

The Liberals are playing dishonest games with stats to crack down on legal gun owners

Opinion: While the Liberal party sees gun control as a possible 'wedge' issue, StatsCan simply has no evidence to support their claims

The Toronto and Fredericton shootings all but guarantee that gun control will become a key political issue in next year's federal election. With their momentum interrupted by their indecisiveness on the Trans Mountain pipeline, the Liberal party sees gun control as a possible "wedge" issue.

Officially known as An Act to Amend Certain Acts and Regulations in Relation to Firearms, Bill C-71 assumes that constricting the lawful sale and use of firearms will reduce criminal violence.

The draft legislation proposes new provisions that augment existing measures. These include: extending background checks to cover a buyer's life history (instead of just the past five years), reinstating the requirement for request permits to transport restricted firearms to gun shops or gun shows, and unleashing the RCMP to restrict or prohibit firearms. Firearm vendors must also retain sales information for 20 years, a move decried by some as a "backdoor gun registry."

According to Public Safety Minister Ralph Goodale, Bill C-71 is a response to substantial increases in gun violence since 2013. It is legislation driven and justified by the empirical evidence. Or so it would seem.

In actuality, the statistical basis for Bill C-71 is particularly weak. Its reliance on faulty assumptions regarding crime and firearms breaks with the government's promise of legislation tempered by "evidence-based decision making."

Minister Goodale's assertion that "gun homicides are up by two-thirds since 2013" should concern Canadians. After all, that's quite an increase. But why select 2013 as the baseline for comparison?

2013 was a year of historical lows, a statistical outlier of sorts. According to Statistics Canada, 2013 had the lowest police-recorded crime rate since 1969. In fact, it had the lowest rate of criminal homicides in 50 years (1.45 per 100,000) as well as the lowest rate of fatal shootings ever recorded by Statistics Canada (0.38 per 100,000).

By selecting a year of record lows, marginal increases in succeeding years are made to look like significant surges. This explains Minister Goodale's decision to use four years (2013 to 2016) of crime data instead of the standard five. Selecting 2012 as the point of comparison would weaken the perception that gun violence had increased precipitously.

In truth, gun homicides have not exploded. They have regressed to normal levels prior to 2013. In fact, Canada's crime rate has steadily declined since the 1990s. *In truth, gun homicides have not exploded. They have regressed to normal levels prior to 2013*

What's more, Bill C-71 misunderstands the nature and frequency of violent crime. Most crimes in Canada are neither violent nor involve a firearm.

In 2016, violent crime made up 20 per cent of all Criminal Code offences. In fact, 78 per cent of violent crimes did not involve a weapon. When a weapon is used, either a knife or a blunt instrument is preferred. "Other weapons" account for 19 per cent of weapons-related offences. Only three per cent of violent crimes involved a firearm in 2016. This rate oscillated between 1.9 per cent and 2.3 per cent between 2009 and 2014. Since 1995, knife-related and firearm-related homicides have kept apace, perpetually trading places as the most common homicide method in Canada.

If we are adopting a public safety measure based on lives lost, why hasn't Bill C-71 targeted knives? After all, of the four years used in Minister Goodale's assessment, three (2013, 2014

and 2015) had more knife homicides than gun homicides.

Nevertheless, Bill C-71 fails to address the area where gun violence has actually risen over the past 20 years: gangs.

Gang violence has steadily risen since the 1990s, increasing



from under 10 per cent of all homicides in 1999 to 24 per cent in 2016. Importantly, the 20-per-cent increase in homicides between 2013 and 2016 was driven by an astonishing 68-per-cent increase in gang-related homicides over that period. In 2016, 54 per cent of all firearm-related homicides were gang-related.

However, this rise in gang violence is concentrated in urban zones. From 2013 to 2016, gang-related homicides doubled in metropolitan areas. Though rates of firearm violence in urban and rural areas are comparable, a large proportion of violent crime occurs in rural First Nations Reserves. In fact, Minister Goodale suggested that new drug markets were driving gangs into Indigenous communities.

Crucially, Bill C-71's focus on the legal means of firearm ownership disregards illegal channels. The firearms used by gangs are generally smuggled into Canada as part of the drug trade. Analyses of guns recovered from criminal activity in various Canadian cities show that over two-thirds were smuggled. *Continuing next page*



This is not to suggest that illegal firearms cannot be acquired domestically. However, the claim that there has been an increase in straw purchasing where gang-affiliated people with clean criminal records get firearm licences to traffic guns is not supported by any statistics. In general, the claim that there has been an increase in illegal firearms obtained from "domestic sources" is not backed by Statistics Canada.

However, there is a large pool of firearms in Canada with questionable legality. When firearm licensing was introduced in 2001, between one-third and one-half of then-law-abiding Canadian gun owners declined to apply for a licence. Though civilian gun owners ranged from 3.3 million to 4.5 million in 2001, fewer than 2 million licences were issued. Many gun owners remain outside the system.

Instead of calling for more laws, perhaps a better approach would be to enforce the current laws. We urge authorities to focus on the following areas: enhancing the treatment of mental illness; focusing directly on gangs and organized crime; and investing in Canada Border Services Agency to address the smuggling of drugs and firearms into Canada.

In sum, a more measured approach is required. Measures like Bill C-71 that focus exclusively on law-abiding Canadians are simply not effective crime-reduction strategies.

Timberwest Access Program



PAY ATTENTION LYMAN OWNERS AND FRIENDS OF SAME !!!

Check your Lyman 50 cal. Safety Warning:

Lyman has determined that some black powder rifles and pistols could, under certain circumstances, develop separation in the breech plug, which may pose a potential safety hazard. Please do not load or use any rifles or pistols subject to this recall.

How to Identify Rifles and Pistols Subject to the Recall:

Find the serial number where the barrel meets the tang, opposite of the lock. The serial number has the letter "A" followed by a series of 6 numbers.

Action to be Taken:

If the serial number is within the range of A595960–A599026, immediately discontinue any use of this product. Please contact the Lyman Customer Service Department by emailing<u>customerservice@lymanproducts.com</u> or by calling <u>800-225-9626</u> Monday through Friday,9 a.m. to 4:15 p.m. EST. You will be asked to provide your contact information, serial number, and either the part number or model to process the return.

Anyone outside the U.S.A. who is in possession of a black powder rifle or pistol within the recall range should contact your local distributor immediately.

BRASS PROGRAM

Just another reminder to our members to PLEASE only put fired pistol and rifle cartridge cases (brass or steel) into the plastic range brass buckets that are provided on the firing line. Please use the provided garbage cans on our ranges to dispose of your garbage and ONLY put your fired rifle and pistol cartridge cases in the buckets provided for range brass. If you could please do that it would definitely help to make our job a lot easier and a lot less disgusting. It is a nasty, time consuming job to separate and sort all of the garbage out of the brass buckets first. (Come on people, the garbage can is located only mere FEET away from the brass buckets!)

The volume of saleable, reloadable brass is down noticeably over the past year or so and I'd just like to remind our members once more that while we pretty much consider any brass that is still lying on the ground or on the concrete to be "fair game" if you'd like to pick it up for personal use, fired brass which has been placed into the club's plastic range buckets are then considered to be the property of the club. It appears that there are shooters who are "raiding" the range buckets and taking the club's fired brass. All of the funds that are generated from brass sales, including scrap brass, goes directly to the club and helps to pay for repairs, upkeep, and improvements on the range property. (And the recent purchase of the club's new rental chronograph.) If you take brass from the range buckets you are essentially denying revenue to the club which is used to your benefit. We'd ask that you please respect our "once the brass is in the bucket it stays in

the bucket" policy for the benefit of all of our members.

Just a reminder too that the brass we sell through the club's brass recover program is sold "as received" in the range buckets and you will need to tumble it to clean it before your reload it. Some of it is once fired from factory ammunition, and some of it may have been reloaded several times. We have absolutely no control over that and it up to you to clean it and then inspect it carefully before you reload it. You get it just as we receive it and we do NOT guarantee it to be only once fired.

Many thanks again to the club members who have donated their surplus, reloadable brass to our club's brass recovery program lately, and also my very sincere thanks again to club members Art Archer and Mike Lesperance who have been doing most of the brass pickup and brass sorting work for the past several months while I've been busy dealing with some ongoing health issues. It is VERY much appreciated.


BULLSEYE SHOOTING AT VFGPA? 2018



SAFETY REMINDERS--PLEASE READ

FIREARMS--CASES--BENCHES

* Firearms are to be <u>cased and uncased</u> <u>ONLY</u> during Live Periods and <u>preferably</u> only at the Firing line (forward wooden benches) Actions open, Magazines removed (empty cases can be returned to rear gear tables)

- * Firearms are to be Loaded and Unloaded ONLY on the Firing Line (forward wooden shooting Benches)
- * Muzzles are <u>always</u> to be pointed down range or upwards.

(magazine may be filled or emptied at the rear gear benches and tables).

"CEASE FIRE" ROUTINE/PROCEDURES:

- * Remove ammunition from the Chamber. Remove magazines from the action
- * Leave actions visibly open-(a chamber flag helps visibility!)
- Then- Your Choice:
- * Leave firearm(muzzle pointed down range, magazine removed, action open) on FIRING LINE bench.

Or

* Carry firearm muzzle up and place in rear wall rack- magazine removed action open.

* Remember to take needed targets, tape, stapler, beverage, etc. with you when leaving the shooting bench area for the <u>Cease Fire Period</u>. (An RSO can retrieve forgotten items.)

* During a Cease Fire <u>DO NOT</u> go within 3 metres of the firearms on the bench or handle firearms on the racks(Remember your P.A.L. Course). Do not touch anything on your shooting table. (An RSO can retrieve forgotten items).

* During a Cease Fire the divided concrete slab area around the shooting benches is to be used to **walk through only** on the way to your target and back. Please remain off the shooting table area concrete during cease fire periods.

Safety Tip

Each Range has a Perimeter Flag. If the Red Flag is in the UP position that is a indicator that the range is active. Even if their is a cease fire shooting can start at anytime.

It is a good idea to put your Hearing Protection on at the Perimeter Flag before you get to the active range. (Range Rules require that hearing and eye protection be worn on the Ranges.)

The Federal Licensing Course suggest you wear both in ear and outside ear protection, another option is the "Electronics Earmuffs" Good Christmas List need item.

Once your hearing is damage it cannot be fixed and it does not repair itself.

VICTORIA FISH & GAME ANNUAL BIG GAME COMPETITION

Hunters are reminded that Blacktail deer taken in MU 1-1 through 1-13 by Victoria Fish & Game members are eligible for the five trophies available each year. Deer must be field dressed which means that the heart, liver and kidneys (edible portions) are the only internal organs which can be included when the animal is weighed. Deer must be weighed on Club scales by the caretaker or his designate.

The official weigher reserves the right to refuse weighing any deer which arrives in an unpresentable condition. Lungs must be removed and body cavity wiped dry with a rag or paper towels. Deer 160 pounds and over taken with a rifle and 140 pounds and over taken by bow and arrow must be witnessed by an executive member at time of weighing. Please contact the Club caretaker/manager or Wayne Zaccarelli to make arrangements. Hunters are reminded that access to club facilities is restricted to daylight hours with the gate locked progressively earlier through the hunting season. Please ensure that you confirm the time gates are locked and show up at least a half hour earlier.



NEW VANCOUVER ISLAND DEER BOOK

Copies of the ninth edition (2016) of the Vancouver Island Columbian Blacktail Deer Records are available at a cost of \$10 each. The publication contains an excellent article written by Byron Mason on fifty years with the deer in the Nimpkish Valley. Byron relates the impact of wolf and cougar predation on deer population abundance and hence, hunting success. He also includes 45 years of deer count data from 1970 through 2015.

There is also an article on early cougar hunting where the provincial government paid a bounty of varying amounts on cougars taken between 1870 and 1958. The new edition contains numerous colour photographs of harvested deer as well as record heads and antlers.



Copies of the previous eighth edition (2010) are still available at a cost of \$5.00.

The current records list over 2160 entries scoring 100 or more Boone & Crockett points.

Of particular note is the re-scoring of the Norm Hammond buck from 1942. These antlers were the number two head in the previous eighth edition (2010) scoring 139 7/8.

Following a request from the current owner, it was panel scored in March 2015 and is now ranked as the number one Vancouver Island deer with a score of 143 5/8.

The new 7th edition of the *Big Game Records of British Columbia* is now available at a cost of \$35. The 560 page hard cover book is published by the Wildlife Records Club of B.C. "This is the official records book for exceptional big game species native to British Columbia, based on the Boone and Crockett scoring system." The book lists more than 10,000 entries in 19 big game categories with over 1400 of these being new entries since the previous edition in 2010.

The book includes feature articles, many pictures and hunting stories related to several of the recent entries. "This is a book for all who have an interest in the outstanding diversity and abundance of big game in British Columbia."




