meeting the minimum score requirements, are included.



VICTORIA FISH & GAME ANNUAL BIG GAME COMPETITION

Hunters are reminded that Blacktail deer taken in MU 1-1 through 1-13 by Victoria Fish & Game members are eligible for the five trophies available each year. Deer must be field dressed which means that the heart, liver and kidneys (edible portions) are the only internal organs which can be included when the animal is weighed. Deer must be weighed on Club scales by the caretaker or his designate.

The official weigher reserves the right to refuse weighing any deer which arrives in an unpresentable condition. Lungs must be removed and body cavity wiped dry with a rag or paper towels. Deer 160 pounds and over taken with a rifle and 140 pounds and over taken by bow and arrow must be witnessed by an executive member at time of weighing. Please contact the Club caretaker/manager or Wayne Zaccarelli to make arrangements. Hunters are reminded that access to club facilities is restricted to daylight hours with the gate locked progressively earlier through the hunting season. Please ensure that you confirm the time gates are locked and show up at least a half hour earlier.

TIMES-COLONIST REPORTS CRD INVOLVEMENT IN WATERSHED MANAGEMENT PLAN

Recent Victoria Times-Colonist articles and editorials from September 27-29 have noted the CRD staff recommendation to hire a half-time coordinator for four years - at a cost, including operating funds, of \$122,000 a year - to oversee the implementation of a watershed management plan. Staff are also seeking \$200,000 in additional funding to buy a weed harvester to replace the one that was retired in 2013, stating that reduction of lake weeds would improve water quality.

Various government agencies are responsible for the management of the lake and adjacent area. The CRD is responsible for the surrounding park lands, the province owns the lake bottom and water column while Transport Canada manages activities on the lake surface. The watershed lies predominantly within the District of Saanich and Island Health monitors the lakeshore for health concerns.
