Presidents report

As I write this, (Early October...) Fall is upon us, and the weather is starting to threaten us with a few bad days. Thankfully, the sun is still very warm on the good days.

Hats for Heads

The Fish & Wildlife section of the Provincial Government has reached out to the clubs in the province for some help. They are asking for the heads of game that is harvested in the province to be submitted to the Provincial Wildlife Vet so that they may undertake some sampling for CWD and other diseases that may be spreading to BC (they are having trouble getting samples....) They need heads from ungulates (deer, elk and moose) harvested in the province to establish some baseline data and help with early detection.

There are three pages of info later in this newsletter. If you are successful in your hunt for an ungulate this year, please consider giving the head to this program, and prepare the head as described in the information. Our club will be a drop-off point.

We will have the necessary supplies at our property by the middle of October. Please phone our caretakers before you come to the range to drop off your donation so that they can be prepared. We will trade you a 'Hats-for-Heads' program hat for the ungulate head, and you can then wear it with pride in the knowledge that you are helping to do your part in determining the health of the game population in BC.

Access to Timberwest lands for hunting....

We hope to have information shortly on how we will be able to access Timberwest's private lands for hunting this year. Terrance Martin & Vic Skaarup have been working hard to negotiate access, and have come up with an electronic lock system that seems to be acceptable to Timberwest. Access will be limited to hunters who are members of BCWF and have the necessary Insurance (i.e. all of our club members, and all BCWF members in the province....). There will be a few other limitations that Timberwest is requiring, and more information will be coming shortly.

Water Well problems....

Thanks for your patience with our water will issues. If you have been to the rifle range lately, you have noticed that the washrooms there have been closed most of the time. We have a blockage in our main water line from the well, and even experts in the field have not been able to isolate the problem. We believe that we have an impacted main line that leads from the well, and that the blockage is in the first part of the line. We still have some diagnostic and exploratory work to do, but we hope to have it cleared up within the month.

EVERYONE NEEDS TO SIGN IN WHEN AT THE RANGE!!

You cannot sign in anyone (for Free) on your Memberships. (if you don't have a Membership Card you have to have a Day-Pass displayed on you)

Sweeping your brass/steel/empty hulls off the concrete and/or leaving them on the ground is **not acceptable.** Please clean up after yourself. We have a lot of range users that do not know the rules (Day-Pass Users or New Members that haven't taken the mandatory "Orientation Course") please educate anyone not cleaning up after themselves. Extra buckets have been put at each range, these are not garbage buckets they are to be used for Brass Cartridges (recycle) on the R/P and M/P Range, shotgun shells on the S/G Range. All garbage (paper, plastic, cardboard) goes into the garbage cans.

Please print your Name/Member Number when you sign in, we **NEED** to be able to read what you **Write / Print**. **YOU MUST INITIAL THE ACKNOWLEDGEMENT THAT YOU KNOW THE RULES OF THE CLUB** If **6pm** is Closing Time the last shot is **5:30pm**, you have 1/2 hr. to clean up and be past the main gate before it is locked. You need to be on the other side of the main gate by **6pm**. Range staff have already worked their 12-14 hours to 8 hours and would like to go home and see their families.

OBITUARTY

Victoria Fish & Game Life Member, Alec Merriman, passed away in August 2016. This leaves the VFGPA with 10 current Life Members

After a long and fruitful life, Alec passed away peacefully at the Priory at the age of 96. Predeceased by daughter Lucille, wife Taffy, brother Fred and brother-in-law Bob, he is survived by his sister Joy Obee, sister-in-law Lorna, daughter Barbara (Stew), son-in-law Clayton, grandchildren Jennifer, Greg, Andrea and Lauren as well as eight great grandchildren and many nieces and nephews.

Some people are born to fish and that is definitely the case with Alec. From an early age his greatest pleasure was fishing off of Foul Bay in his rowboat. Writing was also in Alec's blood as he was born into a newspaper family with his father, Tom, being editor of the Victoria Daily Times. Hospitality was second nature to Alec. His home on Langford Lake and the cabin at Sooke were always full of people. Those



three things alone were a recipe for an adventurous life but finding the perfect wife and his best friend in Welsh war-bride Taffy Jones started the ball rolling.

After the war Alec was involved with some private publications but landed a job in 1951 on his Dad's competition, The Daily Colonist. He worked as a photographer and reporter in many areas including police, legislative and local politics. He became City Editor and gradually worked his way into his true passion — fishing. Alec took over the King Fisherman Contest from Jim Tang, his friend and colleague in 1953 and started writing a twice-weekly column entitled Outdoors with Alec Merriman in 1960. He wrote this column for 25 years and it became the bible for local fishing enthusiasts. Alec became editor of the Islander Magazine and wrote five books on outdoor travel and fishing on Vancouver Island. Two of the books, Logging Road Travel 1 and 2, were co-authored by Taffy.

He has been honoured for his work on salmonid enhancement and has been made a life member of many fishing organizations as well as being inducted into the Greater Victoria Sports Hall of Fame in 2010 under the media category. Alec's philosophy was that our beautiful outdoor recreation areas and our wonderful fishery belong to everyone. He campaigned and was successful in getting access for everyone to forest company controlled lands even to the extent that some companies created public camping facilities. There is no doubt that Alec made a huge contribution to outdoors and fishing on Vancouver Island that will be remembered for generations to come. So, to use your signature sign-off: Tight lines Alec.





Introductory Hunting Essentials Course October 29 & 30, 2016

Are you a novice hunter, who has successfully completed the PAL and CORE courses, but feel that you need more practical training before heading off into the woods? Then this course may be just for you.

The Victoria Fish and Game Protective Association will be holding an Introductory Hunting Essentials Course; on Saturday/Sunday 29-30 October 2016 in the Clubhouse, 9 am to 4 pm each day.

The course content includes:

- * Ground selection
- * Preys' eyes, Hunters' eyes
- * Finding/seeing game
- * Whitetail vs mule, Buck vs doe
- * Fitness considerations
- * Team makeup
- * Optics/Scope/binocular selection
- * Rifle/caliber selection
- * Laser range finder applications
- * Normal (< 150 yard) shooting considerations/Long(er) distance shooting considerations
- * Scouting & ambush, vs stalking, merits of each
- * Ungulate anatomy/physiology and field dressing (includes training/practice on either killed-that-morning sheep, or a recent deer)
- * Relationships with game cutters
- * Relationships with landowners
- * Relationships with other parties out there encountered
- * Hunt site schematic
- * Bear considerations

About the instructor:

- * Canadian Firearms/Restricted Firearms instructor/examiner, since the program's inception (instructor certification card # 0007)
- * B.C. Hunter Training/C.O.R.E instructor/examiner, since 1981.

Fired Range Brass Program reminder!

Just a reminder to our members to only put fired pistol and rifle cartridge cases (brass or steel) into the plastic range brass buckets. I just spent a few hours pre-sorting through 10 buckets of brass to remove the plastic shot shell hulls, used paper targets, empty cardboard ammo boxes, plastic ammo trays, used earplugs (LOTS of those), used Kleenex, and other misc garbage that should NOT be put in the brass buckets. Please use the provided garbage cans on our ranges for your garbage and ONLY put your fired rifle and pistol cartridge cases in the buckets provided for range brass. It will definitely help to make my job a lot easier ... and a lot less disgusting. It is a fairly time consuming job to separate and sort all of the various calibres of brass to make them available to the members that reload, but it makes it far more time consuming when I have to pre-sort all of the garbage out of the brass buckets first.








A position bestowed on those who have made a valued contribution to Cowboy Action Shooting. A good time was had by all!!










Changes to BC Societies Act



We Need Your Help to Learn More About CHRONIC WASTING DISEASE IN BC

WHAT IS CWD?

Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) affects species in the deer family (cervids). It is caused by abnormal proteins (prions). CWD is found in mule deer, white-tailed deer, elk and moose in many jurisdictions in North America, including Alberta and Saskatchewan. CWD is always fatal. The only practical way to test for CWD is to examine tissues from a dead animal's head – the tonsils, lymph nodes, and base of the brain.

IS CWD IN BRITISH COLUMBIA?

No. BC is considered at low risk for CWD. No animals have tested positive in BC since testing began in 2001, but ongoing testing is necessary to ensure that BC is kept CWD free. The nearest cases are in Eastern Alberta. Heads of road killed or hunter killed animals are tested.

WHAT ARE THE SIGNS OF CWD?

Infected animals will not exhibit signs for several years. Signs in later stages of the disease include severe wasting (thin), drooling, excessive thirst, lethargy, poor coordination, and drooping head and ears. If you see an animal with these symptoms – please report it to the B.C. Wildlife Health Program (250) 751-3219.

HOW IS IT SPREAD?


CWD occurs only in species in the deer family, with no evidence of transmission to livestock, domestic animals or humans. Deer can get CWD through animal-to-animal contact as well as animal contact with contaminated environments. Prions can live in the soil. It is transmitted between animals through contact with urine, saliva and/or feces.

HUNTERS: WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

CWD threatens the health of BC deer, elk and moose. BC remains CWD free but the #1 threat of CWD reaching BC is the import of infected carcasses from areas that have CWD. The closest cases of CWD in wild deer are in Eastern Alberta.

CWD IN NORTH AMERICA



Be aware of the risks. Infected material can contaminate the soil and infect our wildlife. If you hunt where CWD infects wild deer do not bring intact carcasses back to B.C.

SAFETY REMINDERS--PLEASE READ

FIREARMS--CASES--BENCHES

- * Firearms are to be <u>cased</u> and <u>uncased</u> <u>ONLY</u> during Live Periods and <u>preferably</u> only at the Firing line (forward wooden benches) Actions open, Magazines removed (empty cases can be returned to rear gear tables)
- * Firearms are to be Loaded and Unloaded ONLY on the Firing Line (forward wooden shooting Benches)
- * Muzzles are <u>always</u> to be pointed down range or upwards. (magazine may be filled or emptied at the rear gear benches and tables).

"CEASE FIRE" ROUTINE/PROCEDURES:

- * Remove ammunition from the Chamber. Remove magazines from the action
- * Leave actions visibly open-(a chamber flag helps visibility!)
 Then- Your Choice:
- * Leave firearm(muzzle pointed down range, magazine removed, action open) on FIRING LINE bench.

Or

- * Carry firearm muzzle up and place in rear wall rack- magazine removed action open.
- * Remember to take needed targets, tape, stapler, beverage, etc. with you when leaving the shooting bench area for the Cease Fire Period. (An RSO can retrieve forgotten items.)
- * During a Cease Fire <u>DO NOT</u> go within 3 metres of the firearms on the bench or handle firearms on the racks(Remember your P.A.L. Course). Do not touch anything on your shooting table. (An RSO can retrieve forgotten items).
- * During a Cease Fire the divided concrete slab area around the shooting benches is to be used to <u>walk</u> <u>through only</u> on the way to your target and back. Please remain off the shooting table area concrete during cease fire periods.

Safety Tip

Each Range has a Perimeter Flag. If the Red Flag is in the UP position that is a indicator that the range is active. Even if their is a cease fire shooting can start at anytime.

It is a good idea to put your Hearing Protection on at the Perimeter Flag before you get to the active range. (Range Rules require that hearing and eye protection be worn on the Ranges.)

The Federal Licensing Course suggest you wear both in ear and outside ear protection, another option is the "Electronics Earmuffs" Good Christmas List need item.

Once your hearing is damage it cannot be fixed and it does not repair itself.







VICTORIA FISH & GAME ANNUAL BIG GAME COMPETITION

Hunters are reminded that Blacktail deer taken in MU 1-1 through 1-13 by Victoria Fish & Game members are eligible for the five trophies available each year. Deer must be field dressed which means that the heart, liver and kidneys (edible portions) are the only internal organs which can be included when the animal is weighed. Deer must be weighed on Club scales by the caretaker or his designate.

The official weigher reserves the right to refuse weighing any deer which arrives in an un presentable condition. Lungs must be removed and body cavity wiped dry with a rag or paper towels. Deer 160 pounds and over taken with a rifle and 140 pounds and over taken by bow and arrow must be witnessed by an executive member at time of weighing. Please contact the Club caretaker/manager or Wayne Zaccarelli to make arrangements. Hunters are reminded that access to club facilities is restricted to daylight hours with the gate locked progressively earlier through the hunting season. Please ensure that you confirm the time gates are locked and show up at least a half hour earlier.

NEW FEDERAL STUDIES ON LEAD USE

On August 10, 2016, Environment and Climate Change Canada (ECCC) is planning to launch two studies which will gather use pattern information on lead ammunition and lead sinkers and jigs and their non-lead alternatives. These studies are part of initiatives undertaken to fulfil the Government of Canada's commitments under the <u>Risk Management Strategy for Lead</u> that was published in 2013.

Under this Strategy, the Government of Canada committed to further reduce Canadians' exposure to lead. Releases of lead from consumer products, such as lead ammunition, and jigs and sinkers, are two of the sources being investigated.

These studies will help the Government of Canada determine the appropriate path forward. Should further actions be considered, the government will engage stakeholders, including the provinces, non-governmental associations and industry.

The current records list over 2160 entries scoring 100 or more Boone & Crockett points.

Of particular note is the re-scoring of the Norm Hammond buck from 1942. These antlers were the number two head in the previous eighth edition (2010) scoring 139 7/8.

Following a request from the current owner, it was panel scored in March 2015 and is now ranked as the number one Vancouver Island deer with a score of 143 5/8.

The most recent sixth edition (2010) of the Big Game Records of British Columbia is available for \$35 each. These are hard cover books containing records of all native big game species in B.C. Hunting stories, photographs and a listing, by species category, of entries meeting the minimum score requirements, are included.




