HOUSE KEEPING

Hello Members, a few house keeping items:

ALL NEW MEMBERS MUST TAKE THE ORIENTATION COURSE BEFORE THEY ARE ALLOWED TO USE THE CLUBS RANGES.

EVERYONE NEEDS TO SIGN IN WHEN AT THE RANGE!!

You cannot sign in anyone (for Free) on your Memberships. (if you don't have a Membership Card you have to have a Day-Pass displayed on you)

Sweeping your brass/steel/empty hulls off the concrete and/or leaving them on the ground is <u>not acceptable</u>. Please clean up after yourself. We have a lot of range users that do not know the rules (Day-Pass Users or New Members that haven't taken the mandatory "Orientation Course") please educate anyone not cleaning up after themselves. Extra buckets have been put at each range, these are not garbage buckets they are to be used for Brass Cartridges (recycle) on the R/P and M/P Range, shotgun shells on the S/G Range. All garbage (paper, plastic, cardboard) goes into the garbage cans.

Please print your Name/Member Number when you sign in, we **NEED** to be able to read what you **Write / Print**. **YOU MUST INITIAL THE ACKNOWLEDGEMENT THAT YOU KNOW THE RULES OF THE CLUB**

If **4:45pm** is Closing Time the last shot is **4:15pm**, you have 1/2 hr. to clean up and be past the main gate before it is locked. You need to be on the other side of the main gate by **4:45pm**. Range staff have already worked their 8 hours and would like to go home and see their families.







"Left the Range"

On March 24th, 2018

Lawrence (Larry) Cuthbert, 84, who was a long time member of several Victoria area clubs including both the Victoria Fish & Game and the Juan de Fuca gun club.

Larry enjoyed a long career in the Canadian Navy and travelled the world in the process. After his retirement from the Navy he worked as an electrician in the private sector specializing in the installation of traffic light relays up and down the entire length of Vancouver Island's highways.

Larry was a shooting and hunting enthusiast for his entire life and he was one of British Columbia's earliest certified Hunter Training Instructors (long before the program was known as CORE).

In his later years Larry had some health issues including a stroke that cost him his sight in one eye, but that didn't ever stop him from enjoying the shooting sports! He continued to target shoot with a variety of different calibre handguns until just before he passed. Larry was a true gentleman, a very good friend to many, and he will be sorely missed by all that knew him.

Surrey, B.C.: The federal government has decided to rush new Gun Control legislation through without full discussion and debate. Members of Parliament went to a Second Reading of Bill C-71 on March 27, 2018. A "Notice of Closure" on Bill C-71 has been posted, but recognized firearms groups in Canada have not been consulted on the changes.

The BC Wildlife Federation represents more than 40,000 British Columbians and a hundred plus sport shooting clubs and fish and game protective associations. Together, we provide training and safe use of firearms and Conservation and Outdoor Recreation Education (CORE).

Bill C-71 is missing the mark in attempting to reduce crime and make Canadians safer. Canada has one of the strictest firearm regimes in the world, but it can't stop shootings by drug gangs. Even at the peak of the longgun registry in 2012, Statistics Canada found that less than 5 per cent of firearms used in homicide had ever been registered. This tiny percentage means that firearms diverted from law-abiding owners cannot be the source of guns used in many violent crimes.

Only two per cent of accused murderers had ever had a Possession and Acquisition Licence (PAL). It makes no sense to target law-abiding firearms owners with this legislation; therefore, the BC Wildlife Federation requests that bill C-71 must be subject to full debate or be rescinded immediately.

The BCWF has numerous questions about the methodology and science behind the proposed legislation, and expects the opportunity to provide recommendations before this Bill is pushed through. The federation is asking our members to call, write and meet with their MPs across the province on this issue. The BCWF Firearms Committee Chair Gary Mauser, and BCWF Recreational Shooting Sports Committee Chair Vic Skaarup have launched a campaign to make sure that any new firearms legislation does not harm responsible hunters and sports shooters.

The government should be working with organizations like ours to support hunter training and firearms safety among young people and new Canadians. Public safety is not being served by Bill C-71 and we cannot support it in its present form.

Dear Minister Goodale,

Re: Withdrawal of Bill C-71

I am writing to you today to request that you withdraw Bill C-71.

Bill C-71 is a blatant attack on law abiding Canadian gun owners, and will do nothing to reduce crime and make Canadians safer. If anything, it will make otherwise law abiding Canadians instant criminals as a result of arbitrary and capricious decisions by the RCMP.

Instead of wasting resources developing additional regulations to inflict on law abiding Canadians, I respectfully suggest you take concrete and meaningful actions to prevent the illegal importation of drugs and guns into Canada, and the deportation of convicted criminals and terrorists out of Canada.

In closing, I urge you not to proceed with legislation that punishes Canada's law abiding firearms owners and does nothing to improve public safety.

Timberwest Access Program



Fired Range Brass Program reminder!

Just another reminder to our members to PLEASE only put fired pistol and rifle cartridge cases (brass or steel) into the plastic range brass buckets that are provided on the firing line. Please use the provided garbage cans on our ranges to dispose of your garbage and ONLY put your fired rifle and pistol cartridge cases in the buckets provided for range brass. If you could please do that it would definitely help to make our job a lot easier and a lot less disgusting. It is a nasty, time consuming job to separate and sort all of the garbage out of the brass buckets first. (Including the chicken bones and tinned lunch leftovers that I just cleaned out of the MP buckets today. Come on people, the garbage can is located only mere FEET away from the brass buckets!)

The volume of saleable, reloadable brass is down noticeably over the past year or so and I'd just like to remind our members that while we pretty much consider any brass that is still lying on the ground or on the concrete to be "fair game", fired brass which has been placed into the club's range buckets are then considered to be the property of the club. It appears that there are shooters who are "raiding" the range buckets and taking fired brass. All of the funds that are generated from brass sales, including scrap brass, goes directly to the club and helps to pay for repairs, upkeep, and improvements on the range property. If you take brass from the range buckets you are essentially denying revenue to the club which is used to your benefit. We'd ask that you please respect our "once the brass is in the bucket it stays in the bucket" policy for the benefit of all of our members.

Just a reminder too that the brass we sell through the club's brass recover program is sold "as received" in the range buckets and you will need to tumble it to clean it before your reload it. Some of it is once fired from factory ammunition, and some of it may have been reloaded several times. We have absolutely no control over that and it up to you to clean it and then inspect it before you reload it. You get it just as we receive it and do not guarantee it to be only once fired.

Having said that, many thanks again to the club members who have donated their surplus, reloadable brass to our club's brass recovery program lately. Also my very sincere thanks again to club members Art Archer and Mike Lesperance who have been doing most of the brass pickup and brass sorting work for the past several months while I've been busy dealing with some ongoing health issues. It is VERY much appreciated.







SAFETY REMINDERS--PLEASE READ

FIREARMS--CASES--BENCHES

- * Firearms are to be <u>cased</u> and <u>uncased</u> <u>ONLY</u> during Live Periods and <u>preferably</u> only at the Firing line (forward wooden benches) Actions open, Magazines removed (empty cases can be returned to rear gear tables)
- * Firearms are to be Loaded and Unloaded ONLY on the Firing Line (forward wooden shooting Benches)
- * Muzzles are <u>always</u> to be pointed down range or upwards. (magazine may be filled or emptied at the rear gear benches and tables).

"CEASE FIRE" ROUTINE/PROCEDURES:

- * Remove ammunition from the Chamber. Remove magazines from the action
- * Leave actions visibly open-(a chamber flag helps visibility!)
 Then- Your Choice:
- * Leave firearm(muzzle pointed down range, magazine removed, action open) on FIRING LINE bench.

Or

- * Carry firearm muzzle up and place in rear wall rack- magazine removed action open.
- * Remember to take needed targets, tape, stapler, beverage, etc. with you when leaving the shooting bench area for the Cease Fire Period. (An RSO can retrieve forgotten items.)
- * During a Cease Fire <u>DO NOT</u> go within 3 metres of the firearms on the bench or handle firearms on the racks(Remember your P.A.L. Course). Do not touch anything on your shooting table. (An RSO can retrieve forgotten items).
- * During a Cease Fire the divided concrete slab area around the shooting benches is to be used to <u>walk</u> <u>through only</u> on the way to your target and back. Please remain off the shooting table area concrete during cease fire periods.

Safety Tip

Each Range has a Perimeter Flag. If the Red Flag is in the UP position that is a indicator that the range is active. Even if their is a cease fire shooting can start at anytime.

It is a good idea to put your Hearing Protection on at the Perimeter Flag before you get to the active range. (Range Rules require that hearing and eye protection be worn on the Ranges.)

The Federal Licensing Course suggest you wear both in ear and outside ear protection, another option is the "Electronics Earmuffs" Good Christmas List need item.

Once your hearing is damage it cannot be fixed and it does not repair itself.

The Amalgamated Conservation Society had its beginnings in 1954 and was officially registered under the current name in 1963. The ACS was largely responsible for the formation of the Sport Fishing Advisory Board in 1964. Our members form the main component of the local Victoria Sport Fishing Advisory Committee. The Society has been active in salmon enhancement since the early 1970's with fry feeding and the use of gravel upwelling incubation boxes. We started the use of marine enclosures for the short term rearing of Chinook fry in Saanich Inlet starting in 1989. The Howard English Goldstream Hatchery is operated by one of our member clubs. We have been active in numerous issues affecting the management of our recreational fishery.

The directors of the Society have met and examined the discussion paper 'Proposed'

2018 Salmon Fishery Management Measures to Support Chinook Salmon Prey Availability for Southern Resident Killer Whales' issued February 15, 2018.

The ACS supports the position being recommended by the Victoria Sport Fishing Advisory Committee for Juan de Fuca (Area 20) and North Pender/Saturna Islands (area 18). The Victoria SFAC held three public meetings to discuss the document as follows:

February 26 in Sidney, February 28 in Esquimalt and March 06 in Sooke. As a result of these meetings, adjustments were made to the closed areas proposed in the discussion paper. Local anglers recommended that all three of these closure proposals be only closed to salmon fishing and that they remain open to bottom fishing for the likes of rockfish, lingcod and halibut.

These closures are recommended for a one year trial basis only with a review prior to the 2019 IFMP draft.

The ACS also supports the voluntary "bubble zone" around the Southern Resident Killer Whales (SRKW). This would involve anglers adjusting their fishing when whales were in the area by turning off their sounders, bringing in their gear and slowly moving away from the approaching whales.

We also feel strongly that other measures need to be incorporated into the SRKW recovery plan strategy, as follows:



- 1. A Harbour seal and California sea lion predator control program needs to be implemented immediately throughout the South Coast. Recent studies have shown that these pinnipeds are consuming unacceptably large amounts of Chinook smolts and juveniles during their first ocean year. Additionally, anglers are losing thousands of salmon annually due largely to Harbour seals taking salmon from their lines.
- 2. Hatchery enhancement of Chinook salmon needs to be greatly increased starting immediately. The Fraser River needs particular attention as the depressed state of these Chinook stocks is the greatest threat to the SRKW. In fact, it is likely the primary reason that the SRKW population now numbers only 76 individuals.
- 3. Many more Chinook net pen rearing projects should be instituted to greatly increase the survival rate of the fry to juvenile stage. These can be strategically placed throughout the SRKW core feeding areas. The adult Chinooks will return to these sites and will be available to the whales.
- 4. The commercial harvest of herring, other bait fish and krill, should be banned. If Chinook production is to be greatly increased, then these additional fish need adequate food to survive. The average size of mature Chinook has been statistically decreasing over the last couple decades. Perhaps this is in part being caused by insufficient quality feed.

NEW VANCOUVER ISLAND DEER BOOK

Copies of the ninth edition (2016) of the Vancouver Island Columbian Blacktail Deer Records are available at a cost of \$10 each. The publication contains an excellent article written by Byron Mason on fifty years with the deer in the Nimpkish Valley. Byron relates the impact of wolf and cougar predation on deer population abundance and hence, hunting success. He also includes 45 years of deer count data from 1970 through 2015.


There is also an article on early cougar hunting where the provincial government paid a bounty of varying amounts on cougars taken between 1870 and 1958. The new edition contains numerous colour photographs of harvested deer as well as record heads and antlers.

Copies of the previous eighth edition (2010) are still available at a cost of \$5.00.

The current records list over 2160 entries scoring 100 or more Boone & Crockett points.

Of particular note is the re-scoring of the Norm Hammond buck from 1942. These antlers were the number two head in the previous eighth edition (2010) scoring 139 7/8.

Following a request from the current owner, it was panel scored in March 2015 and is now ranked as the number one Vancouver Island deer with a score of 143 5/8.





KILLER WHALES CAUSE SMALLER CHINOOK SIZE

There has been much discussion of late concerning the shortage of large Chinook salmon as a food source for Southern Resident Killer Whales (SRKW). It now appears that the killer whales themselves may be responsible for the decreased size at age of Chinook.

The authors of a recent scientific paper published in the journal *Fish and Fisheries* set out to determine the cause of both declining age at maturity and declining size at age of Chinook salmon.

The study involved 85 separate Chinook stocks or populations, both hatchery and wild, from Alaska to northern California, totalling 1.5 million individual measurements. They found that hatcheries were not responsible for either smaller or younger fish at maturity.

While hatchery Chinook were larger than their wild counterparts at age 1 and 2, wild fish were about equal in size by ages 3 and 4.

They found that fisheries selection was also not responsible for the smaller size as the same trends were observed where low exploitation rates occurred.

While many factors come into play in determining size and age structures in any population, the authors concluded that the likely cause is size selection of prey (ie. large Chinook) by resident killer whales. Declines in age and size were most pronounced in northern populations where resident killer whales were more numerous and increasing, but were common coastwide.

The authors noted that Chinook predation by marine mammals (ie. seals, sea lions and

killer whales) has increased three fold since the mid 1970's. Resident killer whales in the northeast Pacific number greater than 2300. Ninety percent of their diet is Chinook salmon age 4 to 6. These are large fish of close to 20 pounds to over 50 pounds. Killer whales consumed 10,000 metric tonnes (22,000,000 lb.) of Chinook in 2015 which represents over 2,000,000 adult salmon.

The SRKW may be eating themselves out of a food source which could lead to their demise, but this may not be a bad thing if you are a Chinook salmon.

SALISH SEA MARINE SURVIVAL PROJECT

I attended a Pacific Salmon Foundation (PSF) community meeting on March 10 at the Victoria Conference Centre. The meeting was held prior to the annual PSF dinner and fundraiser that evening. Volunteer groups and organizations made short presentations on their various projects. Dr. Brian Riddell, CEO of the Foundation, gave an interesting talk on the *Salish Sea Marine Survival Project*.

This project was eight years in the design phase and has just concluded three years of field study. The project arose out of the rapid decline in catches of Chinook, Coho and Steelhead within Georgia Strait in the early 1990's. Current catches are only about one tenth of the previous peak catches. Why? What can we do to reverse this decline?

The \$10,000,000 project in Georgia Strait is now in the analysis and modelling stage. A similar project is being conducted by Washington State within Puget Sound. Over 80 scientists were involved in 40 different projects and over 11,000 samples were collected.

Some preliminary results were discussed. Initial estimates indicate that harbour seals are

consuming up to 40% of juvenile Chinook and 47% of Coho in Georgia Strait. PIT tags (Passive Integrated Tags) are being used to monitor migration and mortality of juvenile Chinook. Seals have been equipped with units which record and transmit a signal each time a Chinook smolt with a PIT tag is consumed. Results from the Big Qualicum Hatchery confirmed the high Chinook mortality due to seal predation.

Tagged Cowichan Hatchery Chinook smolts had a lower survival rate when flows were low. They theorized that the juvenile salmon were more vulnerable to predators when the flows were low. They also found hundreds of PIT tags near a Heron rookery. Predation by certain bird species can be significant at times.




