Also make sure your PAL has not expired. As life gets busy we all know how easy it is to forget things. If you have firearms you want to dispose of, contact the club if you require assistance.

The existing *Firearms Marking Regulations* under the *Firearms Act*, scheduled to come into force on December 1, 2018, are being deferred until December 1, 2020

#### SEEKING POSITION OF: MEMBER-AT-LARGE



He, along with his brothers and sister, learned to fish and hunt with his dad and uncles back in the day when a Lee Enfield 303 was the starter firearm of choice. He also picked potatoes, milked cows, ploughed fields using an International Harvester tractor and tried to avoid school. A family relocation south, and subsequent breakup, found him spending his teenage years in southern Ontario, where he majored in city rules and minor delinquency. #### The Vital Four ACTS of Firearm Safety

Assume every firearm is loaded Control the muzzle direction at all times Trigger finger must be kept off the trigger and out of the trigger guard See that the firearm is unloaded

#### **PROVE** it safe.

Point the firearm in the safest available direction Remove all ammunition Observe the chamber Verify the feeding path Examine the bore each time you pick up a firearm



#### TRAP / SKEEP FUN SHOOTING LEAGUE - SUMMER EVENINGS

The club will run a Summer Evening Trap/Skeet Fun Shooting League. Shooting will be every Thursday night commencing the  $27^{th}$  of June 2019 and ending the  $5^{th}$  of September 2019. Total of 10 weeks (skipping the  $22^{nd}$  of August due to a Frontier Shootists Event). Shooting will start at 5:30pm and end at 7:15pm. Each evening's shoot will consist of one round of trap followed by one round of skeet. Scores will be handicapped, recorded, posted at the clubhouse and published via email to each participant. At the end of League get together Patches/Pins will be awarded to those who posted a 25 round either trap or skeet and a patch/pin for those who post a perfect 50. Club trophies (Top Score and Most Improved) will be awarded (trophies will be displayed in the clubhouse). #### **Timberwest Access**

The 2019 Timberwest access agreement is now open for registration.

Victor Skaarup (our hard working treasurer, champion of our access program funding and the guy that put us at the table with Timberwest) and I delivered the Kapoor gate unit to the gate contractor January 16, and carried on up to Nanaimo for some face-time with the Timberwest negotiating lead. Long term relations were affirmed, and they bought lunch, so I guess they like us, which is a good reference as we expand access into Island Timberlands holdings.

Having mentioned funding, programs are generally expected to be self-sustaining. It would be nice if we had some support from BCWF, but in the absence of that and in view of increasing staff time necessary to administer an additional gate and an increasing number of key-holders with no connection to VFGPA, the annual fee is going up.

I'll be attending the BCWF AGM in Ft. St. John in June to advocate adoption of our Timberwest key as a universal roaming key standard that will access other controlled gates such as Eagle Ridge in Coquitlam, Norrish Creek east of Mission, and others that may appear on the landscape. I don't want to have to deal with 20 different keys, clubs, and access agreements as I travel around the province, so that's an initiative for a provincial body to support.

The 2019 registration fee is \$50 VFGPA members, \$75 non-VFGPA.

With the AGM coming up, I want to put a shout-out about those indispensable souls seen sitting at the executive table at our sparsely attended general meetings and our well attended board meetings. The club is going into its 100 Year anniversary, and while it runs on its membership, it is those dedicated people that volunteer to bear the heavy responsibility that have sustained the organization through 100 years and many tens of thousands of hours of their time and talent.

With particular reference to the access group, please take a 100 year pause, come out to the AGM, and stand with me to show some love with a round of applause for the exec. (and prime the pump for next years funding of course).

Some of you may be aware of an educational initiative I have connected to the access program, that being the Caveman Engineers. A number of threads have come together: The Kapoor gate opening a circle route around the Malahat through the back country, Timberwest opening discussion of ATV use for hunting, the 100 Year celebration coming up on Father's Day weekend in June, the massively growing Airsoft discipline needing room, and board approval to rezone the 20ha property north of the trap range at 751 Trans Canada Hwy (751TCH) for club use.

We are also supporting the VIDRA group with the Tansky parking area improvements to add an east/west layout to the access prgram for those that like free camping, and legal ATV access to some highly productive hunting areas while we wait for Timberwest to sort it out. Additional support has been contributed to our friends at the Charters River Salmon Interpretive Center for the move of the Jack Brooks hatchery, and I am investigating the feasibility of occupying the hatchery site, once the move is complete, as our first Timberwest campground and ATV staging area. For those that have never travelled Boneyard up the west side of the Sooke River, you have a special treat waiting.

I have adopted 751TCH as a Caveman Engineer project, and I expect to have grant funding approved for two full time Canada Summer Job positions July-August. I invite an early expression of interest from anyone qualified for CSJ employment that has an interest in pursuing an education in civil engineering or a related field, and can pack a shovel and chainsaw to lay out multi-purpose trail system. Past activities of the Cavemen and the 751TCH project as it develops can be viewed on the web site here: <a href="https://caveman-engineers.org">https://caveman-engineers.org</a> (Thanks again 2'nd VP Paul MacNeil for the DND tours!)

Who wants to get paid to play outside all summer and associate with professionals from the engineering community?

I have proposed calling 751TCH the Malahat Outdoor Recreation Park, and with the Caveman relationship to youth oriented outdoor-placed STEM Education (Science, Technology, Engineering, & Math) we will connect with the affluent, outdoorsy, influential demographic of the professional engineering community. It's a natural sponsor space in good company to get a brand in front of.

If you are connected to a business that markets into that demographic, I invite sponsor proposals for custom programs tailored to your commercial objectives. While in-kind donations are indispensable, we can leverage cash with matching grant funding, and we're currently working on developing relationships with registered charities, which have the potential to return a sizeable tax refund through charitable contribution tax receipts.








#### Victoria Fish & Game Club Chronograph is now available for rental!

We will be charging a nominal fee of only \$10 for the use of the club's chronograph, which will be available to be signed out from the Caretaker's office. We will have a simple form to record the renting member's information and it will be the responsibility of the renter to return the chronograph to the office before they leave the range property. Since we suspect this will be a very popular club program I would suggest that you contact the office in advance to book your rental of the club Chrony by date, to ensure that someone else hasn't arranged to rent it on the same day. We now have a club camera tripod that can be used with the rental Chrony.



We've had to postpone our first SIAS range safety course of the year twice due to adverse range conditions, the next date is March 17th followed by the regularly scheduled March course on the 31st.


We are hosting the first Independent Shooters League match of the year on March 24th, followed by our next Club match on April 7th. Spectators are always welcome.





Each Range has a Perimeter Flag. If the Red Flag is in the UP position that is a indicator that the range is active. Even if their is a cease fire shooting can start at anytime.

It is a good idea to put your Hearing Protection on at the Perimeter Flag before you get to the active range. (Range Rules require that hearing and eye protection be worn on the Ranges.)

#### VICTORIA FISH & GAME ANNUAL BIG GAME COMPETITION

Hunters are reminded that Blacktail deer taken in MU 1-1 through 1-13 by Victoria Fish & Game members are eligible for the five trophies available each year. Deer must be field dressed which means that the heart, liver and kidneys (edible portions) are the only internal organs which can be included when the animal is weighed. Deer must be weighed on Club scales by the caretaker or his designate.

The official weigher reserves the right to refuse weighing any deer which arrives in an unpresentable condition. Lungs must be removed and body cavity wiped dry with a rag or paper towels. Deer 160 pounds and over taken with a rifle and 140 pounds and over taken by bow and arrow must be witnessed by an executive member at time of weighing. Please contact the Club caretaker/manager or Wayne Zaccarelli to make arrangements. Hunters are reminded that access to club facilities is restricted to daylight hours with the gate locked progressively earlier through the hunting season. Please ensure that you confirm the time gates are locked and show up at least a half hour earlier.



In addition, the Victoria Fish & Game Bear trophy is awarded annually for the largest Black bear taken by a Club member. Boone & Crockett Club scoring is used to determine the largest entry. Boundaries are again MU 1-1 through 1-13.

#### NEW VANCOUVER ISLAND DEER BOOK

Copies of the ninth edition (2016) of the Vancouver Island Columbian Blacktail Deer Records are available at a cost of \$10 each. The publication contains an excellent article written by Byron Mason on fifty years with the deer in the Nimpkish Valley. Byron relates the impact of wolf and cougar predation on deer population abundance and hence, hunting success. He also includes 45 years of deer count data from 1970 through 2015.

There is also an article on early cougar hunting where the provincial government paid a bounty of varying amounts on cougars taken between 1870 and 1958. The new edition contains numerous colour photographs of harvested deer as well as record heads and antlers.



Copies of the previous eighth edition (2010) are still available at a cost of \$5.00.

The current records list over 2160 entries scoring 100 or more Boone & Crockett points.

Of particular note is the re-scoring of the Norm Hammond buck from 1942. These antlers were the number two head in the previous eighth edition (2010) scoring 139 7/8.

Following a request from the current owner, it was panel scored in March 2015 and is now ranked as the number one Vancouver Island deer with a score of 143 5/8.



#### NEW 7<sup>th</sup> EDITION BIG GAME RECORDS OF B.C.

The new 7<sup>th</sup> edition of the *Big Game Records of British Columbia* is now available at a cost of \$35. The 560 page hard cover book is published by the Wildlife Records Club of B.C. "This is the official records book for exceptional big game species native to British Columbia, based on the Boone and Crockett scoring system." The book lists more than 10,000 entries in 19 big game categories with over 1400 of these being new entries since the previous edition in 2010.

The book includes feature articles, many pictures and hunting stories related to several of the recent entries. The Amalgamated Conservation Society appreciates the opportunity to comment on the public Chinook fishery options paper released by the Department of Fisheries & Oceans on February 05, 2019. The ACS has operated continuously since 1954 representing angling and salmonid enhancement organizations in the southern Vancouver Island area. Our Society was instrumental in the formation of the Sport Fishing Advisory Board (SFAB) in 1964. We currently have ten member associations representing close to 5000 individual members.

Choosing either option **A** or **B** will make little difference to the Fraser River stocks of concern. Their numbers have been declining rather steadily since 1957 when both seiners and gill netters invaded the Strait of Juan de Fuca. Prior to that, fish traps harvested these fish. Severe restrictions on the public fishery started around 2006 and, despite ever increasing restrictions and reduced recreational catch, stocks have continued to decline to their threatened and endangered status today. These ever expanding restrictions are doing irreparable harm to the public Chinook fishery.

We see the current situation as an ongoing re-allocation from the public fishery and traditional commercial fisheries to First Nations. The resource cannot withstand the onslaught of reportedly up to 800 gillnets between Tsawwassen and Sawmill Creek (34 km. upstream of Hope) where 28 First Nations have fishing rights. These both legal and illegal unselective gillnets are destroying the salmonid resources of the Fraser, and other rivers. The First Nations in-river catch has been escalating in proportion to the total catch for many years.

The Amalgamated Conservation Society supports the banning of unselective gill nets and the move toward selective fish wheels, pound nets and other less harmful means of targeting specific species, runs and sizes of salmonids. This should be implemented in combination with new hatchery techniques to supplement specific stocks of concern. There should be greater use of Chinook net pen rearing to significantly increase survival rates over that of traditional hatchery methods. Habitat restoration and enhancement needs to take place along with protecting and guaranteeing minimum water flows provided by the Provincial *Water Sustainability Act*. Significant pinniped (harbour seal, Stellar sea lion and California sea lion) control needs to take place to ensure the survival of both out-migrating salmonid smolts as well as returning adult spawners.

Any measures instituted to further clamp down on the public recreational fishery will make little difference with respect to stock rebuilding.

#### FISHING COMMITTEE REPORT

Chinook salmon fishery options for Areas 18-20 (Sidney-Saanich Inlet to Port Renfrew) issued by DFO on February 05. Public and stakeholder comment will be received until March 01.

Option "A" non-retention of both wild and hatchery from April 01 to July 31, then one Chinook per day (hatchery or wild) from August 01 to August 29.

Option "B" one Chinook per day (hatchery only) from April 01 to July 31, then one Chinook per day (hatchery or wild) from August 01 to August 29.

These options are put forth to protect severely depressed Fraser River system stocks. From August 30 through March 31, daily limits would return to two Chinook per day (hatchery or wild).

The SFAB met in Vancouver February 7-9 and agreed to work with DFO to develop an Option "C" which would address the Chinook conservation concerns while reducing the impact on the sport fishery.

Effective March 01, 2019, and until further notice, there is **no** retention of wild (unclipped) Chinook over 67 cm. in the waters between Cadboro Point (FMA 19) and Sombrio Point (FMA 20).

The SFAB proposed halibut regulations for 2019-2020. The fishery would be open from March 01 to December 31 with an annual limit of six fish. They proposed an option for size and possession limits; either 1/day (2/possession) with a maximum size of 90 cm. **OR** 1/day (1/possession) with a maximum size of 126 cm.

SFAB elections were held with Martin Paish replacing Gerry Kristianson as chair of the Sport Fishing Advisory Board.

The SFAB approved a name change to **Public Fishery Advisory Board (PFAB)**.

There are 28 First Nations with fishing rights between Tsawwassen (mouth of Fraser River) and Sawmill Creek (34 km. upstream of Hope).

The Millstream Fishway Project designed to allow fish passage through the large culvert crossing Atkins Road, has been delayed to, likely, 2020. Construction costs escalated beyond reason this past year due to shortage of workers. Peninsula Streams Society has raised about \$75,000 which they are holding for the project. The Victoria Fish & Game donated \$7500 for one step in the fishway. About 130 Coho were counted by the in-stream camera this past fall.


