HOUSE KEEPING

Hello Members, a few house keeping items:

ALL NEW MEMBERS MUST TAKE THE ORIENTATION COURSE BEFORE THEY ARE ALLOWED TO USE THE CLUBS RANGES.

EVERYONE NEEDS TO SIGN IN WHEN AT THE RANGE!!

You cannot sign in anyone (for Free) on your Memberships. (if you don't have a Membership Card you have to have a Day-Pass displayed on you)

Sweeping your brass/steel/empty hulls off the concrete and/or leaving them on the ground is <u>not acceptable.</u> Please clean up after yourself. We have a lot of range users that do not know the rules (Day-Pass Users or New Members that haven't taken the mandatory "Orientation Course") please educate anyone not cleaning up after themselves. Extra buckets have been put at each range, these are not garbage buckets they are to be used for Brass Cartridges (recycle) on the R/P and M/P Range, shotgun shells on the S/G Range. All garbage (paper, plastic, cardboard) goes into the garbage cans.

Please print your Name/Member Number when you sign in, we **NEED** to be able to read what you **Write / Print**. **YOU MUST INITIAL THE ACKNOWLEDGEMENT THAT YOU KNOW THE RULES OF THE CLUB**



The existing *Firearms Marking Regulations* under the *Firearms Act*, scheduled to come into force on December 1, 2018, are being deferred until December 1, 2020

The Vital Four ACTS of Firearm Safety

Assume every firearm is loaded
Control the muzzle direction at all times
Trigger finger must be kept off the trigger and out of the trigger guard
See that the firearm is unloaded

PROVE it safe.

Point the firearm in the safest available direction
Remove all ammunition
Observe the chamber
Verify the feeding path
Examine the bore each time you pick up a firearm

Timberwest Access Program

We have received approval to outfit the Kapoor gate, and with the Timberwest/Island Timberlands merger of operations we are in good position to expand the access program north in coming years. I have requested expansion of the permitted hours to two hours before/after sunrise/sunset to accommodate the wider range we have with the additional gate. Hopefully we will get it equipped before the road is shut down by snow.

A significant development on the access front is the recent win by the Nicola Valley club in the law suit over access to lakes within the Douglas Lake Ranch. The judge made a very unusual point of criticizing the government for not protecting the public interest. This is a long standing beef of mine, as every access issue has to be litigated and both the provincial and local government practice is that the approving authority deliberately refuse or neglect to do their jobs and then take no position in the resulting proceedings, forcing a judge and the litigants to do what staff are highly paid to do. This is nowhere so evident as in landlocked access to Sooke Mountain Provincial Park.

I am also working on maintaining access through the new hydro gate on East Main, which services the Jordan River hydro reservoirs. At this time the road has washed out again, so the gate is almost a moot point, but engaging the approving authorities is like pulling teeth. Nobody wants to hear from the recreation sector, and this is another road about to be shut down because of the problems of open road policy with no access control. The purpose of the gate stated in the BC Hydro requisition documents is to prohibit public access.






Victoria Fish & Game Club Chronograph is now available for rental!

The club recently bought a basic Model F-1 Chrony which will be available for rental to our paid, card carrying club members. (We will not be renting the club chronograph to day pass users.) We will be charging a nominal fee of only \$10 for the use of the club's chronograph, which will be available to be signed out from the Caretaker's office. We will have a simple form to record the renting member's information and it will be the responsibility of the renter to return the chronograph to the office before they leave the range property. Since we suspect this will be a very popular club program I would suggest that you contact the office in advance to book your rental of the club Chrony by date, to ensure that someone else hasn't arranged to rent it on the same day. We now have a club camera tripod that can be used with the rental Chrony.


Our first Match of the season is March 7th, rain, shine, snow, fog or mud.





Airsoft News





VICTORIA FISH & GAME ANNUAL BIG GAME COMPETITION

Hunters are reminded that Blacktail deer taken in MU 1-1 through 1-13 by Victoria Fish & Game members are eligible for the five trophies available each year. Deer must be field dressed which means that the heart, liver and kidneys (edible portions) are the only internal organs which can be included when the animal is weighed. Deer must be weighed on Club scales by the caretaker or his designate.

The official weigher reserves the right to refuse weighing any deer which arrives in an unpresentable condition. Lungs must be removed and body cavity wiped dry with a rag or paper towels. Deer 160 pounds and over taken with a rifle and 140 pounds and over taken by bow and arrow must be witnessed by an executive member at time of weighing. Please contact the Club caretaker/manager or Wayne Zaccarelli to make arrangements. Hunters are reminded that access to club facilities is restricted to daylight hours with the gate locked progressively earlier through the hunting season. Please ensure that you confirm the time gates are locked and show up at least a half hour earlier.



In addition, the Victoria Fish & Game Bear trophy is awarded annually for the largest Black bear taken by a Club member. Boone & Crockett Club scoring is used to determine the largest entry. Boundaries are again MU 1-1 through 1-13.

NEW VANCOUVER ISLAND DEER BOOK

Copies of the ninth edition (2016) of the Vancouver Island Columbian Blacktail Deer Records are available at a cost of \$10 each. The publication contains an excellent article written by Byron Mason on fifty years with the deer in the Nimpkish Valley. Byron relates the impact of wolf and cougar predation on deer population abundance and hence, hunting success. He also includes 45 years of deer count data from 1970 through 2015.

There is also an article on early cougar hunting where the provincial government paid a bounty of varying amounts on cougars taken between 1870 and 1958. The new edition contains numerous colour photographs of harvested deer as well as record heads and antlers.



Copies of the previous eighth edition (2010) are still available at a cost of \$5.00.

The current records list over 2160 entries scoring 100 or more Boone & Crockett points.

Of particular note is the re-scoring of the Norm Hammond buck from 1942. These antlers were the number two head in the previous eighth edition (2010) scoring 139 7/8.

Following a request from the current owner, it was panel scored in March 2015 and is now ranked as the number one Vancouver Island deer with a score of 143 5/8.

- -The International Pacific Halibut Commission (IPHC) will be conducting their annual meeting in Victoria from January 28 to February 02. Check out their excellent website.
- It was announced on January 02 that two additional members of the Southern Resident Killer Whales (SRKW) are showing symptoms of starvation a condition known as "peanut head". These orcas are not expected to survive to summer.
- In 2014, California sea lions were blamed for the disappearance of 104,000 Upper Columbia Chinooks within the river. Pinniped predation is a significant component of Chinook mortality within estuaries and accessible portions of the river.
- In 2017, a total of 222,000,000 salmon were harvested in Alaska and 47,000,000 of these were hatchery produced fish.
- A public meeting is being held January 10 at the Juan de Fuca Recreation Centre to receive comments on the Options Paper issued by the B.C. Wild Salmon Advisory Council. The input will guide the province's action plan to rebuild the wild salmon populations.

Blacktail deer antlers from deer taken during the 2018 hunting season within Region 1 (Vancouver Island) will be accepted until February 28, 2019 for entry in the largest antlers competition.

Black bear skull entries from the spring and fall 2018 seasons will also be accepted until February 28, 2019 for the club competition. The Boone & Crockett scoring system will be used to determine a final score for all bear and deer entries.

Trophy winners for all categories will be announced in the club newsletter prior to the Annual General Meeting in March, at which time trophies will be presented.

The new 7th edition of the *Big Game Records of British Columbia* is now available at a cost of \$35. The 560 page hard cover book is published by the Wildlife Records Club of B.C. The book lists more than 10,000 entries in 19 big game categories with over 1400 of these being new entries since the previous edition in 2010.

"This is a book for all who have an interest in the outstanding diversity and abundance of big game in British Columbia." "The foundation for the Wildlife Records Club of British Columbia was originally conceived in Kamloops in 1967 with the objective of maintaining a perpetual record of trophy-class big game from British Columbia." Since 1982, operations of the Club have been based on Vancouver Island. The Club continues to qualify volunteer scorers located throughout the province. "Dedicated to wildlife conservation, selective hunting and fair chase, the Club invites the membership of individuals with similar ideals."

Dear Ms. Postlethwaite:

The Amalgamated Conservation Society appreciates the opportunity to comment on the management of Pacific Herring. The ACS has operated continuously since 1954 representing angling and salmonid enhancement organizations in the southern Vancouver Island area. Our Society was instrumental in the formation of the Sport Fishing Advisory Board in 1964. We currently have ten member associations representing close to 5000 individual members.

Our member associations operate fish counting fences and the Howard English Goldstream Salmon Hatchery which attempts to maintain and enhance coho, chum and chinook stocks. Our member anglers have experienced the decline in salmonid populations over the decades and the equally serious decline in local herring stocks.

We associate the decline in local herring stocks with the commercial over harvest of herring populations coast wide during the latter part of the twentieth century. This herring roe and reduction fishery resulted in the collapse of most herring stocks. Once thriving populations in the Gorge Waterway and Portage Inlet, as well as Esquimalt Harbour, virtually disappeared.

Herring are a critical food source for chinook and coho salmon and a valuable link in the food chain which supports not only these salmonids but also numerous other fish species. By extension, herring also support the salmon eating resident Orcas and other marine mammal species.

The Amalgamated Conservation Society would like to see the commercial roe/reduction herring fishery curtailed but, at a very minimum, suggest that quotas be reduced by 30% coastwide – to take effect immediately.
