#### **Danger to Legal Firearms Ownership**

Bill C-71 has passed through the House of Commons and is now in the Senate to be debated. Bill C-71 if passed by the Senate will come into force likely in December 2018 or early in 2019. The Government may begin reclassifying all firearms in early 2019 and possibly begin confiscations.

If the current Government is re-elected in the fall of 2019 major re-classifications and confiscations of legally owned firearms from licensed owners will escalate! They will begin with semi automatic rifles (this will probably include hunting rifles ..) then move on to semi automatic handguns.

The Government will re-classify these types of firearms then grandfather as a gesture, but will confiscate when they deem it timely. BY THE END OF THEIR SECOND TERM, THERE MAY NO LONGER BE ANY SHOOTING SPORTS IN CANADA! After this, they will begin to highly restrict regular Bolt-Action hunting rifles and shotguns!

We have already seen the Government support their current initiatives with a massive public relations campaign using fictitious & misleading statistics, supported by non-existent or incorrect data. We have also found that they have suppressed information regarding terrorist and criminal use of firearms just as the prelude to C-71 was being promoted.

The current Government, as well as some of the opposition parties, firmly believes the people of Canada should have no rights to their legally bought property. It appears that each would engineer a society that has characteristics of a police state.

While we are trying not to be partisan, the Conservative Party of Canada is the only political party that has stated "if the Conservatives form a Government in the fall of 2019 Bill C-71 will be repealed".

The immediate remedies are: write all the Senators regarding the negative effects of Bill C-71 on legal, licensed firearms owners. Join any and all firearms activist associations. 2.2million PAL holders are 12.5 percent of the eligible voters in Canada. We are a significant portion of the electorate.

This fight has the capability of being the last battle of legitimate, licensed firearms owners. If we lose, only criminals will have firearms. To paraphrase Colonel Jeff Cooper; "The media, and Government, insist that crime is the major concern of the public today. In this connection they generally push the point that a disarmed society would be a crime-free society. They will not accept the truth that if you take all the legal guns off the street, you still will have a crime with guns problem, whereas if you take the criminals off the street, you will not have a crime, or a gun problem."

Extra buckets have been put at each range, these are not garbage buckets they are to be used for Brass Cartridges (recycle) on the R/P and M/P Range, shotgun shells on the S/G Range. All garbage (paper, plastic, cardboard) goes into the garbage cans.

Remove all ammunition
Observe the chamber
Verify the feeding path
Examine the bore each time you pick up a firearm

#### **Timberwest Access Program**

Our working relationship with Timberwest for hunting and fishing access continues to develop as the years roll by, and we are attracting new membership as a result. Installation of our equipment to bring the Kapoor gate online and the use of ATVs for hunting are in active discussions pending clearance by Timberwest legal counsel. We continue to support the BCWF by including BCWF direct members, and hope that by learning about our club through the access program they will join the family! Our strength is in numbers.

Recent communication with Timberwest indicates that the trust we have developed with our program has opened the door for the Cowichan Valley ATV club to make an application, and with each gate north that we can equip, we expand not only our hunting and fishing range, but through my work with the Outdoor Recreation Council, we open a door for every other club with an interest in the land.

Although only indirectly related to Timberwest as adjoining properties, I found a new gate installed over the summer on East Main that cuts off access to the Jordan River reservoirs, and have initiated an inquiry with the Ministry. It appears to be a BC Hydro gate, which is potentially a good thing for us, as Hydro has skin in the game with the development of our gate access control unit. Prior to the gate going in, I previously contacted Mike Hicks, the FLNRO staff in Alberni, and arranged a meeting between the BCWF exec. and John Horgan's constituency office staff with concerns that the road may be gated, which was apparently a waste of time and bandwidth as we were not consulted about the installation of the gate. It would have cost the exact same amount, and be a lot more robust to have installed it with our equipment. Mike Hicks has campaign signs all over the place, so now would be a good time to call him and ask why we should vote for him. 250-216-5802

The rampant illegal, and dangerously irresponsible use of firearms out there as a result of uncontrolled access is of direct concern to our club, given the current political and social assault on the legitimacy of firearm ownership. We want that road gated, so long as we have keys. The alternative is that it will be permanently deactivated, so for those pedantically "open-road" advocates with loud and poorly thought out opinions, choose your poison carefully. Open roads are the leading cause of closed roads.

#### **BRASS PROGRAM**

I am looking for a club volunteer to take over the club's Range Brass Recovery program.

I have some ongoing health issues and it's just getting to be a bit too much wrk for me to keep up to these days. I took the brass recovery program over a few years ago to give our veteran club member Art Archer a bit of a break from it since he'd been spearheading our brass program for many years. Art has always been involved in MANY of our club's programs and chairmanships (and still is today!) so I'd rather not see Art take the brass program back over again since he has a large enough workload already. I would appreciate it very much if a new club volunteer would be willing to step up and take it over instead. Ideally it would best suit a retired member who would have the time to go up to the range about once a week to collect the buckets of fired range brass and then sort out the dirt and garbage from the recoverable brass and then sort the scrap brass (fired .22 hulls, berdan primed brass cases, and damaged / split / cracked cases) from the saleable rifle and pistol brass. (I often incorporate a shooting day with the brass pickup.) When enough scrap brass accumulates you would run it out to a local scrapyard and drop it off for sale. You would need to keep a running accounting of the reloadable brass sales and the scrap brass sales and then pass the funds on to our club Treasurer, usually on a monthly basis at our meetings.

I have a set of Dillon's plastic brass sorting trays which come with the job and they do help make the sorting much easier. Art and a few other members have been gracious enough to continue to help out with range brass pickup and some of the brass sorting chores and I'm sure that they would continue to do so when needed (when you are away for holidays, etc.), but we need a new volunteer to step up, take the lead, and become the new chairman for the program.

I'd be quite willing to "show you the ropes" and help out for a bit until you are comfortable with taking the program on completely. So, if you are willing to help support the club by taking over this program I'd be happy to hear from you. It is an important program and we have recovered thousands of dollars of club revenue which helps to pay for ongoing maintenance, repairs, and improvements to our various ranges. The club recently bought a basic Model F-1 Chrony which will be available for rental to our paid, card carrying club members. (We will not be renting the club chronograph to day pass users.) We will be charging a nominal fee of only \$10 for the use of the club's chronograph, which will be available to be signed out from the Caretaker's office. We will have a simple form to record the renting member's information and it will be the responsibility of the renter to return the chronograph to the office before they leave the range property. Since we suspect this will be a very popular club program I would suggest that you contact the office in advance to book your rental of the club Chrony by date, to ensure that someone else hasn't arranged to rent it on the same day. The Chrony mounts to a standard camera tripod and for the moment until the club purchases a tripod to keep at the office for use with the Chrony you will need to bring your own tripod.





#### **Safety Tip**

Each Range has a Perimeter Flag. If the Red Flag is in the UP position that is a indicator that the range is active. Even if their is a cease fire shooting can start at anytime.

It is a good idea to put your Hearing Protection on at the Perimeter Flag before you get to the active range. (Range Rules require that hearing and eye protection be worn on the Ranges.)

The Federal Licensing Course suggest you wear both in ear and outside ear protection, another option is the "Electronics Earmuffs" Good Christmas List need item.

Once your hearing is damage it cannot be fixed and it does not repair itself.

#### VICTORIA FISH & GAME ANNUAL BIG GAME COMPETITION

Hunters are reminded that Blacktail deer taken in MU 1-1 through 1-13 by Victoria Fish & Game members are eligible for the five trophies available each year. Deer must be field dressed which means that the heart, liver and kidneys (edible portions) are the only internal organs which can be included when the animal is weighed. Deer must be weighed on Club scales by the caretaker or his designate.

The official weigher reserves the right to refuse weighing any deer which arrives in an unpresentable condition. Lungs must be removed and body cavity wiped dry with a rag or paper towels. Deer 160 pounds and over taken with a rifle and 140 pounds and over taken by bow and arrow must be witnessed by an executive member at time of weighing. Please contact the Club caretaker/manager or Wayne Zaccarelli to make arrangements. Hunters are reminded that access to club facilities is restricted to daylight hours with the gate locked progressively earlier through the hunting season. Please ensure that you confirm the time gates are locked and show up at least a half hour earlier.



In addition, the Victoria Fish & Game Bear trophy is awarded annually for the largest Black bear taken by a Club member. Boone & Crockett Club scoring is used to determine the largest entry. Boundaries are again MU 1-1 through 1-13.

#### NEW VANCOUVER ISLAND DEER BOOK

Copies of the ninth edition (2016) of the Vancouver Island Columbian Blacktail Deer Records are available at a cost of \$10 each. The publication contains an excellent article written by Byron Mason on fifty years with the deer in the Nimpkish Valley. Byron relates the impact of wolf and cougar predation on deer population abundance and hence, hunting success. He also includes 45 years of deer count data from 1970 through 2015.

There is also an article on early cougar hunting where the provincial government paid a bounty of varying amounts on cougars taken between 1870 and 1958. The new edition contains numerous colour photographs of harvested deer as well as record heads and antlers.



Copies of the previous eighth edition (2010) are still available at a cost of \$5.00.

The current records list over 2160 entries scoring 100 or more Boone & Crockett points.

Of particular note is the re-scoring of the Norm Hammond buck from 1942. These antlers were the number two head in the previous eighth edition (2010) scoring 139 7/8.

Following a request from the current owner, it was panel scored in March 2015 and is now ranked as the number one Vancouver Island deer with a score of 143 5/8.

#### **NEW VANCOUVER ISLAND COUGAR CATEGORY**

The Wildlife Records Club of B.C. recently approved a new Vancouver Island Cougar category for their *Big Game Records of B.C.* The decision was made at their October 20 meeting which set a minimum Boone & Crockett score of 14-8/16. The mainland B.C. Cougar category will remain at a minimum score of 15. Ongoing genetic studies reveal that the Vancouver Island cougar is distinct genetically and is generally physically smaller. The latest 7<sup>th</sup> edition (2017) *Big Game Records of British Columbia* book lists only five cougars from Vancouver Island out of 224 scoring 15 or more points.

#### SOUTH ISLAND SPAWNING SALMON RETURNS

Coho and Chinook returns to south Island streams is looking good to end of October. Chinook escapements to Nitinat and Cowichan Rivers is better than recent years' averages. The Cowichan had a huge return of 25,000 plus Chinook of all age classes in 2017. Time will tell if this years' return approaches that number. Coho returns locally are looking better than the poor return in 2017. Colquitz had approximately 120 Coho to October 31, however more than half were jacks (mature male two year old coho). Craigflower Creek had about 60 to the end of October; again with a large jack component. Shawnigan Creek at Mill Bay had 1500 coho transported above the falls at the mouth of the creek. On October 30, about 100 were taken from Shawnigan Creek to Goldstream Hatchery to supplement their brood stock. In recent years Goldstream returns have suffered from poaching and excessive commercial netting in approach waters.

#### ANNUAL FISHING CONTEST CANCELLED

Due to lack of interest and continuing multiple restrictions on tidal angling, the Victoria Fish & Game annual fishing contest has been cancelled. Anglers have been bombarded with size restrictions for lengthier periods and with decreasing sizes. And now, in several areas, total angling closures are in effect for the summer fishing season and these closed areas are set to expand in 2019.

#### **VICTORIA SPORT FISHING ADVISORY COMMITTEE**

The Victoria Sport Fishing Advisory Committee met on October 17 to discuss several issues including the recreational halibut fishery, commercial crab harvest conflicts and Chinook salmon fishing experiences during 2018. Of particular note were two motions which created recreational only crab fishing areas off the Victoria waterfront. Both motions received unanimous support. They call for no commercial crabbing on waters inside the area from Brothers Island (east of Esquimalt Harbour entrance) to Brotchie Ledge light and out to approximately 120-140 foot depth. The second area is from Finlayson Point to the tip of Trial Island and again also to 120-140 feet. These motions were prompted by numerous angler complaints regarding the commercial invasion of crab traps/floats this spring and running through the summer. The volume of traps made it difficult, if not impossible at times, to fish safely through portions of these areas. The increased commercial pressure also made it more difficult for recreational crabbers to obtain legal size crabs in the area close to local launch points and fishing areas. The two motions will pass through the SFAB process before they are dealt with by DFO (through the Minister of Fisheries, Jonathon Wilkinson).



#### **B.C. WILD SALMON STRATEGY**

The B.C. Wild Salmon Advisory Council has recently released its *Options for a Made-in-BC Wild Salmon Strategy*. The Council is comprised of 14 members from the First Nations, Commercial Fishing, Recreational Fishing and Environmental communities. The public consultation process is currently underway. #### SOUTHERN RESIDENT KILLER WHALE RECOVERY PLANS

Both Canada (DFO) and the U.S. (Washington State) have developed recovery plans for the endangered SRKW population. The newest Washington document is a very detailed and costed plan with specific actions proposed. It is a worthwhile read which puts more emphasis on Chinook habitat and enhancement objectives – including the removal of many dams. In contrast, the DFO plan puts more emphasis on closing down fisheries, with no specifics on habitat or enhancement objectives. Check out the two links below:

#### TRIAL SEAL CONTROL HARVEST APPROVED

The Pacific Balance Pinniped Society has received permission to harvest about 30 harbour seals within Georgia Strait between Campbell River and Victoria. "Samples of meat, blubber and liver will be taken to be tested by a laboratory to see if it meets Canadian Food Inspection Agency standards for human and animal consumption." Hides and skulls will also be taken if possible. The release states "We are committed to bringing balance back into our British Columbia waters concerning seals and sea lion over population." This is the first step in seeing a coastwide harvest of pinnipeds. It is imperative that a harvest take place for the survival of our salmon and other fish stocks that are being consumed at massive levels by seals, Stellar sea lions and the invasive California sea lions. 




