BCWF Zone 1 AGM

The BCWF Zone 1 AGM was held on the weekend of April 2 &3/16 at the VGPA clubhouse. Attendance was typical at approx. 35 people. Club member Marc Fournier, helped by family members, provided food for both days. They did an excellent job which was very much appreciated.

Besides the election of a new slate of Directors a variety of issues were discussed.

Included were – Elk Lake study HCTF

Kid's Camp Allocations

Aboriginal Relations Forestry and Wildlife (esp elk)

Access Fish and Fishing

Resolutions (BCWF AGM) HCTF

Shooting Range vs Development Issues

BCWF Zone 1

Kid's Camp

Kid's Camp will again be offered by Zone 1 and will be held at the Courtenay Fish and Game club. The dates are July 18 to 21/16. There is no charge to attend the camp but parents must deliver and pick up their children on the appropriate days. Boys and girls who are related to a VFGPA member and are between the ages of 10 and 14 are eligible to attend. Applications for this camp must go through the VFGPA. The VFGPA has positions for 2 children to attend but will send in the names of 4 to 5 children as other clubs frequently do not meet their allowable number. Applications are remitted on a first come – first served basis and must be received by May 31/16.

However, despite the above rules, it has always been the policy of the club to make every effort to send disadvantaged children who are known to club members. The VFGPA will look after all aspects of what is required to allow such children to attend.

BCWF AGM

As must be well known by now, the provincial body of the B.C. Wildlife Federation (BCWF) will be holding its AGM in Nanaimo on April 21 to 23/16. It will seldom be cheaper to attend so please consider it.

Every member organization of the BCWF has the right to submit issues they consider to be of such importance that they require the consideration and possible adoption by the BCWF as a whole. Such resolutions will have been reviewed by BCWF committee and accepted for presentation at the AGM where they will be discussed by all and voted on.

The following is a summary of resolutions to be considered at the 2016 AGM.

Special Resolution01/16 – Changes in BCWF By Laws

The purpose of this resolution is to allow member clubs to set up a schedule for the payment of BCWF dues that matches the ability of the member club to pay. At the moment, member clubs must pay membership dues at the end of the year in one lump sum.

Administration01/16 – BCWF Resolution Process

At present, resolutions which were passed at convention must be reported on by the Federation to the sponsoring body and all member clubs. The final disposition and all actions taken for or against all resolutions must be reported on within 9 months of being passed. As this is not being done, this resolution will require formal reviews and reporting procedures from initiation to completion. All actions on resolutions must be reported within 3 months and at intervals of 3 months thereafter until instituted or concluded.

Firearms 01/16 – Partnership Among Shooting Sports Organizations

In the opinion of many, the Federal Government does not recognize the shooting sports as legitimate sports and further restrictions on firearms use are on the Government's agenda. As the BCWF has recently formed a Recreational Shooting Sports Committee this resolution is urging it and all other shooting, hunting and conservation organizations to partner in a common front in consulting with the Government in order to achieve reasonable firearms legislation.

Aboriginal Relations 01/16 – Wildlife Management

In the opinion of many, the management of our fish, wildlife and habitat is the responsibility of all and must be a priority. However, at present, the harvest is uncontrolled and unreported – a situation which is not sustainable. As the Province of British Columbia has shown an unwillingness and/or an inability to manage its wild resources, this resolution backs the creation of a working alliance between the First Nations and the BCWF to create a science based management system that will ensure a positive future for the wildlife of B.C.

Aboriginal Relations 02/16 – First nations Land Claims and Communications

Land claim negotiations are, for the most part, between three levels of Government - Provincial, Federal and First Nations. As the terms in some of these treaties may be precedent setting and non-native hunters, fishers and recreationists are poorly represented in the negotiations, there is concern that their interests are not being addressed. This resolution would direct the BCWF to review the structure of its website so that all information on the treaty process is readily available in a timely fashion.

Wildlife 01/16 – Sunrise/Sunset Regulation Change

At the moment, legal shooting hours in B.C. for large and small game are one hour before sunrise to one hour after sunset. However, for migratory birds, legal shooting hours are from one-half (1/2) hour before sunrise to one-half (1/2) hour after sunset. It is felt by some that the posting of shooting hours on the internet has created confusion and, in addition, the longer hours allowed for the hunting of large and small game is disrespectful of these species. It is further felt that coordinating shooting hours by decreasing the allowable time for hunting large and small game to one-half (1/2) hour before sunrise to one-half (1/2) hour after sunset will alleviate these problems.

Fisheries 01/16 – Skeena Drainage Proposed Steelhead Kill Fishery

It has been requested that a harvest of wild steelhead in the Skeena Drainage system be allowed. However, there are others who say that the data to support such a harvest is incomplete and dated. As the Province has not allocated any funds to complete past studies which would confirm the viability of steelhead stocks in the Skeena system this resolution directs the BCWF to not support a harvest.

Administration 02/16 – Motion To Elect Regional Presidents

At the moment, those elected as President of a Regional Wildlife Association of the Federation automatically become a Director of the Federation. However, as these Regional Presidents were not elected by the general membership, they must be considered appointees – but additional Directors cannot exceed 1/3 of elected Directors. Therefore, at the BCWF 2016 AGM all Regional Presidents (10) will be elected to the Board for a one year term.

ALL NEW MEMBERS MUST TAKE THE ORIENTATION COURSE BEFORE THEY ARE ALLOWED TO USE THE CLUBS RANGES.

EVERYONE NEEDS TO SIGN IN WHEN AT THE RANGE!!

You cannot sign in anyone (for Free) on your Memberships. (if you don't have a Membership Card you have to have a Day-Pass displayed on you)

Sweeping your brass/steel/empty hulls off the concrete and/or leaving them on the ground is <u>not acceptable.</u> Please clean up after yourself. We have a lot of range users that do not know the rules (Day-Pass Users or New Members that haven't taken the mandatory "Orientation Course") please educate anyone not cleaning up after themselves. Extra buckets have been put at each range, these are not garbage buckets they are to be used for Brass Cartridges (recycle) on the R/P and M/P Range, shotgun shells on the S/G Range. All garbage (paper, plastic, cardboard) goes into the garbage cans.

Please print your Name/Member Number when you sign in, we **NEED** to be able to read what you **Write / Print**. **YOU MUST INITIAL THE ACKNOWLEDGEMENT THAT YOU KNOW THE RULES OF THE CLUB** If **6pm** is Closing Time the last shot is **5:30pm**, you have 1/2 hr. to clean up and be past the main gate before it is locked. You need to be on the other side of the main gate by **6pm**. Range staff have already worked their 12-14 hours to 8 hours and would like to go home and see their families.

The BCWF Hunters Knife

The Story behind the BCWF Hunters Knife

In the summer of 2013, the late Rick Mayor, BCWF Vice President at the time, got together with knife maker Peter Demmer from Terrier Blades, and they worked together to design a new knife model which Rick thought should be the BCWF exclusive Hunters Knife. Rick's idea was that the BCWF should have their own exclusive hunting knife, an icon for the avid B.C. hunter, made from high quality materials with a very unique design. Rick's experience as an avid outdoors man and hunter was incorporated into the design.

It took several meetings and discussions until Rick was finally happy with the design and three prototypes were made. Rick presented the prototypes to the BCWF Board of Directors ahead of the 2013 AGM. Unfortunately events in Rick's life prevented him from finishing this project, as he passed away later that year.





To celebrate the BC Wildlife Federations 60th Anniversary, and to honour Rick's memory, we have created two editions of the BCWF Hunters Knife based on Rick and Peter's vision.

The BCWF Hunters Knife comes in a Limited Edition version and an Outdoors version. Both are well suited and designed for the rough outdoors. Handmade with the highest quality materials they represent the old hunter's idea of a knife that lasts a lifetime, which can be passed down to future generations.

The knife features a richly colored Arbutus handle. Rick himself proposed Arbutus as it is one of the most distinct trees in the coastal part of our province. However Arbutus is a natural, very hard and dense wood so it will need some care when exposed to the elements; periodical cleaning and slightly oiling it with good wood/furniture oil is recommended.

- * The sheath is genuine leather



SAFETY REMINDERS--PLEASE READ

FIREARMS--CASES--BENCHES

- * Firearms are to be <u>cased</u> and <u>uncased</u> <u>ONLY</u> during Live Periods and <u>preferably</u> only at the Firing line (forward wooden benches) Actions open, Magazines removed (empty cases can be returned to rear gear tables)
- * Firearms are to be Loaded and Unloaded ONLY on the Firing Line (forward wooden shooting Benches)
- * Muzzles are <u>always</u> to be pointed down range or upwards. (magazine may be filled or emptied at the rear gear benches and tables).

"CEASE FIRE" ROUTINE/PROCEDURES:

- * Remove ammunition from the Chamber. Remove magazines from the action
- * Leave actions visibly open-(a chamber flag helps visibility!)
 Then- Your Choice:
- * Leave firearm(muzzle pointed down range, magazine removed, action open) on FIRING LINE bench.

Or

- * Carry firearm muzzle up and place in rear wall rack- magazine removed action open.
- * Remember to take needed targets, tape, stapler, beverage, etc. with you when leaving the shooting bench area for the Cease Fire Period. (An RSO can retrieve forgotten items.)
- * During a Cease Fire <u>DO NOT</u> go within 3 metres of the firearms on the bench or handle firearms on the racks(Remember your P.A.L. Course). Do not touch anything on your shooting table. (An RSO can retrieve forgotten items).
- * During a Cease Fire the divided concrete slab area around the shooting benches is to be used to <u>walk</u> <u>through only</u> on the way to your target and back. Please remain off the shooting table area concrete during cease fire periods.

Safety Tip

Each Range has a Perimeter Flag. If the Red Flag is in the UP position that is a indicator that the range is active. Even if their is a cease fire shooting can start at anytime.

It is a good idea to put your Hearing Protection on at the Perimeter Flag before you get to the active range. (Range Rules require that hearing and eye protection be worn on the Ranges.)

The Federal Licensing Course suggest you wear both in ear and outside ear protection, another option is the "Electronics Earmuffs" Good Christmas List need item.

Once your hearing is damage it cannot be fixed and it does not repair itself.



Fired Range Brass Program reminder!

Just a reminder to our members to only put fired pistol and rifle cartridge cases (brass or steel) into the plastic range brass buckets. I just spent a few hours pre-sorting through 10 buckets of brass to remove the plastic shot shell hulls, used paper targets, empty cardboard ammo boxes, plastic ammo trays, used earplugs (LOTS of those), used Kleenex, and other misc garbage that should NOT be put in the brass buckets. Please use the provided garbage cans on our ranges for your garbage and ONLY put your fired rifle and pistol cartridge cases in the buckets provided for range brass. It will definitely help to make my job a lot easier ... and a lot less disgusting. It is a fairly time consuming job to separate and sort all of the various calibres of brass to make them available to the members that reload, but it makes it far more time consuming when I have to pre-sort all of the garbage out of the brass buckets first.

BIG GAME RECORDS BOOKS

Copies of the ninth edition (2016) of the Vancouver Island Columbian Blacktail Deer

Records are available at a cost of \$10 each. The publication contains an excellent article written by Byron Mason on fifty years with the deer in the Nimpkish Valley. Byron relates the impact of wolf and cougar predation on deer population abundance and hence, hunting success. He also includes 45 years of deer count data from 1970 through 2015.

There is also an article on early cougar hunting where the provincial government paid a bounty of varying amounts on cougars taken between 1870 and 1958. The new edition contains numerous colour photographs of harvested deer as well as record heads and antlers.

Copies of the previous eighth edition (2010) are still available at a cost of \$5.00.

The current records list over 2160 entries scoring 100 or more Boone & Crockett points.

Of particular note is the re-scoring of the Norm Hammond buck from 1942. These antlers were the number two head in the previous eighth edition (2010) scoring 139 7/8.

Following a request from the current owner, it was panel scored in March 2015 and is now ranked as the number one Vancouver Island deer with a score of 143 5/8.



NEW VANCOUVER ISLAND DEER BOOK

Copies of the ninth edition (2016) of the Vancouver Island Columbian Blacktail Deer Records are available at a cost of \$10 each. The publication contains an excellent article written by Byron Mason on fifty years with the deer in the Nimpkish Valley. Byron relates the impact of wolf and cougar predation on deer population abundance and hence, hunting success. He also includes 45 years of deer count data from 1970 through 2015.

There is also an article on early cougar hunting where the provincial government paid a bounty of varying amounts on cougars taken between 1870 and 1958. The new edition contains numerous colour photographs of harvested deer as well as record heads and antlers.

Copies of the previous eighth edition (2010) are still available at a cost of \$5.00.



The current records list over 2160 entries scoring 100 or more Boone & Crockett points.

Of particular note is the re-scoring of the Norm Hammond buck from 1942. These antlers were the number two head in the previous eighth edition (2010) scoring 139 7/8.

ELK / BEAVER LAKE WATER QUALITY INITIATIVE

The Victoria Fish & Game supported the Elk/Beaver Lake Water Quality Initiative with donations totaling \$5000 in 2015. A lake sampling program has been in place for over a year, several reports have been completed and a public meeting has been held with over 200 attending.

The process is now approaching the determination of which treatment application will be tried to permanently reduce the soluble phosphorous within the lake. The provincial Ministry of Environment has requested contributions towards the \$6000 estimated cost of a sediment fractionation analysis. Sediment fractionation is the determination of the mobile fraction of phosphorous in the lake sediments that moves back and forth between the sediment and the lake water.


This analysis plays an important part in determining whether the \$1.7 million Phoslock treatment recommended in the recently released consultants report will likely be successful in improving water quality within Elk/Beaver Lake. Pursuing the analysis does not mean the agency steering committee (ie. CRD, MOE, FLNRO, Saanich) has decided to use Phoslock, just that the committee recognizes the utility of having a better estimate of the potential cost of this remediation method. Phoslock is a bentanite clay product which permanently binds the soluble phosphorous within the sediment so that it is not available in high concentrations for the growth of nuisance algae.

The VFGPA executive and directors approved a \$1000 donation at their April 03 meeting in support of this proposed sediment fractionation analysis.

Mr. Minister:

The Amalgamated Conservation Society has eleven member associations representing over 4500 recreational anglers on southern Vancouver Island. It has come to our attention that lobbying efforts by First Nations on the lower Fraser River are being directed at completely closing the recreational salmon fishery during the months of May and June within portions of Area 19 and 20 off Victoria and Sooke.

This calculated lobbying effort is causing great angst among all concerned recreational anglers as well as those businesses that rely on this fishery. This fishery also supports a First Nations coastal marina and boat launch ramp which generates thousands of dollars over this time period.

This local Chinook fishery intercepts few fish of the stocks of concern. This is because of regulations demanded by First Nations and put in place by DFO since 2008 in consultation with the Victoria area Sport Fishing Advisory Committee. Anglers are restricted to two Chinook per day with no wild (unclipped) fish over 67 cm. These regulations are aimed at reducing our harvest rate on these Fraser River stocks of concern; which is now below 2%. The major contributor to our fishery at this time of year remains Puget Sound (U.S.A.) hatchery Chinook. Our access to these fish would be eliminated with a two month closure in May and June.

These Fraser River Chinook stocks of concern are being protected by our local recreational fishery. However, the major impact on these fish occurs as a result of inriver fisheries. Because of the negligible number of these fish caught by recreational anglers in the Victoria-Sooke area, a complete closure would have little benefit to the rebuilding of the stocks. This is especially so if a recreational fishing closure results in the re-allocation of these Chinook to other fisheries.

SOOKE RIVER CHINOOK REVITALIZATION INITIATIVE

The South Vancouver Island Anglers' Coalition (SVIAC) has developed a multi-year plan proposal which they are calling the Sooke River Chinook Revitalization Initiative. The plan calls for the net pen rearing and release of up to one million Chinook smolts in the Sooke area annually. Recent years Sooke River Chinook escapement has ranged from 350 to 500 fish, although 700 were recorded in 2015. Escapement has been as high as 2500 in the past. The plan calls for the Nitinat Hatchery to take an additional 500,000 Chinook eggs in the fall of 2016. These will have a unique oto-lith mark applied and 100,000 fry will be coded wire tagged (CWT). In the spring of 2017 all these fry will be net pen reared in the Sooke area for about three weeks before release. The genetics of the Sooke and Nitinat stocks are very similar. The year one project cost is estimated to be around \$120,000.




