HOUSE KEEPING

Hello Members, a few house keeping items:

ALL NEW MEMBERS MUST TAKE THE ORIENTATION COURSE BEFORE THEY ARE ALLOWED TO USE THE CLUBS RANGES.

EVERYONE NEEDS TO SIGN IN WHEN AT THE RANGE!!

You cannot sign in anyone (for Free) on your Memberships. (if you don't have a Membership Card you have to have a Day-Pass displayed on you)

Sweeping your brass/steel/empty hulls off the concrete and/or leaving them on the ground is **not acceptable**. Please clean up after yourself. We have a lot of range users that do not know the rules (Day-Pass Users or New Members that haven't taken the mandatory "Orientation Course") please educate anyone not cleaning up after themselves. Extra buckets have been put at each range, these are not garbage buckets they are to be used for Brass Cartridges (recycle) on the R/P and M/P Range, shotgun shells on the S/G Range. All garbage (paper, plastic, cardboard) goes into the garbage cans.

Please print your Name/Member Number when you sign in, we **NEED** to be able to read what you **Write / Print**. **YOU MUST INITIAL THE ACKNOWLEDGEMENT THAT YOU KNOW THE RULES OF THE CLUB**

If **4:45pm** is Closing Time the last shot is **4:15pm**, you have 1/2 hr. to clean up and be past the main gate before it is locked. You need to be on the other side of the main gate by **4:45pm**. Range staff have already worked their 8 hours and would like to go home and see their families.

Surrey, B.C.: The federal government has decided to rush new Gun Control legislation through without full discussion and debate. Members of Parliament went to a Second Reading of Bill C-71 on March 27, 2018. A “Notice of Closure” on Bill C-71 has been posted, but recognized firearms groups in Canada have not been consulted on the changes.

The BC Wildlife Federation represents more than 40,000 British Columbians and a hundred plus sport shooting clubs and fish and game protective associations. Together, we provide training and safe use of firearms and Conservation and Outdoor Recreation Education (CORE).

Bill C-71 is missing the mark in attempting to reduce crime and make Canadians safer. Canada has one of the strictest firearm regimes in the world, but it can’t stop shootings by drug gangs. Even at the peak of the longgun registry in 2012, Statistics Canada found that less than 5 per cent of firearms used in homicide had ever been registered. This tiny percentage means that firearms diverted from law-abiding owners cannot be the source of guns used in many violent crimes.

Only two per cent of accused murderers had ever had a Possession and Acquisition Licence (PAL). It makes no sense to target law-abiding firearms owners with this legislation; therefore, the BC Wildlife Federation requests that bill C-71 must be subject to full debate or be rescinded immediately.

The BCWF has numerous questions about the methodology and science behind the proposed legislation, and expects the opportunity to provide recommendations before this Bill is pushed through. The federation is asking our members to call, write and meet with their MPs across the province on this issue. The BCWF Firearms Committee Chair Gary Mauser, and BCWF Recreational Shooting Sports Committee Chair Vic Skaarup have launched a campaign to make sure that any new firearms legislation does not harm responsible hunters and sports shooters.

The government should be working with organizations like ours to support hunter training and firearms safety among young people and new Canadians. Public safety is not being served by Bill C-71 and we cannot support it in its present form.

Dear Minister Goodale,

Re: Withdrawal of Bill C-71

I am writing to you today to request that you withdraw Bill C-71.

Bill C-71 is a blatant attack on law abiding Canadian gun owners, and will do nothing to reduce crime and make Canadians safer. If anything, it will make otherwise law abiding Canadians instant criminals as a result of arbitrary and capricious decisions by the RCMP.

Instead of wasting resources developing additional regulations to inflict on law abiding Canadians, I respectfully suggest you take concrete and meaningful actions to prevent the illegal importation of drugs and guns into Canada, and the deportation of convicted criminals and terrorists out of Canada.

In closing, I urge you not to proceed with legislation that punishes Canada's law abiding firearms owners and does nothing to improve public safety.

NEW 7th EDITION BIG GAME RECORDS OF B.C.

The new 7th edition of the *Big Game Records of British Columbia* is now available at a cost of \$35. The 560 page hard cover book is published by the Wildlife Records Club of B.C. "This is the official records book for exceptional big game species native to British Columbia, based on the Boone and Crockett scoring system." The book lists more than 10,000 entries in 19 big game categories with over 1400 of these being new entries since the previous edition in 2010.

The book includes feature articles, many pictures and hunting stories related to several of the recent entries. "This is a book for all who have an interest in the outstanding diversity and abundance of big game in British Columbia."

"The foundation for the Wildlife Records Club of British Columbia was originally conceived in Kamloops in 1967 with the objective of maintaining a perpetual record of trophy-class big game from British Columbia." Since 1982, operations of the Club have been based on Vancouver Island. The Club continues to qualify volunteer scorers located throughout the province.

WILD BUNCH JUNE 9, 2018

A very exciting Wild Bunch was held at the multi purpose range. The event had few participants, however, possible inclement weather and illness was a factor in the modest turnout. The event was hotly contested and exciting non the less with entrants from Victoria and Courtenay. The Shootists shot 4 main stages with 1911's, '97 or model 12 pump guns and pistol calibre rifles .40 calibre or better. Each participant had to hit 132 targets in the 4 stage competition in the shortest possible time. Due to the deadline for publication scores were unavailable.

The Wild Bunch was inspired by the movie of the same name which came out in 1969. The scenarios are based on the Mexican Revolution of 1916. And, why you might ask are Canadians competing in a competition based on a movie taking place in border Mexico. Wild Bunch competitions are very popular in Canada, many Canadian adventurers and soldiers of fortune went to Mexico to join Pancho Villa's American Legion and other Canadians chose to join the Federales. High profile Canadian military men such as Captain Alfred Lewis who became the artillery commander of the insurrectos or Caryl Rhys Pryce and ex soldier and RCMP member became a group commander for the Federal forces. There were a multitude of Canadians who went to Mexico for gold and glory. Most received neither.

Timberwest Access Program



Check your Lyman 50 cal. Safety Warning:

Lyman has determined that some black powder rifles and pistols could, under certain circumstances, develop separation in the breech plug, which may pose a potential safety hazard. Please do not load or use any rifles or pistols subject to this recall.

How to Identify Rifles and Pistols Subject to the Recall:

Find the serial number where the barrel meets the tang, opposite of the lock. The serial number has the letter "A" followed by a series of 6 numbers.

Action to be Taken:

If the serial number is within the range of A595960–A599026, immediately discontinue any use of this product. Please contact the Lyman Customer Service Department by emailing customerservice@lymanproducts.com or by calling **800-225-9626** Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 4:15 p.m. EST. You will be asked to provide your contact information, serial number, and either the part number or model to process the return.

Anyone outside the U.S.A. who is in possession of a black powder rifle or pistol within the recall range should contact your local distributor immediately.

Fired Range Brass Program reminder!

Just another reminder to our members to PLEASE only put fired pistol and rifle cartridge cases (brass or steel) into the plastic range brass buckets that are provided on the firing line. Please use the provided garbage cans on our ranges to dispose of your garbage and ONLY put your fired rifle and pistol cartridge cases in the buckets provided for range brass. If you could please do that it would definitely help to make our job a lot easier and a lot less disgusting. It is a nasty, time consuming job to separate and sort all of the garbage out of the brass buckets first. (Including the chicken bones and tinned lunch leftovers that I just cleaned out of the MP buckets today. Come on people, the garbage can is located only mere FEET away from the brass buckets!)

The volume of saleable, reloadable brass is down noticeably over the past year or so and I'd just like to remind our members that while we pretty much consider any brass that is still lying on the ground or on the concrete to be "fair game", fired brass which has been placed into the club's range buckets are then considered to be the property of the club. It appears that there are shooters who are "raiding" the range buckets and taking fired brass. All of the funds that are generated from brass sales, including scrap brass, goes directly to the club and helps to pay for repairs, upkeep, and improvements on the range property. If you take brass from the range buckets you are essentially denying revenue to the club which is used to your benefit. We'd ask that you please respect our "once the brass is in the bucket it stays in the bucket" policy for the benefit of all of our members.

Just a reminder too that the brass we sell through the club's brass recover program is sold "as received" in the range buckets and you will need to tumble it to clean it before your reload it. Some of it is once fired from factory ammunition, and some of it may have been reloaded several times. We have absolutely no control over that and it is up to you to clean it and then inspect it before you reload it. You get it just as we receive it and do not guarantee it to be only once fired.

Having said that, many thanks again to the club members who have donated their surplus, reloadable brass to our club's brass recovery program lately. Also my very sincere thanks again to club members Art Archer and Mike Lesperance who have been doing most of the brass pickup and brass sorting work for the past several months while I've been busy dealing with some ongoing health issues. It is VERY much appreciated.

As usual, nothing like this comes together without a lot of volunteer time and help. Thanks to all of the volunteer coaches and RSO's who helped instruct the students for the day, and thanks to David Michaud who lead the instruction of the students.

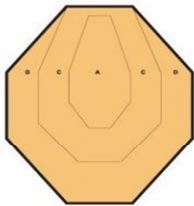

Airsoft News

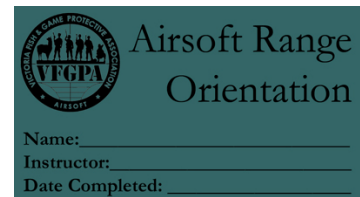

We have been given a large donation of used but excellent lumber from West Coast Super Storage. There are several sizes of framing material in large numbers. About half of the material has been moved from Sooke to the range and it's hoped the remaining half will be moved during the first half of June.

A new guest pass has been created for Airsoft Range use only. Members who are 18+ in age, and who have completed the Airsoft Orientation (not to be confused with the general orientation everyone takes), are now able to bring guests to Airsoft range whenever it's not booked for an event. This allows members to introduce their friends to the sport, conduct squad practices, play ad hoc games and so on. Guests must be accompanied by the member when purchasing the pass and they must stay with them on the Airsoft range; Guests may not purchase the passes on their own or use the range without a member present. 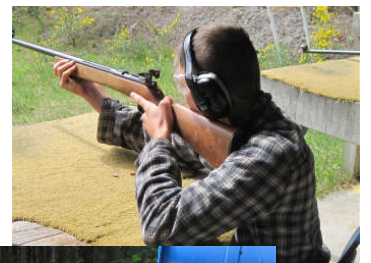

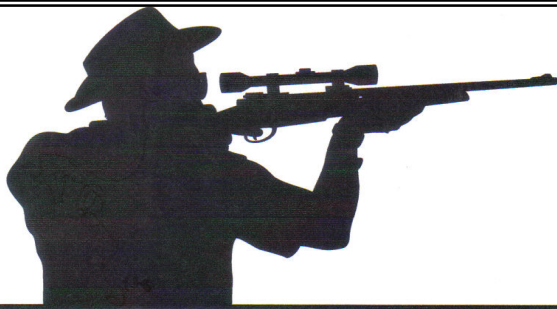

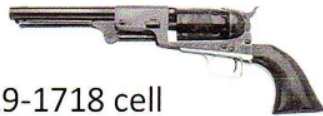

SAFETY REMINDERS--PLEASE READ

FIREARMS--CASES--BENCHES

- * Firearms are to be cased and uncased ONLY during Live Periods and preferably only at the Firing line (forward wooden benches) Actions open, Magazines removed (empty cases can be returned to rear gear tables)
- * Firearms are to be Loaded and Unloaded ONLY on the Firing Line (forward wooden shooting Benches)
- * Muzzles are always to be pointed down range or upwards.
(magazine may be filled or emptied at the rear gear benches and tables).

“CEASE FIRE” ROUTINE/PROCEDURES:

- * Remove ammunition from the Chamber. Remove magazines from the action
- * Leave actions visibly open-(a chamber flag helps visibility!)
- Then- **Your Choice:**
- * Leave firearm(muzzle pointed down range, magazine removed, action open) on FIRING LINE bench.

Or

- * Carry firearm muzzle up and place in rear wall rack- magazine removed action open.
- * Remember to take needed targets, tape, stapler, beverage, etc. with you when leaving the shooting bench area for the Cease Fire Period. (An RSO can retrieve forgotten items.)
- * During a Cease Fire DO NOT go within 3 metres of the firearms on the bench or handle firearms on the racks(Remember your P.A.L. Course). Do not touch anything on your shooting table. (An RSO can retrieve forgotten items).
- * During a Cease Fire the divided concrete slab area around the shooting benches is to be used to walk through only on the way to your target and back. Please remain off the shooting table area concrete during cease fire periods.

Safety Tip

Each Range has a Perimeter Flag. If the Red Flag is in the UP position that is a indicator that the range is active. Even if their is a cease fire shooting can start at anytime.

It is a good idea to put your Hearing Protection on at the Perimeter Flag before you get to the active range. (Range Rules require that hearing and eye protection be worn on the Ranges.)

The Federal Licensing Course suggest you wear both in ear and outside ear protection, another option is the "Electronics Earmuffs" Good Christmas List need item.

Once your hearing is damage it cannot be fixed and it does not repair itself.

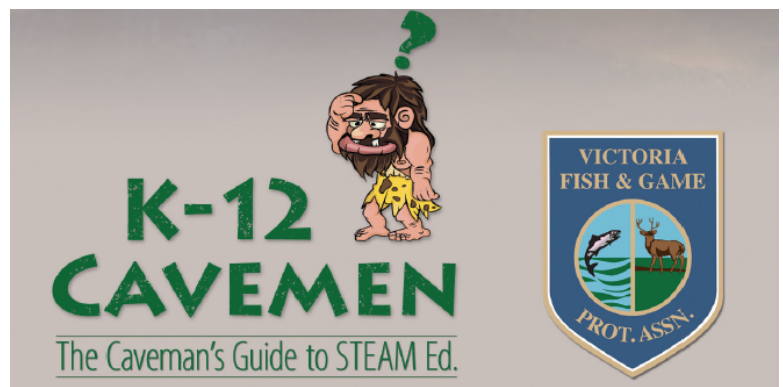

NEW VANCOUVER ISLAND DEER BOOK

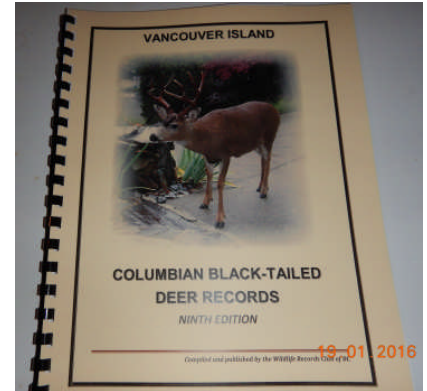
Copies of the ninth edition (2016) of the Vancouver Island Columbian Blacktail Deer Records are available at a cost of \$10 each. The publication contains an excellent article written by Byron Mason on fifty years with the deer in the Nimpkish Valley. Byron relates the impact of wolf and cougar predation on deer population abundance and hence, hunting success. He also includes 45 years of deer count data from 1970 through 2015.

There is also an article on early cougar hunting where the provincial government paid a bounty of varying amounts on cougars taken between 1870 and 1958. The new edition contains numerous colour photographs of harvested deer as well as record heads and antlers.

Copies of the previous eighth edition (2010) are still available at a cost of \$5.00. The current records list over 2160 entries scoring 100 or more Boone & Crockett points.

Of particular note is the re-scoring of the Norm Hammond buck from 1942. These antlers were the number two head in the previous eighth edition (2010) scoring 139 7/8.

Following a request from the current owner, it was panel scored in March 2015 and is now ranked as the number one Vancouver Island deer with a score of 143 5/8.



CHINOOK FISHING RESTRICTIONS ANNOUNCED

On May 30, DFO announced fishing closures and restrictions effective June 01 to September 30 as part of the Southern Resident Killer Whale (SRKW) Recovery Plan and to reduce Chinook exploitation rates on stocks of concern by 25-35%.

The extensive package of regulations reduces daily limits to one or zero in areas and times in Northern B.C. Chinook recreational fisheries.

In Southern B.C., DFO chose to ignore the recommendations of the local Victoria Sport Fishing Advisory Committee with respect to proposed closed areas. In Juan de Fuca Strait, the original proposal was to close the area from Sheringham Point to East Point at Port Renfrew. The SFAB recommendation was for a smaller closed area for salmon fishing only. The recently announced regulation closes the entire area from Otter Point to East Point to all fishing. Similarly, the entire proposed closure around Pender Island was instituted.

The Area G commercial troll fishery for Chinook on the west coast of Vancouver Island was closed May 31 and will remain closed to at least the end of July. This fishery has a TAC (total allowable catch) of 15,000 fish. The catch to May 31 was somewhere around 12,000,

Most of Georgia Strait is either closed to all fishing for this period or has had the Chinook daily limit reduced from two to one. In Areas 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 28 and parts of 29 the daily limit is reduced to one. This includes the area from Kelsey Bay in Johnstone Strait to Saltspring Island and from the mouth of the Fraser River to south of Knight Inlet on the B.C. mainland coast.

The current wild release over 67 cm. is extended to June 28 for the area between Cadboro Point and Otter Point. From June 29 to July 31, the wild release size increases to 85 cm.

Daily limits remain at two Chinook. From August 01 on, the daily limit is two Chinook over 45 cm. - wild or hatchery.

Anglers are disappointed that there was no announcement regarding a seal and sea lion control program considering the impact they have as predators of both juvenile and adult salmon. There was also no announcement of restrictions on the movement of whale watching vessels within the areas closed to recreational fishing.

The Esquimalt Anglers' Association is a local club formed in 1952 to service the needs of boaters and anglers in this area. Over the past decade, the Association has had an average annual membership of about 500.

It is important that boat launch ramps, wharves and associated parking areas be maintained in our communities. Public access launches provided by municipalities or regional districts and those like the EAA facilities, provided and operated by service clubs, offer a valuable asset to the community. Many of these sites also provide boat launch access for public enforcement personnel, search & rescue, Federal Fisheries (DFO), Provincial Conservation Officer Service, military personnel and others. Boaters of all types, including anglers, contribute greatly to the local economy. The rapid growth of water-based ecotourism and associated use of kayaks is particularly noticeable. A 2016 study determined that the boating contribution to B.C.'s economy was \$1.3 billion.

Over 50 percent of boaters use launches to go fishing. However, there has been a decline in the number of free accesses and launches where boaters can put their vessels in the water. It is paramount that policy makers and planners in government and the private sector protect and expand public access boat launch facilities.

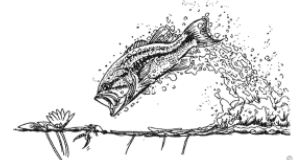
