Presidents report

As I write this report, Donald Trump has just been elected President of the United States of America. We live in interesting times.

Range Development:

The Multi-Purpose range development is moving ahead slowly. Those of you who were at the October meeting are aware that we now have a successful 400' deep well hole on that range for a future water well. Blasting and rock removal for the final sections on both the left and right sides of the range has commenced, and is moving gracefully forward. With luck, we might be able to commission the two new bays on the right side of the MP range by next summer.

Main water well problems solved!!

Those of you who have been up to the range in the last few months have noticed that we have had to shut down the Range House washrooms because of lack of water. The issue was a complete break in the main line that comes from the well, that let all of the water out of the system and would not allow the system to pressurize enough to get water to the two storage tanks. The cause was not necessarily 'old age', but actually 'father time'. The original installation of the underground piped in the 1980's chose a path close to the bottom of a tree that in the 1980's was quite small. Now, almost 40 years later, the growth of that tree and roots broke the pipe. The complication here is that ground conditions were such that even though the well was putting out about 5 gallons a minute, there was no 'wet-spot' to indicate where the break was located.

We all owe Board member <u>Andre' Desautels</u> a huge debt of gratitude for spending a few weeks worth of time digging holes to locate pipes, pressure testing sections, locating the leak, and installing new pipe for repairs. ... And all this in addition to the time he has spent volunteering as Trap Director and other volunteer duties!

SaltSpring Island Club news:

For those of you that have been following the plight of the Saltspring Island Rod & Gun Club, we now have some good news to report. It appears that the judge in the case has followed the published accepted standards for sound decibel levels with respect to sound that leaves a licensed gun club. While this is good news for the club, they still have to restrict activities and hours for shooting. Please support Saltspring by buying a membership and helping wherever you can.

Extra buckets have been put at each range, these are not garbage buckets they are to be used for Brass Cartridges (recycle) on the R/P and M/ P Range, shotgun shells on the S/G Range. All garbage (paper, plastic, cardboard) goes into the garbage cans.

Please print your Name/Member Number when you sign in, we **NEED** to be able to read what you **Write / Print**. YOU **MUST INITIAL THE ACKNOWLEDGEMENT THAT YOU KNOW THE RULES OF THE CLUB**

If **6pm** is Closing Time the last shot is **5:30pm**, you have 1/2 hr. to clean up and be past the main gate before it is locked. You need to be on the other side of the main gate by **6pm**. Range staff have already worked their 12-14 hours to 8 hours and would like to go home and see their families.





Fired Range Brass Program reminder!

Just a reminder to our members to only put fired pistol and rifle cartridge cases (brass or steel) into the plastic range brass buckets. I just spent a few hours pre-sorting through 10 buckets of brass to remove the plastic shot shell hulls, used paper targets, empty cardboard ammo boxes, plastic ammo trays, used earplugs (LOTS of those), used Kleenex, and other misc garbage that should NOT be put in the brass buckets. Please use the provided garbage cans on our ranges for your garbage and ONLY put your fired rifle and pistol cartridge cases in the buckets provided for range brass. It will definitely help to make my job a lot easier ... and a lot less disgusting. It is a fairly time consuming job to separate and sort all of the various calibres of brass to make them available to the members that reload, but it makes it far more time consuming when I have to pre-sort all of the garbage out of the brass buckets first.

NOTICE TO MEMBERS - GUN SHOW AT VFGPA SUNDAY, JULY 30TH, 2017



NEW VANCOUVER ISLAND DEER BOOK

Copies of the ninth edition (2016) of the Vancouver Island Columbian Blacktail Deer Records are available at a cost of \$10 each. The publication contains an excellent article written by Byron Mason on fifty years with the deer in the Nimpkish Valley. Byron relates the impact of wolf and cougar predation on deer population abundance and hence, hunting success. He also includes 45 years of deer count data from 1970 through 2015.

There is also an article on early cougar hunting where the provincial government paid a bounty of varying amounts on cougars taken between 1870 and 1958. The new edition contains numerous colour photographs of harvested deer as well as record heads and antlers.

Copies of the previous eighth edition (2010) are still available at a cost of \$5.00.



The current records list over 2160 entries scoring 100 or more Boone & Crockett points. Of particular note is the re-scoring of the Norm Hammond buck from 1942. These antlers were the number two head in the previous eighth edition (2010) scoring 139 7/8.





HUNTERS:

We Need Your Help to Learn More About CHRONIC WASTING DISEASE IN BC

WHAT IS CWD?

Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) affects species in the deer family (cervids). It is caused by abnormal proteins (prions). CWD is found in mule deer, white-tailed deer, elk and moose in many jurisdictions in North America, including Alberta and Saskatchewan. CWD is always fatal. The only practical way to test for CWD is to examine tissues from a dead animal's head – the tonsils, lymph nodes, and base of the brain.

IS CWD IN BRITISH COLUMBIA?

No. BC is considered at low risk for CWD. No animals have tested positive in BC since testing began in 2001, but ongoing testing is necessary to ensure that BC is kept CWD free. The nearest cases are in Eastern Alberta. Heads of road killed or hunter killed animals are tested.

WHAT ARE THE SIGNS OF CWD?

Infected animals will not exhibit signs for several years. Signs in later stages of the disease include severe wasting (thin), drooling, excessive thirst, lethargy, poor coordination, and drooping head and ears. If you see an animal with these symptoms – please report it to the B.C. Wildlife Health Program (250) 751-3219.

HOW IS IT SPREAD?


CWD occurs only in species in the deer family, with no evidence of transmission to livestock, domestic animals or humans. Deer can get CWD through animal-to-animal contact as well as animal contact with contaminated environments. Prions can live in the soil. It is transmitted between animals through contact with urine, saliva and/or feces.

HUNTERS: WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

CWD threatens the health of BC deer, elk and moose. BC remains CWD free but the #1 threat of CWD reaching BC is the import of infected carcasses from areas that have CWD. The closest cases of CWD in wild deer are in Eastern Alberta.

CWD IN NORTH AMERICA



Be aware of the risks. Infected material can contaminate the soil and infect our wildlife. If you hunt where CWD infects wild deer **do not bring intact carcasses back to B.C.**

FIREARMS--CASES--BENCHES

* Firearms are to be <u>cased and uncased</u> <u>ONLY</u> during Live Periods and <u>preferably</u> only at the Firing line (forward wooden benches) Actions open, Magazines removed (empty cases can be returned to rear gear tables)

- * Firearms are to be Loaded and Unloaded ONLY on the Firing Line (forward wooden shooting Benches)
- * Muzzles are <u>always</u> to be pointed down range or upwards.

(magazine may be filled or emptied at the rear gear benches and tables).

"CEASE FIRE" ROUTINE/PROCEDURES:

- * Remove ammunition from the Chamber. Remove magazines from the action
- * Leave actions visibly open-(a chamber flag helps visibility!)
- Then- Your Choice:
- * Leave firearm(muzzle pointed down range, magazine removed, action open) on FIRING LINE bench.

Or

* Carry firearm muzzle up and place in rear wall rack- magazine removed action open.

* Remember to take needed targets, tape, stapler, beverage, etc. with you when leaving the shooting bench area for the <u>Cease Fire Period</u>. (An RSO can retrieve forgotten items.)

* During a Cease Fire <u>DO NOT</u> go within 3 metres of the firearms on the bench or handle firearms on the racks(Remember your P.A.L. Course). Do not touch anything on your shooting table. (An RSO can retrieve forgotten items).

* During a Cease Fire the divided concrete slab area around the shooting benches is to be used to **walk through only** on the way to your target and back. Please remain off the shooting table area concrete during cease fire periods.

Safety Tip

Each Range has a Perimeter Flag. If the Red Flag is in the UP position that is a indicator that the range is active. Even if their is a cease fire shooting can start at anytime.

It is a good idea to put your Hearing Protection on at the Perimeter Flag before you get to the active range. (Range Rules require that hearing and eye protection be worn on the Ranges.)

The Federal Licensing Course suggest you wear both in ear and outside ear protection, another option is the "Electronics Earmuffs" Good Christmas List need item.

Once your hearing is damage it cannot be fixed and it does not repair itself.



Hunters are reminded that Blacktail deer taken in MU 1-1 through 1-13 by Victoria Fish & Game members are eligible for the five trophies available each year. Deer must be field dressed which means that the heart, liver and kidneys (edible portions) are the only internal organs which can be included when the animal is weighed. Deer must be weighed on Club scales by the caretaker or his designate.

The official weigher reserves the right to refuse weighing any deer which arrives in an un presentable condition. Lungs must be removed and body cavity wiped dry with a rag or paper towels. Deer 160 pounds and over taken with a rifle and 140 pounds and over taken by bow and arrow must be witnessed by an executive member at time of weighing. Please contact the Club caretaker/manager or Wayne Zaccarelli to make arrangements. Hunters are reminded that access to club facilities is restricted to daylight hours with the gate locked progressively earlier through the hunting season. Please ensure that you confirm the time gates are locked and show up at least a half hour earlier.

Trophies available include:

- * McIlwaine Van & Storage (est. 1955) largest deer / rifle
- * Victoria Fish & Game (est. 1966) largest scoring antlers
- * Robinson's Sporting Goods (est. 1970) largest deer / bow & arrow

- * Malahat Marauders (est. 1990) largest deer / muzzle loader

Gold, silver and bronze buttons are awarded in both rifle and bow & arrow classes for deer in the following weight categories:

Bronze	140 - 159 ½ lb	120 - 139 ½ lb

In addition, the Victoria Fish & Game Bear trophy is awarded annually for the largest Black bear taken by a Club member. Boone & Crockett Club scoring is used to determine the largest entry. Boundaries are again MU 1-1 through 1-13.

WILDLIFE RECORDS CLUB OF B.C.

The Wildlife Records Club of B.C. will be hosting their 16th Awards Banquet May 5-6, 2017 in Kamloops. The Club will also be celebrating its 50th anniversary at the same time. There will be a scoring clinic on Saturday May 6 hosted by Official Scorer Rick Berreth from Prince George. Saturday night will feature the banquet dinner, awards presentation and dance. The fund raiser will include raffle tables, silent and live auctions as well as door prizes.

To be eligible for awards at the banquet, animals must have been taken in 2013, 2014 or 2015 and must be scored and entered prior to December 31, 2016.

If you are interested in attending, please contact Wayne Zaccarelli for more details.

The WRCBC will be publishing its 7th edition of their *Big Game Records of British Columbia* for debut at the banquet. The closing date for entries in the new book is March 01, 2017.

SALMON RIVER DAM REMOVAL

B.C. Hydro has decided to remove its timber crib dam on the Salmon River, north of Campbell River, because planned upgrades to the fish ladder, canal, flow control and debris management have proved too costly.

The work, originally planned to begin this fall with completion in 2018, was the result of a 2012 commitment by B.C. Hydro to fish passage improvements. Since 2007, B.C. Hydro has worked with the various stakeholders to find good fish passage solutions.

Hydro is currently preparing an application to the B.C. Utilities Commission (BCUC) to seek approval to remove the 1958 structure. The application is planned to be filed in February 2017. Plans call for the dam to be removed next summer with the diversion canal and other facility structures removed at some later date. No water will be diverted once the dam is removed.

JORDAN RIVER COPPER REMEDIATION

The Ministry of Environment has asked Teck Resources and Western Forest Products (the responsible companies) to file a remediation plan and schedule by June 2017. The plan will address copper contamination resulting from previous mining operations.

Historical salmonid populations have died out as a result of the copper leaching out of the mine wastes. Coho and chum died out around 1957 and the last pink salmon in 1971. Restoration of salmon to Jordan River has been underway with efforts focusing on water quality and habitat improvements. In 2008, B.C. Hydro began fish flow releases which currently are 0.3 to 0.4 cubic meters per second from its Elliott Dam. Some Rainbow trout and coho salmon fry have been seen in the river. At its peak, an estimated 5000 salmon spawned in Jordan River.

SALMON ENHANCEMENT

In early October, a group of Goldstream hatchery volunteers assisted Nitinat hatchery in collecting Chinook brood stock. They collected 330 Chinook from the river which yielded 1.4 million eggs. This brought the total number of Chinook eggs to their target of 4.3 million.

Approximately 300,000 of these are destined for local projects. Two hundred thousand fry will be net pen reared in Sooke Harbour under the South Vancouver Island Anglers' Coalition project. Of these, 100,000 will be adipose fin clipped and coded wire tagged (CWT) in order that the success of the project can be evaluated. The fry will be fed for two to three weeks before release.

Another 100,000 are planned to be net pen reared at Ogden Point breakwater before release. This is a project of the Esquimalt Anglers' Association to provide additional Chinook salmon for anglers to catch. All of these fry will also be fin clipped and have coded wire tags (CWT) applied. This is a requirement of DFO to evaluate the success of such projects. Since 2002, the EAA have been point releasing Nitinat chinook fry directly into Equimalt Harbour with local anglers benefiting to a small, unknown degree.

The Esquimalt Anglers' have been working on getting approval for the Ogden Point netpen for about three years without success. Recent discussion with DFO has been optimistic and hopefully approval will be granted in time for the spring 2017 operation.

Local creeks and rivers are experiencing excellent Coho salmon returns as noted below:

- Colquitz River (as of Oct 31) 672 Coho (165 males, 303 females, 204 jack Coho)

- Craigflower Creek (as of Nov 02) 1246 Coho (425 males, 544 females, 277 jack Coho) ... of these 1246, 434 have been adipose fin clipped (36%)

- Shawnigan Creek (as of Nov 01) approx. 3200 Coho trucked above the falls at creek mouth and distributed along the creek.

- Millstream Creek (as of Nov 01) over 500 Coho have passed through fish ways and been recorded on in-stream camera.

- Goldstream River (as of Nov 02) less than 200 Coho. This is one of the few disappointments locally. Escapement has experienced Native harvest and earlier than usual commercial fishing by seiners/gillnetters in Saanich Inlet.

Escapement totals have been buoyed by the heavier than usual rains during October. Coho are still entering the creeks. Final totals may exceed record years in some cases.

BIG GAME RECORDS BOOKS

Copies of the ninth edition (2016) of the Vancouver Island Columbian Blacktail Deer Records are available at a cost of \$10 each. The publication contains an excellent article written by Byron Mason on fifty years with the deer in the Nimpkish Valley. Byron relates the impact of wolf and cougar predation on deer population abundance and hence, hunting success. He also includes 45 years of deer count data from 1970 through 2015.

There is also an article on early cougar hunting where the provincial government paid a bounty of varying amounts on cougars taken between 1870 and 1958. The new edition contains numerous colour photographs of harvested deer as well as record heads and antlers.

Copies of the previous eighth edition (2010) are still available at a cost of \$5.00.

The current records list over 2160 entries scoring 100 or more Boone & Crockett points.

Of particular note is the re-scoring of the Norm Hammond buck from 1942. These antlers were the number two head in the previous eighth edition (2010) scoring 139 7/8.

Following a request from the current owner, it was panel scored in March 2015 and is now ranked as the number one Vancouver Island deer with a score of 143 5/8.

The most recent sixth edition (2010) of the Big Game Records of British Columbia is available for \$35 each. These are hard cover books containing records of all native big game species in B.C. Hunting stories, photographs and a listing, by species category, of entries meeting the minimum score requirements, are included.






