HOUSE KEEPING

Hello Members, a few house keeping items:

ALL NEW MEMBERS MUST TAKE THE ORIENTATION COURSE BEFORE THEY ARE ALLOWED TO USE THE CLUBS RANGES.

EVERYONE NEEDS TO SIGN IN WHEN AT THE RANGE!!

You cannot sign in anyone (for Free) on your Memberships. (if you don't have a Membership Card you have to have a Day-Pass displayed on you)

Sweeping your brass/steel/empty hulls off the concrete and/or leaving them on the ground is **not acceptable**. Please clean up after yourself. We have a lot of range users that do not know the rules (Day-Pass Users or New Members that haven't taken the mandatory "Orientation Course") please educate anyone not cleaning up after themselves. Extra buckets have been put at each range, these are not garbage buckets they are to be used for Brass Cartridges (recycle) on the R/P and M/P Range, shotgun shells on the S/G Range. All garbage (paper, plastic, cardboard) goes into the garbage cans.

Please print your Name/Member Number when you sign in, we **NEED** to be able to read what you **Write / Print**. **YOU MUST INITIAL THE ACKNOWLEDGEMENT THAT YOU KNOW THE RULES OF THE CLUB**

If **4:45pm** is Closing Time the last shot is **4:15pm**, you have 1/2 hr. to clean up and be past the main gate before it is locked. You need to be on the other side of the main gate by **4:45pm**. Range staff have already worked their 8 hours and would like to go home and see their families.

Fired Range Brass Program reminder!

Just another reminder to our members to PLEASE only put fired pistol and rifle cartridge cases (brass or steel) into the plastic range brass buckets that are provided on the firing line. Please use the provided garbage cans on our ranges to dispose of your garbage and ONLY put your fired rifle and pistol cartridge cases in the buckets provided for range brass. If you could please do that it would definitely help to make our job a lot easier and a lot less disgusting. It is a nasty, time consuming job to separate and sort all of the garbage out of the brass buckets first.

The volume of saleable, reloadable brass is down noticeably over the past year or so and I'd just like to remind our members that while we pretty much consider any brass that is still lying on the ground or on the concrete to be "fair game", fired brass which has been placed into the club's range buckets are then considered to be the property of the club. It appears that there are shooters who are "raiding" the range buckets and taking fired brass. All of the funds that are generated from brass sales, including scrap brass, goes directly to the club and helps to pay for repairs, upkeep, and improvements on the range property. If you take brass from the range buckets you are essentially denying revenue to the club which is used to your benefit. We'd ask that you please respect our "once the brass is in the bucket it stays in the bucket" policy for the benefit of all of our members. 'Nuff said ...

Many thanks to the club members who have donated their surplus, reloadable brass to our club's brass recovery program lately. Also my very sincere thanks to club members Art Archer and Mike Lesperance who have been doing most of the brass pickup and sorting work for the past several months while I've been busy dealing with some health issues. It is VERY much appreciated.

Airsoft News

We had great attendance for our two game days in November despite it being very soggy: 80 people (a new record) and 41 people attended respectively. Airsoft games run rain or shine and would only be cancelled if the driving conditions on the Malahat were dangerous or the road to the MP range wasn't passable.

With the rainy season we've entered a "water management" phase on the Airsoft range. The creek has been flowing heavily (although I've heard it will get even heavier). Some of our build volunteers have put a lot of hard work into clearing the jams along the creek to improve the flow and to stop the water from pooling up too much. It has been successful resulting in the creek still being easily crossed by our players without getting their feet wet. We are currently working on a faux Bailey Bridge for the main East-West trail. We also suffered some wind damage to our structures in November but these have since been repaired.

With the launch of the 2018 memberships we have seen a number of our guest players becoming new Members of the Association which is always good to see. In the previous Newsletter I announced Camouflage Victoria had 6 rental guns available for people who want to try Airsoft without a large investment. Since then, the store has increased the rental inventory to 10 units to meet demand. 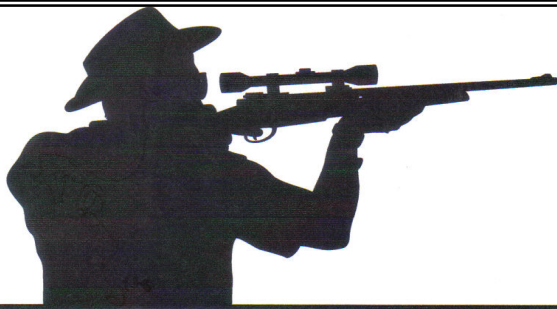

SAFETY REMINDERS--PLEASE READ

FIREARMS--CASES--BENCHES

- * Firearms are to be cased and uncased ONLY during Live Periods and preferably only at the Firing line (forward wooden benches) Actions open, Magazines removed (empty cases can be returned to rear gear tables)
- * Firearms are to be Loaded and Unloaded ONLY on the Firing Line (forward wooden shooting Benches)
- * Muzzles are always to be pointed down range or upwards.
(magazine may be filled or emptied at the rear gear benches and tables).

“CEASE FIRE” ROUTINE/PROCEDURES:

- * Remove ammunition from the Chamber. Remove magazines from the action
- * Leave actions visibly open-(a chamber flag helps visibility!)
- Then- **Your Choice:**
- * Leave firearm(muzzle pointed down range, magazine removed, action open) on FIRING LINE bench.

Or

- * Carry firearm muzzle up and place in rear wall rack- magazine removed action open.
- * Remember to take needed targets, tape, stapler, beverage, etc. with you when leaving the shooting bench area for the Cease Fire Period. (An RSO can retrieve forgotten items.)
- * During a Cease Fire DO NOT go within 3 metres of the firearms on the bench or handle firearms on the racks(Remember your P.A.L. Course). Do not touch anything on your shooting table. (An RSO can retrieve forgotten items).
- * During a Cease Fire the divided concrete slab area around the shooting benches is to be used to walk through only on the way to your target and back. Please remain off the shooting table area concrete during cease fire periods.

Safety Tip

Each Range has a Perimeter Flag. If the Red Flag is in the UP position that is a indicator that the range is active. Even if their is a cease fire shooting can start at anytime.

It is a good idea to put your Hearing Protection on at the Perimeter Flag before you get to the active range. (Range Rules require that hearing and eye protection be worn on the Ranges.)

The Federal Licensing Course suggest you wear both in ear and outside ear protection, another option is the "Electronics Earmuffs" Good Christmas List need item.

Once your hearing is damage it cannot be fixed and it does not repair itself.

Trophy winners for all categories will be announced in the club newsletter prior to the annual general meeting in March, at which time trophies will be presented.

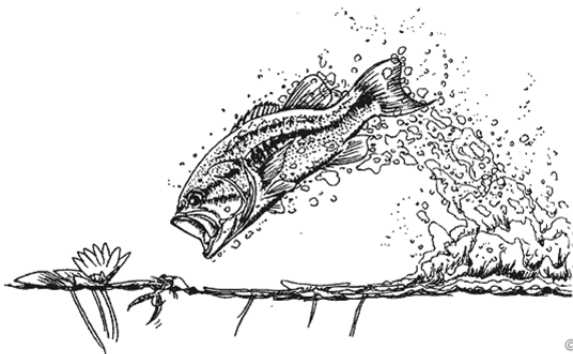
SEALS, SEA LIONS THREATEN ORCA & SALMON RECOVERY

A recent Washington state study suggests that the increasing population of seals and sea lions may be negatively impacting the survival of Southern Resident Killer Whales (SRKW) in the Pacific Northwest region. The study found that seals and sea lions are consuming more of the Chinook salmon, the primary food of the SRKW, than the number harvested by the various fisheries.

Researchers found that, from 1975 to 2015, marine mammals along the U.S. west coast ate significantly more Chinook salmon - from 6100 tonnes to 15200 tonnes. In the same period, the Chinook catch by commercial and recreational fishing from northern California to Alaska declined from 16400 to 9600 tonnes. This quantifies yet another pressure on recovering the salmon population. The study brings another component of the ecosystem; predators, into the picture. Predators may be eating even more salmon in the ocean than previously thought.

The study estimated how much salmon in different life stages were eaten by four marine mammal species - California sea lions, Stellar sea lions, harbour seals and fish-eating killer whales. Killer whales ate the most salmon in terms of biomass while harbour seals ate the greatest numbers of salmon; mostly juvenile fish. The study did not account for additional salmon consumed by other fish, marine birds or porpoises.

LOCAL SALMON SPAWNING ESCAPEMENTS

Local Coho salmon spawning escapements were very poor this year. Chinook spawners in the Cowichan River were the highest in many years with in excess of 20,000 (including jacks). Five thousand Coho pre-smolts (from 2016 brood) were released November 29 into a pond on Bear Mountain. These will migrate into Millstream in spring 2018 before exiting to the ocean via Esquimalt Harbour.

Some local stream escapements are listed below: M=males, F=females, J=jacks

NEW VANCOUVER ISLAND DEER BOOK

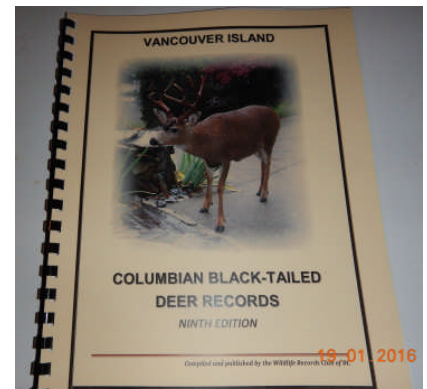
Copies of the ninth edition (2016) of the Vancouver Island Columbian Blacktail Deer Records are available at a cost of \$10 each. The publication contains an excellent article written by Byron Mason on fifty years with the deer in the Nimpkish Valley. Byron relates the impact of wolf and cougar predation on deer population abundance and hence, hunting success. He also includes 45 years of deer count data from 1970 through 2015.

There is also an article on early cougar hunting where the provincial government paid a bounty of varying amounts on cougars taken between 1870 and 1958. The new edition contains numerous colour photographs of harvested deer as well as record heads and antlers.

Copies of the previous eighth edition (2010) are still available at a cost of \$5.00.

The current records list over 2160 entries scoring 100 or more Boone & Crockett points.

Of particular note is the re-scoring of the Norm Hammond buck from 1942. These antlers were the number two head in the previous eighth edition (2010) scoring 139 7/8.



**NEW 7th EDITION BIG GAME RECORDS OF B.C.**

The new 7th edition of the *Big Game Records of British Columbia* is now available at a cost of \$35. The 560 page hard cover book is published by the Wildlife Records Club of B.C. "This is the official records book for exceptional big game species native to British Columbia, based on the Boone and Crockett scoring system." The book lists more than 10,000 entries in 19 big game categories with over 1400 of these being new entries since the previous edition in 2010.

The book includes feature articles, many pictures and hunting stories related to several of the recent entries. "This is a book for all who have an interest in the outstanding diversity and abundance of big game in British Columbia."

"The foundation for the Wildlife Records Club of British Columbia was originally conceived in Kamloops in 1967 with the objective of maintaining a perpetual record of trophy-class big game from British Columbia." Since 1982, operations of the Club have been based on Vancouver Island. The Club continues to qualify volunteer scorers located throughout the province.

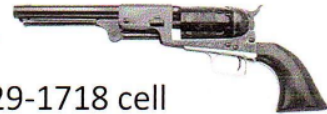

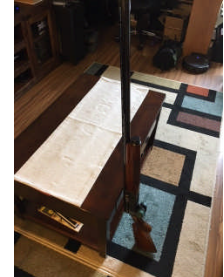
