Hello Members, a few house keeping items:

ALL NEW MEMBERS MUST TAKE THE ORIENTATION COURSE BEFORE THEY ARE ALLOWED TO USE THE CLUBS RANGES.

EVERYONE NEEDS TO SIGN IN WHEN AT THE RANGE!!

You cannot sign in anyone (for Free) on your Memberships. (if you don't have a Membership Card you have to have a Day-Pass displayed on you)

Sweeping your brass/steel/empty hulls off the concrete and/or leaving them on the ground is <u>not</u> <u>acceptable.</u> Please clean up after yourself. We have a lot of range users that do not know the rules (Day-Pass Users or New Members that haven't taken the mandatory "Orientation Course") please educate anyone not cleaning up after themselves. Extra buckets have been put at each range, these are not garbage buckets they are to be used for Brass Cartridges (recycle) on the R/P and M/P Range, shotgun shells on the S/G Range. All garbage (paper, plastic, cardboard) goes into the garbage cans.

Please print your Name/Member Number when you sign in, we **NEED** to be able to read what you **Write / Print**. **YOU MUST INITIAL THE ACKNOWLEDGEMENT THAT YOU KNOW THE RULES OF THE CLUB** If **6pm** is Closing Time the last shot is **5:30pm**, you have 1/2 hr. to clean up and be past the main gate before it is locked. You need to be on the other side of the main gate by **6pm**. Range staff have already worked their 12-14 hours to 8 hours and would like to go home and see their families.

Fired Range Brass Program reminder!

Just a reminder to our members to only put fired pistol and rifle cartridge cases (brass or steel) into the plastic range brass buckets. I just spent a few hours pre-sorting through 10 buckets of brass to remove the plastic shot shell hulls, used paper targets, empty cardboard ammo boxes, plastic ammo trays, used earplugs (LOTS of those), used Kleenex, and other misc garbage that should NOT be put in the brass buckets. Please use the provided garbage cans on our ranges for your garbage and ONLY put your fired rifle and pistol cartridge cases in the buckets provided for range brass. It will definitely help to make my job a lot easier ... and a lot less disgusting. It is a fairly time consuming job to separate and sort all of the various calibres of brass to make them available to the members that reload, but it makes it far more time consuming when I have to pre-sort all of the garbage out of the brass buckets first.

BIG GAME RECORDS BOOKS

Copies of the ninth edition (2016) of the Vancouver Island Columbian Blacktail Deer

Records are available at a cost of \$10 each. The publication contains an excellent article written by Byron Mason on fifty years with the deer in the Nimpkish Valley. Byron relates the impact of wolf and cougar predation on deer population abundance and hence, hunting success. He also includes 45 years of deer count data from 1970 through 2015.

There is also an article on early cougar hunting where the provincial government paid a bounty of varying amounts on cougars taken between 1870 and 1958. The new edition contains numerous colour photographs of harvested deer as well as record heads and antlers.

Copies of the previous eighth edition (2010) are still available at a cost of \$5.00.

The current records list over 2160 entries scoring 100 or more Boone & Crockett points.

Of particular note is the re-scoring of the Norm Hammond buck from 1942. These antlers were the number two head in the previous eighth edition (2010) scoring 139 7/8.

Following a request from the current owner, it was panel scored in March 2015 and is now ranked as the number one Vancouver Island deer with a score of 143 5/8.

The most recent sixth edition (2010) of the Big Game Records of British Columbia is available for \$35 each. These are hard cover books containing records of all native big game species in B.C. Hunting stories, photographs and a listing, by species category, of entries meeting the minimum score requirements, are included.



The following is a text version of the attached Signed PDF Letter from Fin Donnelly concerning Bill C-228

David Becker President Victoria Fish and Game Protection Association PO Box 93 Victoria, BC, V8W 2M1

Dear David.

I am writing to ask for your help. For more than 25 years, I have been fighting to save wild B.C. salmon. In 1995 and again in 2000, I swam the 1,400 km length of the Fraser River in order to draw attention to threats to this mighty salmon river. Since being elected to the House of Commons in 2009, federally legislated protection to save B.C. wild salmon has been my top priority.

On February 24th, 2016, I introduced Bill C-228, An Act to amend the Fisheries Act (closed contain-

ment aquaculture). This bill strengthens the Fisheries Act by requiring West Coast fish farms to move from harmful open-net pens to safe closed containment systems within 5 years and it requires the Minister of Fisheries and Oceans to develop, table and implement a transition plan to closed containment within 18 months of the bill receiving Royal Assent.

Bill-228 will come to a vote this fall. This vote provides us with a historic opportunity to demand action on key recommendations of the Cohen Commission and make Canada a leader in closed containment aquaculture.

You can help by providing an endorsement for Bill C-228 from your organization and raising awareness of the bill in your network. Your endorsement will go a long way in helping me gain support from other Members of Parliament. The more citizens engaged on the issue, the better chance we have of success.



SAFETY REMINDERS--PLEASE READ

FIREARMS--CASES--BENCHES

- * Firearms are to be <u>cased</u> and <u>uncased</u> <u>ONLY</u> during Live Periods and <u>preferably</u> only at the Firing line (forward wooden benches) Actions open, Magazines removed (empty cases can be returned to rear gear tables)
- * Firearms are to be Loaded and Unloaded ONLY on the Firing Line (forward wooden shooting Benches)
- * Muzzles are <u>always</u> to be pointed down range or upwards. (magazine may be filled or emptied at the rear gear benches and tables).

"CEASE FIRE" ROUTINE/PROCEDURES:

- * Remove ammunition from the Chamber. Remove magazines from the action
- * Leave actions visibly open-(a chamber flag helps visibility!)
 Then- Your Choice:
- * Leave firearm(muzzle pointed down range, magazine removed, action open) on FIRING LINE bench.

Or

- * Carry firearm muzzle up and place in rear wall rack- magazine removed action open.
- * Remember to take needed targets, tape, stapler, beverage, etc. with you when leaving the shooting bench area for the Cease Fire Period. (An RSO can retrieve forgotten items.)
- * During a Cease Fire <u>DO NOT</u> go within 3 metres of the firearms on the bench or handle firearms on the racks(Remember your P.A.L. Course). Do not touch anything on your shooting table. (An RSO can retrieve forgotten items).
- * During a Cease Fire the divided concrete slab area around the shooting benches is to be used to <u>walk</u> <u>through only</u> on the way to your target and back. Please remain off the shooting table area concrete during cease fire periods.

Safety Tip

Each Range has a Perimeter Flag. If the Red Flag is in the UP position that is a indicator that the range is active. Even if their is a cease fire shooting can start at anytime.

It is a good idea to put your Hearing Protection on at the Perimeter Flag before you get to the active range. (Range Rules require that hearing and eye protection be worn on the Ranges.)

The Federal Licensing Course suggest you wear both in ear and outside ear protection, another option is the "Electronics Earmuffs" Good Christmas List need item.





VICTORIA FISH & GAME ANNUAL BIG GAME COMPETITION

Hunters are reminded that Blacktail deer taken in MU 1-1 through 1-13 by Victoria Fish & Game members are eligible for the five trophies available each year. Deer must be field dressed which means that the heart, liver and kidneys (edible portions) are the only internal organs which can be included when the animal is weighed. Deer must be weighed on Club scales by the caretaker or his designate.

The official weigher reserves the right to refuse weighing any deer which arrives in an un presentable condition. Lungs must be removed and body cavity wiped dry with a rag or paper towels. Deer 160 pounds and over taken with a rifle and 140 pounds and over taken by bow and arrow must be witnessed by an executive member at time of weighing. Please contact the Club caretaker/manager or Wayne Zaccarelli to make arrangements. Hunters are reminded that access to club facilities is restricted to daylight hours with the gate locked progressively earlier through the hunting season. Please ensure that you confirm the time gates are locked and show up at least a half hour earlier.

In addition, the Victoria Fish & Game Bear trophy is awarded annually for the largest Black bear taken by a Club member. Boone & Crockett Club scoring is used to determine the largest entry. Boundaries are again MU 1-1 through 1-13.

CRAIGFLOWER CREEK DRYING UP

The Craigflower creek is in dire need of more water flow. We are just entering the extreme dry period of the year and the creek level is very low and the water temperatures are climbing. The staff gauge at the counting fence is registering 0.181 m. This is a flow of about 2-3 l/s. With the agreement we set up with the CRD Thetis lake water release rule, the valve at Thetis lake was supposed to open when the staff readings at the fence were between 0.29 m on its way to 0.24 m. CRD has not opened the valve all year, except for a constant dribble of 1-2 l/s, because the lake level was just below their lower rule band line. Connectivity between pools is starting to close and the lower gravel reaches are drying with a resultant large mortality of fry.

I just read that there is a new BC Water Act that is supposed to give priority to critical environmental flow issues by overriding water license holders that are used for non domestic use. The CRD Thetis lake water license is one of these licenses. Since the CRD has not activated their water release valve all summer it is about time we had some immediate meaningful flow from that water source to resolve our critical low flow issue.

I understand that you are kept appraised of the critical water flow reports from the BC Ministry. Have you been in contact with them over this issue and have they raised any alarms yet for critical flows in the Craigflower creek? How does the BC Ministry determine when there is a critical low flow state on the Craigflower creek?



There has been a lot of silence from everyone over this and I think that needs to change. This is a game changer if everything I have read is true, but we need some mechanisms to get things happening in the bureaucratic realms and soon so that we can get some water into the creek before it goes dry.

So what has to happen to get some action here?

LOCAL CLUB RECEIVES SAANICH ENVIRONMENTAL AWARD

The Victoria Golden Rods & Reels fishing and social club was honoured for their achievements in supporting water quality research and stewardship at Elk/Beaver Lake. This volunteer organization has raised significant funds, put in over 2000 hours of volunteer labour and supplied boats to support scientific work on water quality issues at the lake. The club's efforts have included hosting a Lake Stewardship seminar, a public forum at UVic's Environmental Law Centre, supporting an intergovernmental steering committee and successfully working with the CRD towards a project coordinator position and new weed harvester. The long-term effects of their efforts and the future increased health of the lake will benefit recreational activities as well as the aquatic ecosystems of Elk/Beaver Lake.

The Club was recently rewarded with an Environmental Award as Volunteer Organization of the year by the District of Saanich.

BIG GAME RECORDS BOOKS

Copies of the ninth edition (2016) of the Vancouver Island Columbian Blacktail Deer Records are available at a cost of \$10 each. The publication contains an excellent article written by Byron Mason on fifty years with the deer in the Nimpkish Valley. Byron relates the impact of wolf and cougar predation on deer population abundance and hence, hunting success. He also includes 45 years of deer count data from 1970 through 2015.

There is also an article on early cougar hunting where the provincial government paid a bounty of varying amounts on cougars taken between 1870 and 1958. The new edition contains numerous colour photographs of harvested deer as well as record heads and antlers.

Copies of the previous eighth edition (2010) are still available at a cost of \$5.00.

The current records list over 2160 entries scoring 100 or more Boone & Crockett points.

Of particular note is the re-scoring of the Norm Hammond buck from 1942. These antlers were the number two head in the previous eighth edition (2010) scoring 139 7/8.

Following a request from the current owner, it was panel scored in March 2015 and is now ranked as the number one Vancouver Island deer with a score of 143 5/8.

The most recent sixth edition (2010) of the Big Game Records of British Columbia is available for \$35 each. These are hard cover books containing records of all native big game species in B.C. Hunting stories, photographs and a listing, by species category, of entries meeting the minimum score requirements, are included.

ACTION PLAN FOR SOUTHERN RESIDENT KILLER WHALE RECOVERY

The proposed Species at Risk Act (SARA) "Action Plan for the Northern and Southern Resident Killer Whales in Canada" was recently released by DFO for public comment until August 14.

The Southern Resident Killer Whales (SRKW) were listed as *Endangered* under SARA in 2003. Three distinct ecotypes of killer whales inhabit B.C. waters - the Resident, Offshore and Transient. The SRKW population declined by about two per year between 1995 and 2001 and are listed as having 77 members in 2014. The 2016 population is estimated at over 80 animals.

However, the Action Plan lacks adequate population data during the 1995-2016 period and no data is provided for their population prior to 1995. There is also no proof that significantly increased populations existed historically. It may be that the population fluctuations of the past twenty years are normal and that their numbers were not statistically different prior to that.

A total of 94 Recovery Measures are listed in the Action Plan. Of particular concern to local salmon anglers is a high priority option to "investigate strategic fishery closures" as a possible tool to reduce Resident Killer Whale prey competition. During summer and fall, SRKW feed primarily upon chinook and chum salmon. If the Recovery Measures were put into effect it would likely curtail our chinook fishery in Juan de Fuca Strait during the June to September period.

There is no mention in the Action Plan of increasing chinook abundance through enhancement techniques to provide additional food for the SRKW.

VICTORIA ANGLERS UNDER ATTACK - AGAIN!!!

Recent articles in the Langley Advance News (July 19) and The Globe and Mail (July 20) describe further attacks aimed at Victoria area Chinook salmon anglers.

Three First Nations on the lower Fraser River have launched a legal challenge against DFO management of Fraser River Chinook stocks. The Kwantlen, Katzie and Seabird Island First Nations are challenging the management of spring Chinook salmon which have declined in numbers over the years.

If the application is granted, it will likely lead to a closure of the Juan de Fuca sport fishery for Chinook salmon during late spring and early summer. The First Nations allege that DNA analysis of sport caught Chinook show that Fraser River spring Chinook are caught in substantial numbers.

However, the harvest rate impact on these stocks by recreational anglers in this area is less than three percent. Restrictions are in place from March 01 to mid June each year requiring the release of all wild (unclipped) Chinook over 67 cm. Additionally, from mid June to mid July this year, all wild (unclipped) Chinook over 85 cm. are required to be released. This essentially means the non-retention of virtually all wild, spawning Chinook

over a four and a half month period. Over much of this time frame, anglers are catching mostly U.S. hatchery Chinook - primarily from Puget Sound hatcheries.

It is the First Nations bands themselves which are significantly impacting these stocks. Harvest rates in excess of 50% are not uncommon for their in-river net fisheries.

The 2016/2017 Integrated Fisheries Management Plan (IFMP) lists a lower Fraser First Nations Chinook harvest target of 25,300 fish. The mid/upper Fraser River First Nations have a target of 18,000 Chinook. The lower Fraser First Nations have an all species (Chinook, coho, chum, sockeye and pink) target of 675,400 fish while the mid/upper Fraser bands have a target of 389,000 salmon. This is a total of 1,064,400 salmon.






