IAN BRUCE OF PENINSULA STREAMS SOCIETY TO SPEAK AT SEPTEMBER 19th MEETING

Presidents Report:

As I write this report, the Sunshine of August has just finished, and the rains of September are just beginning. The summer has been particularly busy on all of the ranges, with both major events and general drop-in use.

The club hosted members of the Q & Zone Radio station staff for a day at the range, where they were able to try their hand at trap, along with some rifle & handgun shooting. Our South Island Action Shooters hosted double-header IPSC Qualifiers on the Multi-Purpose range on August 13 & 14 that saw shooters from all over BC attend. Our Frontier Shootists held a very successful Headquarters event that drew shooters from both Canada & the US. Our Trap members hosted a two-day P.I.T.A. event that also was very successful.

On top of all of the events, some of our members were volunteering time to make improvements to the various parts of the ranges as well. A big thank-you to Kathryn Gillert (AKA Montana May) & Brent Stefan (AKA SideIron Sam), who cleaned, repaired, and painted both of the outside-access washrooms at the main clubhouse. Both washrooms were long overdue for a refurbishment, and they now look wonderful.

Our Canteen volunteer, Marc Fournier, has arranged four vending machines for use by our members. Two are in the main clubhouse, and two are in the Rifle-Range shooting shed. These are already being enjoyed by members who would like a snack or a cold drink. Board Volunteer Andre' Desautels did the work to ensure that everything operates properly.

Marc was also instrumental in the construction of a new campsite along the northern road spur off of Frog-Hollow. This is our first attempt at individual campsites, and it looks to be working well as a pilot project. Marc & other volunteers have plans for more individual sites on the northern side of Frog-Hollow pond, and also along the spur road, so keep your eyes out for them to be constructed slowly over the next months & years to come.

The Multi-Purpose range received its yearly maintenance work in August as well. A number of dedicated member volunteers of our South Island Action Shooters spent a few days cleaning up all of the bays, and performing repairs as needed on the bays, grounds & parking areas.

And a final big thank-you to all of our member volunteer Range Safety Officers (RSO's) who schedule their time to oversee the activities on the various ranges. These people volunteer to help keep our safety record at the range intact, so please help them out by acting in a safe and courteous manner at all times.

Hello Members, a few house keeping items:

ALL NEW MEMBERS MUST TAKE THE ORIENTATION COURSE BEFORE THEY ARE ALLOWED TO USE THE CLUBS RANGES.

EVERYONE NEEDS TO SIGN IN WHEN AT THE RANGE!!

You cannot sign in anyone (for Free) on your Memberships. (if you don't have a Membership Card you have to have a Day-Pass displayed on you)

Sweeping your brass/steel/empty hulls off the concrete and/or leaving them on the ground is <u>not acceptable.</u> Please clean up after yourself. We have a lot of range users that do not know the rules (Day-Pass Users or New Members that haven't taken the mandatory "Orientation Course") please educate anyone not cleaning up after themselves. Extra buckets have been put at each range, these are not garbage buckets they are to be used for Brass Cartridges (recycle) on the R/P and M/P Range, shotgun shells on the S/G Range. All garbage (paper, plastic, cardboard) goes into the garbage cans.

Please print your Name/Member Number when you sign in, we **NEED** to be able to read what you **Write / Print**. **YOU MUST INITIAL THE ACKNOWLEDGEMENT THAT YOU KNOW THE RULES OF THE CLUB** If **6pm** is Closing Time the last shot is **5:30pm**, you have 1/2 hr. to clean up and be past the main gate before it is locked. You need to be on the other side of the main gate by **6pm**. Range staff have already worked their 12-14 hours to 8 hours and would like to go home and see their families.

Introductory Hunting Essentials Course October 29 & 30, 2016

Are you a novice hunter, who has successfully completed the PAL and CORE courses, but feel that you need more practical training before heading off into the woods? Then this course may be just for you.

The Victoria Fish and Game Protective Association will be holding an Introductory Hunting Essentials Course; on Saturday/Sunday 29-30 October 2016 in the Clubhouse, 9 am to 4 pm each day.

The course content includes:

- * Ground selection
- * Preys' eyes, Hunters' eyes
- * Finding/seeing game
- * Whitetail vs mule, Buck vs doe
- * Fitness considerations
- * Team makeup
- * Optics/Scope/binocular selection
- * Rifle/caliber selection
- * Laser range finder applications
- * Normal (< 150 yard) shooting considerations/Long(er) distance shooting considerations
- * Scouting & ambush, vs stalking, merits of each
- * Ungulate anatomy/physiology and field dressing (includes training/practice on either killed-that-morning sheep, or a recent deer)
- * Relationships with game cutters
- * Relationships with landowners
- * Relationships with other parties out there encountered
- * Hunt site schematic
- * Bear considerations

About the instructor:

- * Canadian Firearms/Restricted Firearms instructor/examiner, since the program's inception (instructor certification card # 0007)
- * B.C. Hunter Training/C.O.R.E instructor/examiner, since 1981.
- * Active hunter since 1967 with bow, shotgun and rifle, multiply successful for: deer (both), bear, moose, sheep (both), bison, predators, waterfowl, and upland birds
- * B.Ed, UVic, 1981
- * Current membership in B.C. College of Teachers, and a continuing member in good standing from that college's first day.
- * Teacher in rural schools, 1981-1997, outdoor education, and biology.

Fired Range Brass Program reminder!

Just a reminder to our members to only put fired pistol and rifle cartridge cases (brass or steel) into the plastic range brass buckets. I just spent a few hours pre-sorting through 10 buckets of brass to remove the plastic shot shell hulls, used paper targets, empty cardboard ammo boxes, plastic ammo trays, used earplugs (LOTS of those), used Kleenex, and other misc garbage that should NOT be put in the brass buckets. Please use the provided garbage cans on our ranges for your garbage and ONLY put your fired rifle and pistol cartridge cases in the buckets provided for range brass. It will definitely help to make my job a lot easier ... and a lot less disgusting. It is a fairly time consuming job to separate and sort all of the various calibres of brass to make them available to the members that reload, but it makes it far more time consuming when I have to pre-sort all of the garbage out of the brass buckets first.

It can be a challenge to get plated or jacketed bullets for reasonable price on Vancouver Island.

A few years ago I tried CamPro bullets and found them very accurate and easy to work with when tuning up my loads. CamPro bullets have thicker plating compared to Berry's and in order to keep your power factor CamPro needs a bit of extra push. (0.1-0.2 grains of powder). The 9mm 124gr RN FCP with 3.8gr of Tide Group is nice load with minimum recoil while keeping power factor above 125. The same ammo I use for my CZ Shadow. The .38/357 158gr TC with 3.9gr of Tide Group works well with GP 100 too, accurate with nice round imprint on paper targets. There are top class IPSC shooters (quite a few from Vancouver Island) that use CamPro bullets with great results so I have no excuses when it comes to my accuracy.

SAFETY REMINDERS--PLEASE READ

FIREARMS--CASES--BENCHES

- * Firearms are to be <u>cased</u> and <u>uncased</u> <u>ONLY</u> during Live Periods and <u>preferably</u> only at the Firing line (forward wooden benches) Actions open, Magazines removed (empty cases can be returned to rear gear tables)
- * Firearms are to be Loaded and Unloaded ONLY on the Firing Line (forward wooden shooting Benches)
- * Muzzles are <u>always</u> to be pointed down range or upwards. (magazine may be filled or emptied at the rear gear benches and tables).

"CEASE FIRE" ROUTINE/PROCEDURES:

- * Remove ammunition from the Chamber. Remove magazines from the action
- * Leave actions visibly open-(a chamber flag helps visibility!)
 Then- Your Choice:
- * Leave firearm(muzzle pointed down range, magazine removed, action open) on FIRING LINE bench.

Or

- * Carry firearm muzzle up and place in rear wall rack- magazine removed action open.
- * Remember to take needed targets, tape, stapler, beverage, etc. with you when leaving the shooting bench area for the Cease Fire Period. (An RSO can retrieve forgotten items.)
- * During a Cease Fire <u>DO NOT</u> go within 3 metres of the firearms on the bench or handle firearms on the racks(Remember your P.A.L. Course). Do not touch anything on your shooting table. (An RSO can retrieve forgotten items).
- * During a Cease Fire the divided concrete slab area around the shooting benches is to be used to <u>walk</u> <u>through only</u> on the way to your target and back. Please remain off the shooting table area concrete during cease fire periods.

Safety Tip

Each Range has a Perimeter Flag. If the Red Flag is in the UP position that is a indicator that the range is active. Even if their is a cease fire shooting can start at anytime.

It is a good idea to put your Hearing Protection on at the Perimeter Flag before you get to the active range. (Range Rules require that hearing and eye protection be worn on the Ranges.)

The Federal Licensing Course suggest you wear both in ear and outside ear protection, another option is the "Electronics Earmuffs" Good Christmas List need item.

Once your hearing is damage it cannot be fixed and it does not repair itself.







VICTORIA FISH & GAME ANNUAL BIG GAME COMPETITION

Hunters are reminded that Blacktail deer taken in MU 1-1 through 1-13 by Victoria Fish & Game members are eligible for the five trophies available each year. Deer must be field dressed which means that the heart, liver and kidneys (edible portions) are the only internal organs which can be included when the animal is weighed. Deer must be weighed on Club scales by the caretaker or his designate.

The official weigher reserves the right to refuse weighing any deer which arrives in an un presentable condition. Lungs must be removed and body cavity wiped dry with a rag or paper towels. Deer 160 pounds and over taken with a rifle and 140 pounds and over taken by bow and arrow must be witnessed by an executive member at time of weighing. Please contact the Club caretaker/manager or Wayne Zaccarelli to make arrangements. Hunters are reminded that access to club facilities is restricted to daylight hours with the gate locked progressively earlier through the hunting season. Please ensure that you confirm the time gates are locked and show up at least a half hour earlier.

NEW FEDERAL STUDIES ON LEAD USE

On August 10, 2016, Environment and Climate Change Canada (ECCC) is planning to launch two studies which will gather use pattern information on lead ammunition and lead sinkers and jigs and their non-lead alternatives. These studies are part of initiatives undertaken to fulfil the Government of Canada's commitments under the <u>Risk Management Strategy</u> for Lead that was published in 2013.

Under this Strategy, the Government of Canada committed to further reduce Canadians' exposure to lead. Releases of lead from consumer products, such as lead ammunition, and jigs and sinkers, are two of the sources being investigated.

These studies will help the Government of Canada determine the appropriate path forward. Should further actions be considered, the government will engage stakeholders, including the provinces, non-governmental associations and industry.






